MARIE HIGASHI

Marie Higashi was born in Sasebo, Nagasaki Prefecture.

She began her professional life as a nurse before turning to painting in 2017 during a period of personal crisis. Her experience in surgery rooms, witnessing the fragile line between life and death, profoundly shaped her vision of fragility, resilience, and impermanence.

What began as a personal act of healing grew into a sustained artistic practice.



Marie's works reflect her time spent in the medical world, exploring the profound realities of human existence, such as its resilience and ephemeral nature.

The transition from being a caregiver to becoming an artist underscores Marie's ongoing quest to understand and articulate the emotional experiences of life and healing.

Her artworks, vibrant and emotionally charged, deep dive into the nuances of human vulnera-bility and resilience.

Even though painting started as a way for her to heal, it also became a journey of discovery. The wound heals, but they never return to their original state. Instead, they regenerate into new skin.

It is a cycle of destruction

and rebirth.

Marie begins by applying white primer to the wood panel.

Once dry, she uses a file or metal to smooth and scratch the surface.

Then two layers of acrylic paint are ap-plied over the whole surface. From here, the drawing process starts. She removes the acrylic paint by using a small brush or sponge. The black areas on the screen are those that have not been scraped off.

Therefore, areas that are not black are the ones that have been scraped off. When the groundwork is first scraped and scratched, acrylic paint can penetrate these areas and produce a fine texture. For the final touch, she creates a black and white screen and covers the white areas with brown or red paint.



In the process of painting, Marie considers the acts of scratching, rubbing, and scraping, along with the resulting marks, scars, holes, and damages, to be crucial. While painting, she uses her hands and eyes to touch, trace, and verify these textures.

Higashi paints on wooden panels using a layered and subtractive process. She begins with a white primer, then applies acrylic paint in several coats. Through scratching, rubbing, and scraping, she removes pigment to reveal underlying textures. She often incorporates mineral pigments, charcoal, animal glue, or tea, each leaving organic traces. For Marie, scars, marks, and voids are not imperfections but essential elements of expression, echoing Japanese aesthetics of wabi-sabi and mono no aware. Her works embody a cycle of destruction and regeneration, where every surface becomes a record of vulnerability, resilience, and renewal.






Artist's statement





In her **Origin** (起源) series, Marie Higashi returns to elemental materials: paper, charcoal, graphite, and pigment on wood, to explore the genesis of form and life. Emerging from her long-standing reflection on fragility and renewal, these intimate works reveal traces of both gesture and erosion, evoking the tension between control and chance. The series marks a new phase in her practice: a quiet search for what lies at the beginning, where matter and memory first converge.


