I think I was raised by the land in northern Minnesota picking wild strawberries, wild blueberries and wild raspberries and I'm grateful for God's guidance in that upbringing.

Be A Voter

The first opportunity to **Be a Voter** is the August 11 Primary Election. Voters in the Primary select which candidates advance to the November Election. Voting in the Primary increases the likelihood that your preferred candidates will appear on the ballot in November.

On the **Secretary of State's** website -sos.mn.gov - under the heading **Elections & Voting**, are all the resources needed to check your voter registration, updated your registration if you have moved or changed your name since the last election, find your polling place, request an absentee ballot, see who is on your ballot, etc.

In Minnesota we have voting options. Voting in person on August 11th, requesting and voting via an Absentee Ballot (must be received by August 11th), In Person Absentee Voting starting June 26, and Early Voting starting July 24th. Both In Person Absentee and Early Voting are available at the Benton or Sherburne County Government Centers and in Stearns County at the Stearns County Service Center. Other locations are St Cloud and Elk River City Halls.

When voting In Person Absentee your ballot will be sealed in an absentee ballot envelope and counted during the absentee ballot counting process. Early Voting allows you to put your completed ballot into a tabulation machine just as you would on Election Day.

July Communion Offering will be received by Central Minnesota Habitat for Humanity

Central Minnesota Habitat for Humanity offers a homeownership program to individuals in Stearns, Sherburne, Benton, and Wright counties. CMHFH does not give houses away for free. Instead, CMHFH provides affordable mortgages to those who qualify and contribute to the success of their build.

CMHFH was founded in 1989 in response to concerns about the lack of safe, decent, and affordable housing in the St. Cloud area. Construction began that same year on the first CMHFH Habitat home and, in 1990, that home was purchased by the first partner homebuyer. Since then, CMHFH has sold homes to 111 households, across the service area of four counties. Through Habitat for Humanity’s title program, over 100 homes have been built in Costa Rica, Paraguay, El Salvador, and Nicaragua.

Habitat for Humanity International (HFHI) and CMHFH have an open-door policy: everyone who believes that all people need safe, decent, and affordable places to live are welcome to help with the work, regardless of race, religion, age, gender, sexuality, political views, or any of the distinctions that too often divide people. CMHFH welcomes volunteers and supporters from all backgrounds and serve people in need of decent housing regardless of those distinctions.

As a matter of policy, HFHI and its affiliate organizations will not proselytize. This means CMHFH doesn’t adhere to—or assist in converting people to—a particular faith. CMHFH also doesn’t listen and respond to messaging designed to induce conversion to a particular faith. Nor will CMHFH work with entities or individuals who insist on proselytizing as part of their work with Habitat.

The Sanctuary Has a New Covering

On Thursday, June 18, 2026, our roofing contractor, BD Exteriors, replaced the shingle roof on the North and South pitched portions of the roof above our Sanctuary. We have had issues the past few years with shingles coming loose due to wind, hail, and snowstorms, and Trustees determined that it was time to replace the roof rather than continue to spend money on repairs. Trustees also considered the upcoming solar panel installation, and the need to make sure that we have a proper roof base to support our new system.



The replacement process consisted of the BD Exteriors crew removing the old shingles and then removing the old underlayment barrier. Once they had completed the removal, the plywood sheathing was photographed and inspected. Our sheathing was fortunately in particularly decent shape. Next a brand-new underlayment barrier was installed across the entire roof. An additional special underlayment layer was added above the roof eave edges to better seal, protect, and support a special shingle layer to be installed at the roof eave edges. Along these eave edges, a special design type of starter shingle system was installed which gives the roof a 130-mph wind warranty for the roof shingles. Our new roof shingles are CertainTeed NorthGate Climate-Flex Shingles with Class 4 Impact rating and Lifetime warranty in the color Max Def Moire Black. A Class 4 rating is currently the industry's highest rating for shingles. The Northgate shingle is designed to bend but not break, and can withstand hail impact at up to 90 mph.

BD Exteriors also replaced the downspouts on the South side of the Church with larger volume downspouts and corrected the slope on the existing gutters to solve our roof drainage issue at the Southwest corner of the building.



The BD Exteriors team did an amazing job with this project. The crew completed the roof replacement in one day from 7am to 4pm. They were so respectful and careful with our space. At the end of the day, you could not even tell they had been here, other than there was a nice new roof covering the Sanctuary.

Trustees consulted BD Exteriors and our Solar Project partner, All Energy Solar, to make sure that the Sanctuary roof replacement met all necessary standards for the Solar Project panel installation. This is an exciting first step in preparing our Church building for our new Solar Project.

After many years of repairs, it is a great relief to finally have a solid roof over the Sanctuary.



The Great Coyote Photo Challenge:
Your Mission, Should You Choose to Accept It: We are officially launching the **Coyote Picture Challenge!** We want you, your kids, your small groups, or your friends to sneak a photo with our silent protector. There are just a few ground rules for this top-secret operation:

- **Don't get caught!** Channel your inner secret agent. Snap your photo without being spotted by other people (or, of course, the cranes).
- **Keep him on his turf.** While our coyote *can* be moved around for the perfect shot, he must remain in the back open area of the church property so he can keep doing his job.

New Voices, New Dreams:

The Next Chapter of Reconciling at Love First UMC

In 2019, Love First UMC voted to become a Reconciling Church – a public declaration that all people, including LGBTQIA+ people, are welcomed, affirmed, and loved here. That vote was a milestone, but it was never a finish line. The work of reconciliation doesn't end. It shifts. It deepens. And it asks us to keep listening.



A committee was formed to carry that ongoing work forward. Then COVID reshaped everything – including how we organized ourselves. In the years that followed, the Reconciling committee was folded into our Trauma-Responsive Church team, and that made sense. The overlap was real: the church has caused deep, lasting harm to queer people, and responding to that trauma is inseparable from the work of reconciliation.

The members of that team have been faithful stewards of this ministry. They have organized our presence at Pride in the Park and the Pride and Peace Walk year after year. They created what has become an annual Sunday each September – a day set aside to honor our Reconciling commitment and to name, honestly, the work still ahead. We are grateful for every bit of that labor.

Now we're ready for the next step.

Through our strategic planning process and the evolving focus of the Trauma-Responsive Team, we believe it's time for Reconciling to become its own standalone team again – with new energy, new ideas, and most importantly, **new voices**. We are seeking people in the congregation, both queer and allies, who feels stirred by this work.

We want to sit down together and ask some real questions:

- What work still needs to be done?
- How do we show up at community Pride events in a way that genuinely reflects who we are – an inclusive, welcoming church – to people who may never have experienced that from a faith community?
- Where do we still need to grieve? Where must we continue to lament the pain the church has caused and continues to cause queer people?
- What would it look like to do things differently – not the way they've always been done, but with new life?

This team doesn't have a blueprint yet. That's the point. We want to build it together, and we can't do that without you.


