When Jesus was asked about the greatest commandment, he replied: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." And he added, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:30-31). These two commandments remain at the core of our faith, reminding us that love for God and love for one another cannot be separated.

In the Wesleyan tradition, Christians have long practiced this love through covenant group/small gatherings where individuals come together to pray, reflect, and "watch over one another in love." These groups offer a safe space for honest conversation, encouragement, accountability, and spiritual growth.

This fall, our church invites you to join—or even form—a covenant group of your own. We've provided a step-by-step guide to shape your time together, with the goal of 10 one-hour conversations. You might already meet regularly with friends and want to bring these questions and practices into that space. You might be hoping to form relationships with others in our church family. Or perhaps you'd like to try something entirely new, leaning into community as we reflect on Wesley's questions for self-examination (even if they feel a bit clunky at times). Whatever your starting point, let us remain open to how this season of change might also bring transformation within us.

Our fall can fill up so fast with things that matter far less. Should you wish to join/form a group. Sign up at the table in the church entryway. Look for the display labeled "How is it with your soul?" Please indicate your time and day preference for meeting on the lists provided. Feel free to grab or peruse the group packet as well. May we each find deeper connection this season in our faith and in one another.



#### SEPTEMBER Communion Offering: Anna Marie's Alliance

Anna Marie's Alliance reaches thousands of people in the five counties surrounding St. Cloud, Minnesota. Each year, our 36-bed emergency shelter houses nearly 500 individuals and their children as they flee relationship abuse. Prevention and Education initiatives reach approximately 4,000 school-age youth, teaching them valuable relationship skills and ways to create healthy boundaries. Community Advocacy programs provide 24-hour crisis support, on-scene advocacy for individuals immediately after an incident takes place, criminal justice system advocacy, and victim support services that continue throughout the court process and until families are settled safely in their new, violence-free homes.

The impact of Anna Marie's Alliance can be seen in the faces of individuals who have finally broken free from abuse; in the children whose lives are filled with a new sense of peace; and in the next generation, who have the opportunity to learn early in life which behaviors are healthy and which cannot be tolerated.

For staffing the booth, the following shifts are available -10:30 - 12:30, 12:30 - 2:30, 2:30 - 4:30


For the concert, we will need a couple people to greet the guests, point out restrooms and collect the free will offering. Please arrive at 2:30.


United Women in Faith are now collecting new and gently used coats for Emma's Place in St Paul.

These coats are for men, women, and children of any size. Make sure the coat is warm enough for Minnesota winter and in good condition. Mittens, hats and gloves are also needed.




