AUGUST Communion Offering: Feeding Area Children Together

Here in Central Minnesota, 1 in every 5 students do not know where their next meal will come from. Going hungry as a child causes an increased risk of learning and behavioral challenges. At **Feeding Area Children Together (FACT)**, we bridge the gap for students when school is not in session through our three services:

FACT PACKS: Distributed before weekends and breaks, these packs provide full meals and high quality snacks.

FACT Pantries: Housed within our schools, these provide shelf-stable food for both our students and families.

Break Boxes: Filled with fresh food and pantry staples, these boxes feed our families over longer school breaks, lasting one week or longer.





Amanda Hodge Receives Emma Norton Scholarship

Minnesota Conference United Women in Faith is proud to announce that Amanda Hodge is one of three recipients of

this year's Emma Norton Scholarship. Amanda will be receiving \$5000 to begin her first year of study at Garret-Theological Seminary this fall. A "stand-in" check was presented to Amanda on Sunday, July 13, by local members of United Women in Faith!

The history of this scholarship dates to 1921, when a Minnesota woman named Emma Hayes Norton donated \$25,000 in stocks and bonds to the Women's Home Missionary Society, a forerunner of United Women in Faith. It was stipulated that the investment stay intact, and the interest be used for two purposes – half for the education of women going into full time Christian vocations and the other half used to build and maintain what we know today as Emma Norton Services in St. Paul.

By 1967 the fund had grown to \$156,000 and the Emma Norton Designated Fund was taken over by the MN Conference United Women in Faith. Each year women going into Christian ministries are invited to apply for the Emma Norton Scholarship. Congratulations Amanda on this outstanding honor!


HOST NEEDED FOR AN EXCHANGE STUDENT





