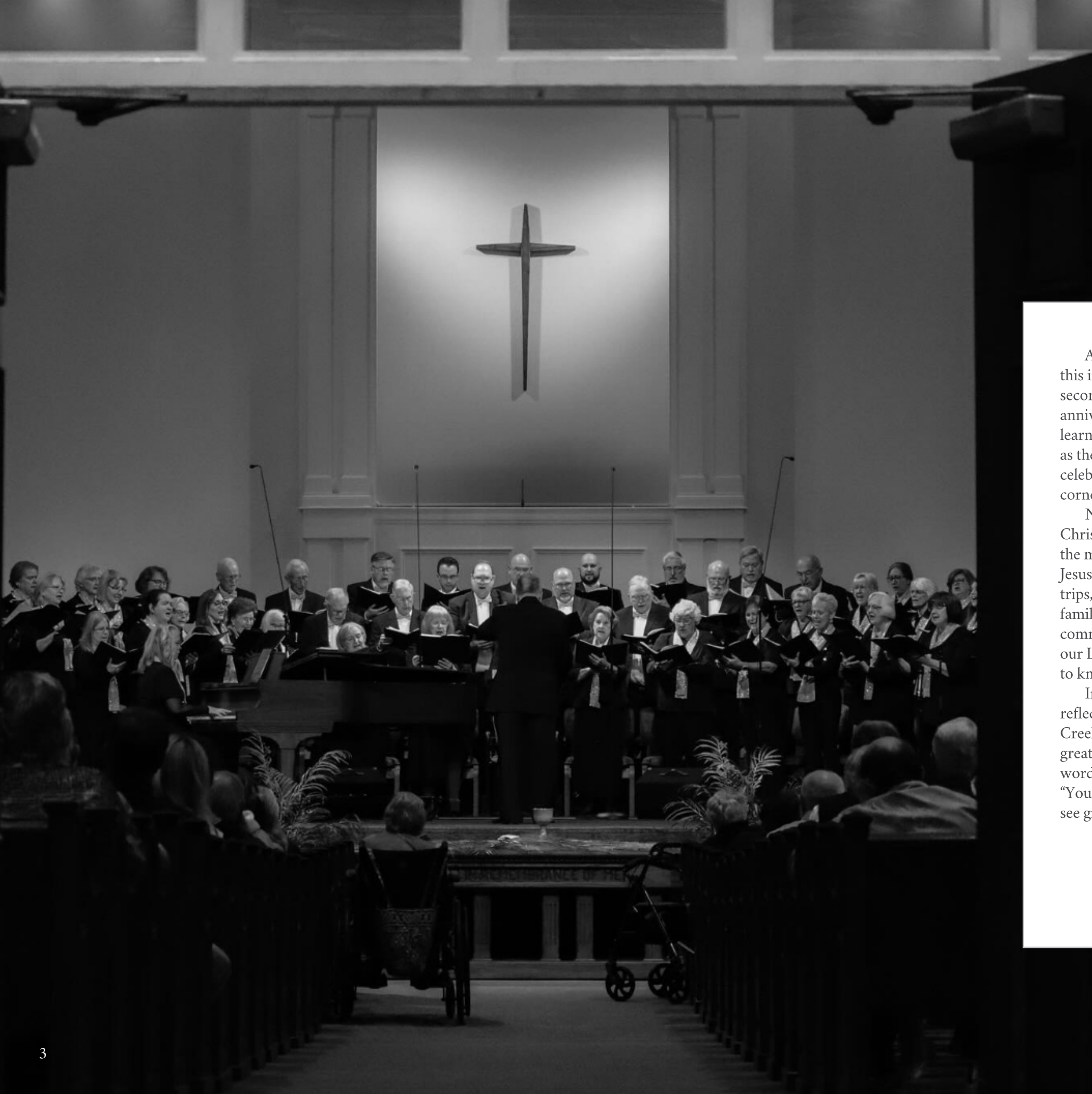




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From the Pastor's Desk

Conversation with Chris Lee

Chris Lee has spent nearly his whole life as part of the Tates Creek Christian Church family. We asked him to share about his journey of faith, the moments that have shaped him, and what excites him about the church today.

1. How long have you been coming to Tates Creek, and what first brought you here?

“I’ve been attending Tates Creek Christian since I was a kid. Mom and Dad brought us to the old church in Chevy Chase I believe in 1965. They started at Gardenside Christian and were the first couple married in the new Gardenside Christian Building by Rev. Cotton Jones. Then some friends invited them to Tates Creek, and they visited and later joined, and it’s been our home ever since.”

2. How has your faith grown or changed since you became part of Tates Creek?

“Well the foundation of my Christian walk began right here at here at Tates Creek Christian and my faith was nurtured and fed and formed throughout the years here by so many people along the way. And by simply witnessing the love, devotion and faithfulness of folks around me, it continues to be strengthened and refreshed every day. It has just been a huge blessing to be raised in a church family that was so faithful and dedicated to the work of the Lord and to have a real church family who genuinely cared about you and your Christian walk.”



3. What’s one moment, event, or experience at Tates Creek that has deeply impacted you?

“I have a couple. The first would be a revival we had at the old church on High Street back in 1972. That’s what led my myself, my brother, and a friend of ours to come forward and dedicate our lives to the Lord. We were later baptized in the basement of that old church by Brad Walden our long-time minister. Several years later, on Brad’s last Sunday here, I came forward again to rededicate myself.

And I better mention another one too which was the day I first attended the Seekers Sunday School Class 33 years ago. Now I know what you’re thinking . . . how could attending Kent Mason’s class be an impactful event? (I kid). Well, that’s the day I met my wife, Donna. The story goes, Kent had been after me for a while to come to his class and if you know Kent he can be persistent. Still, I resisted with one excuse after another, until one day he mentioned there were some new young ladies in the class. Sooo . . . the next Sunday I dropped in for class and met Donna and her sisters. The following week we met again at the church picnic and that’s what led to the family I’m blessed with today. It’s been a blessing to have been a part of the Seekers family all the years as well!”

4. Who are some people at Tates Creek who have influenced your walk with Christ, and how?

“When you’ve been some place 60 years, so many folks have played an important part. Mike Sandlin (and his wife Lee), our youth minister at the time, is one I have to mention. He knew how to mix fun with ministry and that made an impression on a young teenage boy. It helped he was a sports nut like me and a big kid at heart too. I’ll never forget some of the intense games of Nerf Basketball we played in the classrooms downstairs. Mike also had a passion for Jesus that rubbed off on all of us and that made a real difference. As I said, there have been so many more through the years, men and women alike. Each of our ministers from Brother Brad, Steve Perry, Tommy and Justin have made a real difference in my life. Kent Mason has not only been a teacher but a close friend. And Ernie Perry has been a mentor for me and so many others here as he challenges us to grow as Christian men. Just this entire church family has been a huge blessing to myself and my family.”

5. How have you found ways to serve or get involved at Tates Creek, and what has that meant to you?

“I was privileged to grow up in this place where I witnessed Christian service all around me for years. I watched my father, and so many others that I looked up to, serve selflessly so I felt an urging to do so as well. I’ve been blessed to serve as an Elder and Deacon here and be a part of several other ministries through the years including the Men’s Ministry, The Barnabas Ministry, The Local Missions Team, and the former Room in the Inn Ministry. Also been a long-time member of the Seekers Sunday School Class.

Although I felt a calling to follow the examples I witnessed and to do my part, I’d be lying to say I was always eager to do so. It took a lot of encouragement and prodding from others for me get out of my comfort zone and jump in and get involved. I’m so glad they did because it’s ended up being a blessing for me. So, if you are thinking of getting involved in an area of service, I’ll do like those before me and strongly encourage you to do so, because God’s family needs you and I can assure you you’ll be blessed by it.”

6. Has there been a time in your life when the church community really supported you through something difficult?

“There have been many times I’ve leaned on my church family here but the one that probably stands out the most is when we lost Mom. Our mom was a special lady, well loved by everyone here and she fought a three-year battle with brain cancer that she lost 14 years ago. All through that battle, the love from this family surrounded ours and it made such a difference. With every encouraging word, thoughtful note, friendly visit, and warm embrace it not only provided the support we needed, but it increased our own faith even more by seeing Jesus every day in those around us. We were blessed with parents who instilled a strong sense of family, and they had a gift of extending that feeling to others beyond our own. I think that’s why they made Tates Creek their church home, they found their extended family here too.”



7. What excites you most about what God is doing at Tates Creek right now?

“There’s a lot to be encouraged by at Tates Creek today. I love to see all the new faces each week and folks from so many different age groups and cultures and backgrounds. It’s exciting to see more young families with all the kids running around like we used to. The new kid’s area is unbelievable and a far cry from the old musty basement classroom we all crammed into back in the day! The most exciting thing to me is just seeing how God has brought this family back together again. Covid was hard on churches including ours, but this family held together and welcomed so many new faces into it to continue the legacy of Christian service it has displayed for the past 80 years. It’s exciting to see what God has in store next!”

As Tates Creek Christian Church celebrates 80 years of ministry, Chris’s story is a reminder of what those decades have meant. From a teenager in a youth group to a husband, father, and servant-leader, his journey mirrors the church’s own heartbeat—steady faith, deep relationships, and lives changed by Christ. Eight decades in, TCCC continues to be a place where stories like Chris’s are still being written, and where God’s faithfulness is as evident today as it was at the very beginning.

40+ Years at Tates Creek

Brenda and her husband, Larry, have been members of Tates Creek Christian Church for more than 40 years. I recently had the privilege of sitting down with Brenda to reflect on her journey of faith and service here at TCCC.

What first drew you here, and what has kept you here all these years?

“Right after we were married—43 years ago—I started attending Tates Creek with Larry. Of course, there have been challenges and bumps along the way, but we have always been devoted to the work of the church. We’ve always felt the Lord calling us to be a stable, familiar presence for those who are here now and those who will come in the future.”

How has your faith grown or been shaped through this church?

“When I came to Tates Creek, I was just 25 years old. Over the years, I’ve grown and matured in my faith by attending, serving, and standing strong in obedience to the Lord. Larry and I were mentored by his mom, his

family, individuals in the congregation and couples who had been married for 50+ years at the church. Their faithfulness left a lasting impact on us. My sister friends in my circle have also played a big part in my faith journey over the years. I’ve always followed Larry’s leadership in attending, serving, and being part of the church.”

Do you have a favorite memory from your years here?

“I don’t have one specific memory—it’s more of a collection of special moments. Church picnics, gatherings of the church body, young people who have grown up and reached back out after years and the unity we’ve shared as a congregation all stand out to me.”



How have you seen the church change or grow over the years?

“In the past, and even some today, there was a lot of focus on what clothing was considered ‘appropriate’ for church. I’m thankful that has shifted. It’s not about what we wear, but about who we live for and serve. We can unite to serve Him no matter our outward appearance.”

What’s a favorite hymn, event, or ministry that stands out in your memory?

“Larry and I have been blessed to serve in many ministries. We taught elementary students for 32 years and college-aged students for 13 years. We especially love serving in the choir. Some of my favorite hymns are ‘In the Garden’ and ‘I Have Decided to Follow Jesus.’ I’m thankful that the choir is recognized as a true ministry here at TCCC—it’s an honor to serve Him in that way.”

How has the church supported you through difficult seasons?

“Our church family has been such a blessing—through the birth of a premature baby, navigating the challenges of new parenthood, and the loss of loved ones. We’ve felt love and encouragement through prayers, phone calls, cards, and meals prepared for us. That support has meant so much.”

What advice would you give to younger generations in our church today?

“Come and see—taste and see—that the Lord is good. He is faithful, and the family of God is good.”

I guess you could say, choir was responsible for Terry and me meeting and eventually marrying. Because Jim and Brenda were attending TCCC, when Terry returned to finish his law degree after getting out of the army, he would attend TCCC sometimes when he didn’t go to “Christian Student Fellowship” on campus. Brad had me stand in Sunday School and read scripture so Terry would know who I was. The rest is history. Since I have been in the choir we have had several directors. After Brenda Morrison, Evelyn Seymore directed us followed by Paula Neal, Curt Jones, Danny Branham, Don Seevers, and now Dan Craig. I have enjoyed being a part of the choir all these years, as it allowed me to use my ability to sing and it has provided great friendships.”

On the Move in Mexico

This year’s Anniversary Offering will be used to support Greg and Vicki Syverson’s On the Move Training program in Pachuca, Mexico. On the Move is an annual, three-month training school focused on evangelism, discipleship, and church planting. According to Greg, the program “seeks to train the average Christian to ‘do the works of ministry’ (Ephesians 4:12) so they are better equipped to reach people with the love and life-changing power of Jesus in their jobs, schools, neighborhoods, etc.” In addition to equipping students in biblical knowledge and evangelistic know-how, they also emphasize forming family/community wherever they go, whether in Mexico or beyond. The ultimate goal is that these families/communities will become church plants that multiply into a national and global church planting movement.



Some students in the program are residential students from different parts of Mexico and other countries who live in rented dormitory facilities and are involved in morning, afternoon, and evening sessions. The students are active in classes and hands on evangelism. Many students from the local areas have jobs and families and are part-time students, attending the evening sessions only. The program is designed so that the main content is presented in the evening sessions when all of these students who want to enter ministry can participate together.

On the Move has been very successful. Ministers and missionaries from other countries have asked Greg and Vicki to bring the program to their areas. Finances and man power have prevented this thus far, but each year, On the Move graduates disperse to many locations to spread the Gospel and build the world-wide Christian community.
