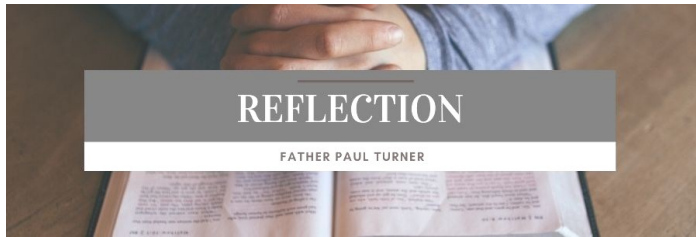

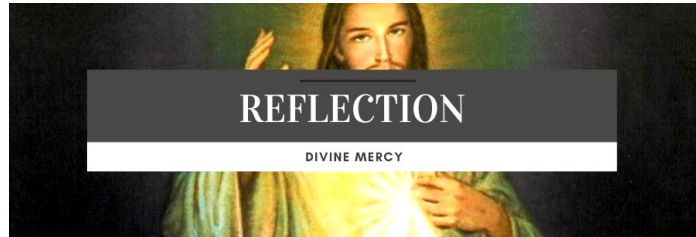

To see the beauty of God, present in the Most Holy Eucharist, you need eyes of faith. One of the best ways to sharpen your vision of this beauty is through adoration. Though receiving Holy Communion must be the ultimate union we experience with our Lord, adoration of Him, present in the Sacred Host, prepares you for this encounter by revealing His beauty. Seek to adore Him exposed in the monstrance on the altar and let the eyes of your soul become enthralled by His beauty (See Diary #1692).



Do you ever participate in adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist? If you have adoration regularly at your church, you are blessed. If not, seek it out at a nearby church. Adoration feeds your soul and reveals to you the beauty of God. Reflect upon your experience of Eucharistic adoration and recommit yourself to a wholehearted participation in this glorious act.

*Lord, I adore You with the most profound adoration as You are present before me in the Most Holy Eucharist. I love You and seek to know Your hidden beauty and splendor. You are glorious, dear Lord. As I behold Your glory, draw me ever deeper into Your perfect Heart of Mercy. Jesus, I trust in You.*

**WEEK 4**

The 4th Commandment  
**“Honor your father and mother”**


A major facet of the 4th Commandment, “Honor your father and mother”, is that it instructs us to honor our parents by caring for them in their old age. No one has perfect parents, and too many have parents who clearly fell short of providing an ideal childhood. Regardless, we are all called by God to set aside our differences and honor our parents by seeing to their needs as they become physically and mentally unable to care for themselves.

When the responsibility of caring for aging parents is embraced with an attitude of love, forgiveness and sacrifice, attending to them can be one of life’s most beautiful seasons of life. The time spent with them provides sacred moments. Times to laugh and cry together as you relive past memories. Times for heart-to-heart conversations that lead to forgiveness and peace, before it is too late.

*St. John the Apostle was one of the Twelve Apostles and the “beloved disciple” of Jesus Christ. He is well-known for being one of the four evangelists (or Gospel writers). Called by the Greeks “the Divine,” John was a Galilean, the son of Zebedee and Salome, and younger brother of St. James the Great. St. John is the author of the Gospel of John, the three Epistles of John, and the Book of Revelation. The Church celebrates the Feast day of St. John the Apostle on December 27.*


