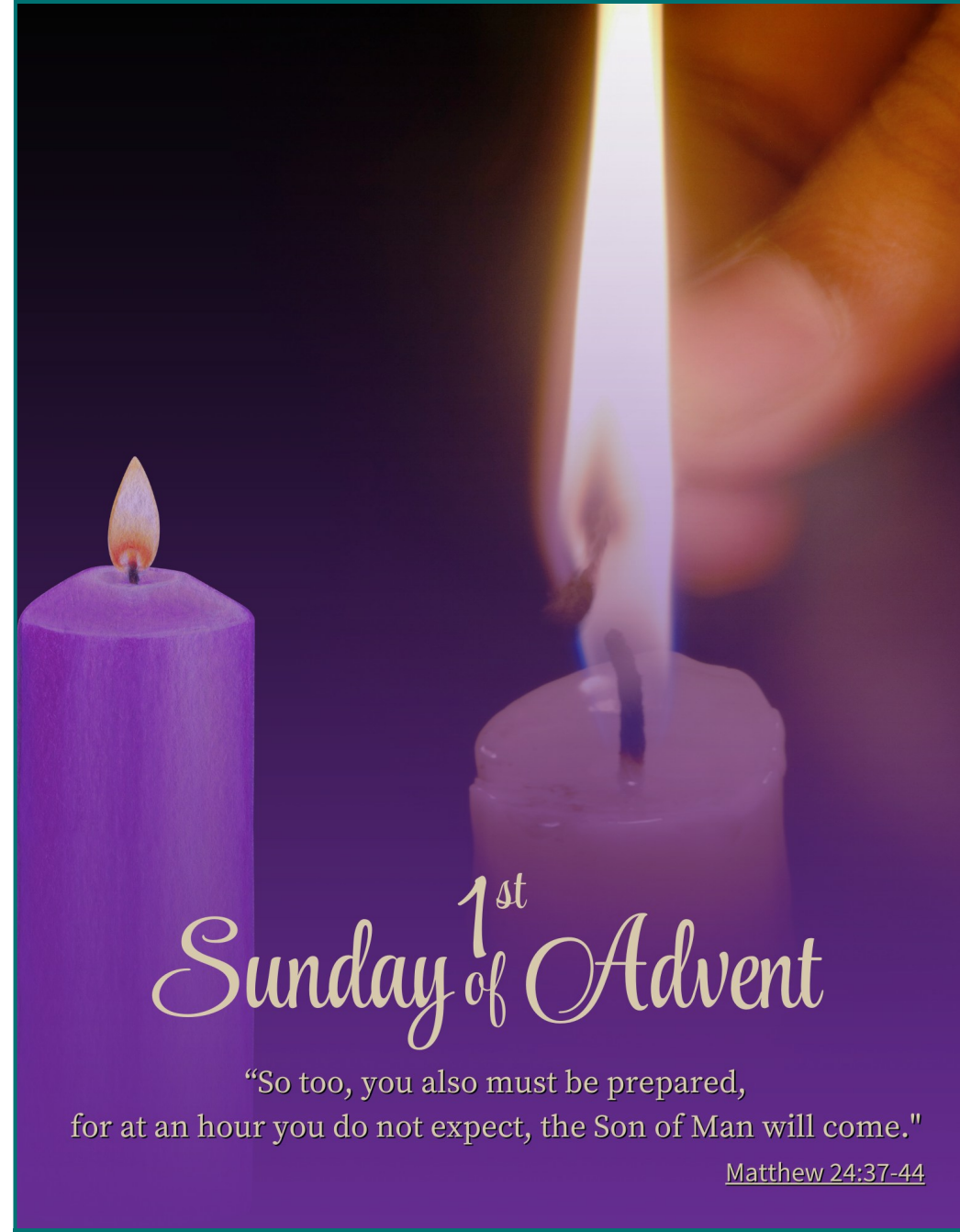

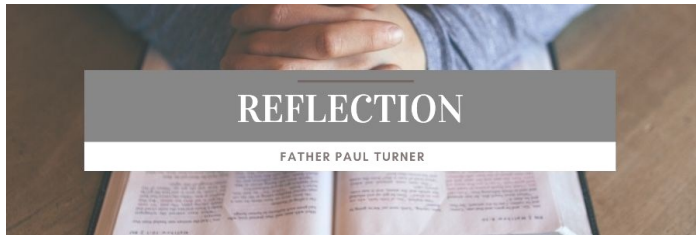

### First Sunday of Advent

Isaiah 2:1-5

#### Swords into Ploughshares

The first reading of the entire Advent season presents Isaiah's famous dream of a people at peace: "They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks." How can we get that peace?

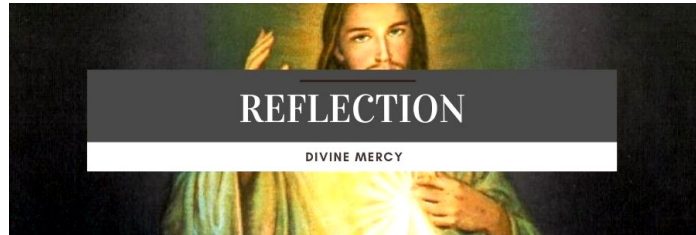
In Isaiah's vision, that peace comes from the word of the Lord. That word comes from Jerusalem.

The city of Jerusalem sits on a hill, but it is a stubby little hill. Other hills are larger. But Isaiah prophesies that Jerusalem's hill will be established as the highest mountain. All will stream toward it to hear God's word.

For Christians, when we hear this prophecy on the First Sunday of Advent, we imagine Isaiah's dream on a grander scale. We see heaven as the new Jerusalem, established higher than anywhere else. We see all peoples streaming toward it for instruction. The word that comes from the new Jerusalem is the Word made flesh at Bethlehem. We yearn to hear that word and form our lives by it.

This day, let us hear the word of God. Let us take the weapons we hurl at our neighbors—the angry words, the hurtful deeds—and beat them into plowshares that open fertile soil of communication and into pruning hooks that weave renewed relationships of peace.

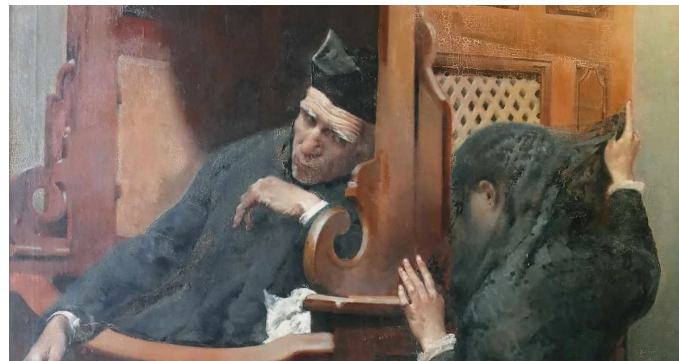


## REFLECTION

### Confessing with Delight

Why do you fear Confession? This glorious Sacrament is offered to you from the tender Heart of our Lord. Through this glorious gift Jesus lifts the burdens you carry so that you can more fully share in His Mercy. If you understood this, there would be no hesitation in running to Confession on a regular basis. You would desire it not because it reveals your misery, but because it heals it and removes it forever (See Diary #1602).



Try to spend time looking at your attitude toward the gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you see hesitancy within you, examine the reason. Is it fear of facing your sin? Is it fear of facing the priest? Fear should never be a factor. Let go of any fear you have by putting your eyes on the end result. That end result is freedom and union with God. This is a Mercy you need and will never regret receiving.

*Lord, please free me from the fear of this glorious Sacrament. Help me to see my sins honestly but only as I also gaze upon Your infinite Mercy. Give my heart a burning desire for this Mercy and a longing for the freedom it brings. I love You, dear Lord. Jesus, I trust in You.*

Dear Friends in Christ,

Thank you to everyone who prayed for me while I was away in Tennessee hiking in the Great Smoky Mountains. It was a great, great trip. It was active and relaxing, rejuvenating, and overall incredible. I can admit I prefer the grandeur of the Rocky Mountains over the forests in the Smoky Mountains, but it was still a great time to hike out there and see our Lord's creation in the thick of it all. I am also quite happy to be back.

Do you want to have the most memorable and best Christmas you have ever experienced yet? No doubt the answer is an automatic, "yes." It's all too easy to get caught up in the marketing version of Christmas, but take away the decorations, the songs, the gifts, the movies, the big family meal, the family gatherings, and what is left? The substance of Christmas itself: the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We begin Advent this weekend. Advent is a time of preparation for not only the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ but also preparation for His Second Coming at the end of time. Advent always has this twofold mode of preparation. How do we prepare then? By prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Advent is not as strong in the observance of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as during the season of Lent, but we are called to observe some form of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Advent because it is a penitential season. So, either observe something from each of these categories OR observe only one of these categories (i.e. prayer, fasting, or almsgiving) and observe it well. Depending on how well you observe from the area(s) of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Advent, ultimately, THAT is what contributes towards you having the best Christmas you have ever experienced yet.

As you can tell, it now comes down to you. Speaking as you: *Do I want the best Christmas I have ever experienced yet? Then I need to prepare well during this Advent season from the areas of prayer, fasting, and/or almsgiving.*

Let's get to it.
