



I have had this quote on my desktop for quite awhile now. At first read it may seem rather discouraging, which is what I often feel when I see us as a species digging our heels into the very practices of using up the earth that have gotten us in trouble to begin with. But then I see Berry's invitation – to recover a sense of majesty; to be worshipful in the presence of the earth; to live with the assumption that what is good for the earth is good for us too. That is a beautiful invitation, and one that is fully supported by Scripture, by Tradition, by Reason, and by Experience. This month we will be reading the book "The Serviceberry" by Robin Wall Kimmerer and have a worship series based on its blessing and based in our own scriptures which lift up the earth as our neighbor. We'll have a few copies of the book if you want to pick one up at church (a suggested donation of \$20 if you can afford it) or I encourage you to find your own copy. It is a short book; it is a profound book; it is a book with a beautiful invitation for us as people who follow Jesus to once again claim that all flourishing is mutual. Come participate, in this season of spring and Earth Day and the resurrection, as we explore how to retrain ourselves to fall in love with the flourishing of the earth as we worship our God.

We will be starting a new curriculum on April 12<sup>th</sup> called: Our Hearts were Strangely Lukewarm, Understanding and Confronting Racism in the American Methodist Church. The General Commission on Religion and Race presents a six-session small group study for "Our Hearts Were Strangely Lukewarm: The American Methodist Church and the Struggle with White Supremacy."

"This study invites Christians—especially white Christians—to engage in deep reflection and open dialogue about the impact of racism, with a focus on anti-Black racism, within both the church and society. Drawing directly from the insightful 2023 book by Rev. Dr. John Elford, a retired United Methodist clergy member, the study examines the history of the United Methodist Church in the United States. It explores how systemic racism has affected the church's mission, credibility, and overall witness. By reflecting on these historical and ongoing issues, participants are challenged to see how these struggles extend beyond the church and mirror broader societal patterns in the American Christian context."

# Jr High Youth Group Lent

*This past month our Junior High Youth Group has been exploring the season of Lent and unpacking some of our rituals of the seasons. We have talked at length about what it means to live as disciples of Jesus Christ.*

*In Jesus' time, students who followed a rabbi were usually the best of the best, the top learners chosen because of their knowledge and ability. But Jesus did something different and beautiful. Instead of choosing only the "cream of the crop," He chose ordinary people like us! Teenagers really! Beautifully imperfect, still learning, and capable of incredible things.*

*We talked about what Maunday Thursday (or our Holy Wednesday): would look like if we had an opportunity to say goodbye or spend time with friends before a big change. Our adult volunteers delight when our youth show up with honesty and courage as they explore what it means to be disciples of Jesus.*



## Sr High Youth Group EXODUS SERIES

Over the course of April, Sr High you will wrestle with some of the Bible's most vivid and challenging moments - Moses' unlikely calling at the burning bush, the plagues and the complicated question at Pharaoh's hardened hearts, the terrifying and awe-inspiring crossing of the sea, and the long, difficult work of learning to trust God in the wilderness. Spoiler: the wilderness is hard. The Israelites complain a lot. Our students will probably relate.

But the deeper question Exodus keeps asking is 'Who are we,' and 'who does God call us to be the the road is uncertain?' This is exactly the question teenagers are living. We hope this month of Study will give our youth language for their own moments of oppression, calling, and courage.



We had an exciting 3rd Saturday Meal in March. We ran out of meatloaf about 12:20 with 25 minutes left. Luckily, Paula ran out and picked up chicken nuggets and instant mashed potatoes. We served another 15 meals. We served 150+ meals including 60 take-out meals. We've been serving more meals in the last 3 months. Most of our guests are in their 70s, some on limited income. Our take-outs go to families and some people take both. We do have younger people too. Many people live in the area. We have some people from St. Cloud. This ministry is growing as the needs for community engagement continue to grow. Many people are experiencing increasing isolation so opportunities to gather for free are really valuable. I anticipate serving more people in the coming months as gas prices and food prices increase.

# 2026-2027 College Scholarships for FUMC Members

## Applications Open

College students who are or have been actively involved in First United Methodist Church are encouraged to apply for a scholarship to aid with college costs. Qualified students can apply for either or both the Stevenson or Cater scholarships online using the same application form. Previous recipients are eligible to reapply.

-- **The Stevenson Scholarship** will be awarded to an **undergraduate college student** who is a member of First United Methodist Church of the St. Cloud Region. **Students entering college in fall 2026 are eligible for this scholarship.** Expected awards: 2 scholarships of \$600.

**Application deadline is May 15.**

-- **Cater Scholarships** will be awarded to college students (**sophomore in fall 2026 through graduate study**) who are members of a United Methodist congregation in Minnesota.

Expected awards: 2-4 scholarships of \$1,500 each.

**Application deadline is May 15.**

**Your application will include writing about how you expect to serve God and your neighbor through the career path for which your college education will prepare you. The committee also requires a transcript of your latest year's work in high school or college plus two letters of recommendation. Details are on the application form.**

-- **The Grannis Memorial Scholarships** will be awarded to students who are entering or currently attending a seminary with plans to work in a United Methodist ministry. Applicants must have a Minnesota connection through church, family, or a Minnesota institution or organization in which the applicants are or have been involved. Expected awards: 2 scholarships of \$1,500 each. **Application deadline is May 15.**

### **Fellowship Footsteps Walking Club**

One of the most common desires in our lives is to start exercising and/or changing our diet to either lose weight, be more active, or just attempt to create a healthier lifestyle. What many people have trouble with is knowing where to start. So many people join a gym and think they need to train like an Olympian to get an effective workout, only to find out the next day that they had over-exerted themselves and were having trouble getting out of bed! (This has happened to me!) This turns people away from wanting to exercise more often. The good news is that we don't have to start at level 10; level 1 exists, and that level 1 is just walking!

For beginners, it's good to start walking 10-15 minutes (roughly 1 mile) every day or at the very least 3 days a week. This will also help start a habit of exercising if you aren't used to doing it. Whether you're along for the exercise, the company, the desire to be with others during the week, or as a way to get outside and enjoy connecting with nature, you are invited!
