
This Lent we will be reading some amazing stories from our faith – stories of the ways Jesus





Books about big emotions, connection, and diversity.

Amanda put out a few children's books near the Sanctuary from our Trauma-Responsive Church collection. These books support kids (and caregivers) as they navigate big, overwhelming emotions, practice calming strategies, and grow in compassion and care for all people in our community.

There is an online children's book/resource that relates specifically to ICE raids/enforcement activity, along with a few age-appropriate talking points--especially if your kids are asking questions about what they're hearing or seeing. Please let us know **if you need additional support**, or what else might be meaningful for you and your family during this season of stress and uncertainty for so many.

Over the past several weeks, junior and senior high youth have spent time **reflecting on the year ahead** and sharing what it means to be a young person in our community at this time. Living amid **uncertainty and change**, youth have named worries and concerns for their classmates, friends, and neighbors. These conversations created space for **listening, empathy, and mutual support** as young people practiced caring for one another.



Some youth have also shown **courage** by stepping into leadership roles within their schools, working thoughtfully to influence positive change and support their peers. Alongside these conversations, we used our **Epiphany star words** to guide reflection, inviting youth to imagine what the year ahead might look like and what they hope to achieve and help create in the world. Through sharing and reflection, youth expressed a desire to bring light, compassion, courage, and hope into the months ahead.

Redeeming Conflict by Ann M. Garrido

What do you think of or feel when you hear the word “conflict”? For many people this word makes their stomach churn or become tied up in knots, or it sets our feet to running out the door. In this book study, we will break conflict down in ways that help us deal positively in our daily lives and in our church community and interactions with the realities and dynamics of conflict. We will learn insights and skills to help prevent and deal in healthier ways with toxic, potentially destructive conflict and we will even identify and discover the ways in which conflict can actually be a blessing. Come and join us, in a safe space, to reflect on this sometimes-scary word in ways that are life-giving.



Pastor Steve Peterson has been involved in ordained pastoral ministry for over 40 years in Minnesota and South Dakota, serving as pastor of congregations, director of a collaborative ministry of mostly small, rural congregations, a camp director, an assistant to the bishop and as an interim pastor. United Women in Faith Sunday February 15th



Be sure to join us on February 15th for United Women in Faith Sunday. Our guest speaker, Rev. Dawn Houser, will share about the intersection of intergeneration trauma in the American Indian community and the church. Rev. Houser is a descendent of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa and serves as the lead pastor of Aitkin United Methodist Church. A committed Ojibwe Christian, Dawn lives at the intersection of Christian faith and Native spirituality, working to bring healing, understanding, and cultural restoration to both church and community. She chairs the Minnesota Conference Committee on Native American Ministries, and co-chairs the North Central Jurisdiction Committee on Native American Ministries.

UWF Sunday Native American Boarding Schools Forum

All are invited to join us after worship on February 15th as we explore the generational impact of Native American boarding schools with Rev. Dawn Houser. Many would describe the boarding school experience that impacted countless Native Americans as "old history". The impact and effects of this traumatic experience are, however, still present today. Children who attended were torn away from their families and culture, raised in a challenging and difficult environment and then expected to return to society. Looking back, we can now see how that experience shaped their relationships as they formed families and raised their own children.
