Looking Back...Looking Ahead

This fall we have taken time to focus on our DNA, on who we are as the peculiar Christians called Methodists. Some might say, "well that's just history," and in some sense they would be right. But as our history has gotten us to where we are today, we can learn from it and still draws the wisdom that is there for us today. We've also been wrapping up our Visioning Process, with a new Vision Statement and continued conversation about what this means for us today (see the Vision page of this newsletter!) Some in our community might say, "well that's a future I'll never see," and they might be right. But as a community that desires to make a difference in this world and help guide our community to be more loving, we need a vision to guide us to take risks and leaps of faith for the vision God has given us.



Lawrence Stookey, in an old book called Calendar: Christ's Time for the Church, says, "Indeed, it can be

said that Christians are called to assume a cruciform posture: Standing upright with feet firmly planted in the present, we stretch out one arm to grasp our heritage and the other arm to lay hold of our hope; standing thus, we assume the shape of our central symbol of faith: the cross."

In other words, we are grounded in the present, while always looking back for the wisdom of the past, and forward towards where God is leading us now. There's also a symbol and concept from Ghanaian heritage that represents a similar idea. The bird below is that symbol, called sankofa. You can see how the bird is looking over its shoulder while facing in the opposite direction. This is a symbol that we always learn and gain from our past that which we need as we move into the future;



that we honor those who have come before us and the wisdom they bring as we continue to create what is yet to come. This month we will celebrate All Saints' Day, naming the ways in which those who have come before us have blessed us and created the present where we now stand; and we will continue our Visioning Process, where we will claim a future we have yet to see. May this be a month of blessing, of peace, of challenge, and of living out our faith.

May we be moved by love to become love!



NOVEMBER Communion Offering: Emma Norton Services

The programs at Emma Norton have consistently successful outcomes. Every individual journey of recovery is unique, and across our organization we can measure the direct impacts we've had on moving those journeys toward wholeness. We know every little victory is a part of a success story worth celebrating.

Our programs have shown again and again that they are effective models to move our most vulnerable community members toward safe, stable housing, which provides a foundation for greater individual stability and wellbeing. In 2024, we served 363 individuals, with 50 percent identifying as BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) and all very low income. In our Family Housing, over 80 percent of individuals and children identify as BIPOC. See below for additional outcome measurements for 2024.

Communion Offering

October's

World Communion Sunday will receive our gifts of \$1,300

Overall 2024 outcomes:

- 87% of all clients maintained housing for one year or more.
- On average, 80% of all clients complete one or more goals on their stability plans annually.

Emma's Place:

- 100% of families maintained housing for 6 months or more or moved into permanent, affordable housing at exit.
- 100% of adult heads of household engaged in services offered at Emma's Place.
- Over 90 youth (98%) participated in youth activities and programming.

Scattered-Site program:

- 92% of tenants successfully completed their initial lease period upon moving into their own rental units.
- 100% of households experiencing a crisis that potentially affected their housing stability received support to resolve it.

Safer People, Stronger Church:

Practicing
Trauma-Informed
Leadership
Webinar

Nov. 18, 6:30-7:45 p.m., online

As faith communities, we are called to nurture healing and hope. Many of us are still learning how trauma affects people, congregational culture, and the systems that support ministry. This session offers descriptive language, ideas, and options so each congregation can discern its own path toward being more trauma-informed. To begin, moving from 'what's wrong?' to 'what happened?' quiets judgment and strengthens conflict skills. Over time, trauma-informed leadership can influence a whole-church operating system, evolving norms and practices so that safety, voice, and choice create a virtuous cycle of trust.

Together, we will:

- Clarify terms, boundaries & language: Define trauma and its impacts, the 4R's of traumainformed care, and name what traumainformed leadership *does* and *does not* do.
- Pinpoint where, in your context, traumainformed practices may matter most.
- Discern your "why" for trauma-informed leadership, building on the strengths and challenges of your church today.
- For congregations that want to take the next step: Select an action, understand Conference resources, and identify whom to bring to the table.
