From The Chambers



Council held its Ordinary General Meeting on 20th February 2024. At this meeting, Council considered the following business:

- CEO is sourcing a consultant to work with Council and the Rum Jungle Rehabilitation Program regarding the Rum Jungle Borrow Pit.
- The Black Spot Grant application has been submitted for works on the corner of Miles and Solomon Roads.
- The NTG Community Places for People Grants have been opened and Council will be submitting 2 projects:

Cemetery Precinct Project – Pathways and Parking. Tree Audit and subsequent tree removal and lopping.

- Council resolved to not appoint a deputy principal member for the remaining term of council.
- Council acknowledged the passing of a valued community member, Mrs Roslyn Jones, who significantly contributed to the Coomalie Community.
- Rates recovery procedure is underway. If you are experiencing financial hardship, please contact the Council Office for options on payment plans.

The 4th and final instalment date for property rates are due on the 29th March 2024.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

BATCHELOR

Named after Egerton Lee Batchelor (1865-1911), politician, born 10 April 1865 in

Adelaide.

Batchelor was a central figure in the South Australian labour movement as early as his twenties and it is not surprising that he was one of the leading foundation members and a driving force in the formation of the United Labour Party in 1891. First elected to the SA House of Assembly in 1893 he served until his resignation in 1901 in order to enter Federal politics. He was immediately elected to the House of Representatives and served there until his death on 8 October 1911. From 1908 until his death he was Minister for External Affairs and 1911 he also took over responsibility for the Northern Territory. Such was his popularity that during his parliamentary career, both state and federal, he was never defeated in an election. He died while climbing Mount Donna Buang near Warburton, Victoria from a heart attack.

Council has 2 easy ways to provide feedback, this can be done through Council's website - Contact us I Coomalie Community Government Council, or via the Snap Send Solve app.



The second option is to use the Snap Send Solve app, this is a smart phone app and can be downloaded from either the Apple Store or the Google Playstore.

The benefit of this method of communication is that it provides GPS location data for the images that are uploaded with the feedback.


Currently Snap Send Solve does not provide anonymous submission of feedback or complaints. Again this information is handy should we wish to gain clarification on an item!

Weeds in Coomalie

Mimosa

Scientific name: Mimosa pigra

Declaration status: Class A except in areas where it is classified as Class B

Mimosa has a statutory weed management plan which outlines the legal requirements for control.

Mimosa is native to tropical America from Mexico to northern Argentina.

It was deliberately introduced to the Northern Territory (NT) in the late 1800s as an ornamental curiosity.

Since then, it has spread across 15 catchments and onto 3 islands in the NT. In suitable conditions mimosa can form vast monocultures.

Its spread has negatively impacted wetland ecosystems, pasture production, conservation land management and social and cultural land use.

Identification

You should use this as a guide. There may be other plants or weeds that look similar.

- single prickly stem when young, branched prickly bush when mature, up to 6m tall
- stem is greenish in young plants, becomes woody as the plant matures
- stem prickles are 0.5cm to 1cm long
- fern-like green leaves made up of many fine leaflets, occur in opposite pairs along branches and fold together at night, when touched or when water stressed
- flower heads are round fluffy balls composed of up to 100 small pink to mauve flowers
- each flower head produces a cluster of 10 to 20 seed pods
- seed pods are 6cm to 8cm long, turn brown when mature and break into segments
- seeds within the pods are oblong, brown or green and flattened and covered in fine hairs.

Council held its annual Bombing of Darwin Commemorative service at the Adelaide River War Cemetery Civilian Section recently with a gathering of approx. 80 people.

Attendees listened to President Beswick speak about the Post Office workers that lost their lives, in particular the Croft family, that had descendants in attendance at the service.

Janie Mason from CDU Nursing History Unit spoke of Eileen Neenan, nee Elcock, and her MBE and finished with mention of two nurses remembered there at Adelaide River War Cemetery.

The Honourable Mr Brent Potter and Mr Luke Gosling also spoke on recent conflicts and the need to reflect on these actions for future generations.



COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE



Our 3G closure in 2024: your questions answered

Back in 2019 we announced that we'd be closing our 3G network, which you might also know as the Telstra Next G network. Doing so allows us to repurpose the 3G spectrum to offer better coverage and reliability on our 4G and 5G mobile network.

- All Telstra Towers will be converted to 4G by 30th of June 2024
- The 3G network is not being replaced rather it is being upgraded/repurposed (like adding another lane to the highway not building a new highway in layman's terms).
- 3G users will have the same coverage which will either be the same or improved to 4G.
 Big data users or high-end users will get bumped to 5G.
- As of the 1st of January, there remained 4 EFTPOS Machines and 18 handset still in operation in Coomalie. The 4 EFTPOs owners need to go to their bank to change their device.

Community Groups

Batchelor Museum

The Museum has had a few visitors in the past month, but come late March it will open daily from 10 am until 4pm, and at other times by appointment. At times tour groups want to visit earlier to fit in with their schedule and we will work with them to do so. Meantime Peter has been working to improve the grounds presentation and he is changing the bird water points to more conventional pieces, replacing the old bathroom basins. These new bird baths are being cemented in place. We also hope to finally remove the old stumps of mahogany trees which were cut down when the Museum was being established more than twelve years ago.

The mining era brought an influx of both Irish and Italian workers to Batchelor, and I was recently asked to provide details about the Italian men. Whilst we have records about many of the mining workers we do not hold a history of specific country immigration.

The Community has been welcoming in that it has, I think, been recognised that there is history of Aboriginal as well as white Australians and other countries represented here, and we had not previously been bothered with theft and vandalism.

Recently, besides theft there has, disappointingly, been vandalism. One item was the breaking of a door latch. A new one was bought and then Peter saw two boys attempting to break the new one. He chased them quite a way, and reported them to

Police.

Firstly, they needed to be at school, not wandering around looking for some mischief to pass the time.

However this episode reminds me of a project I would like to see happen in Batchelorand that is an area for young people to pursue some indoor recreation and skills. One of the houses for relocation (see them near Darwin) would be ideal to set up this project.

If you are interested in developing this idea, please be in contact with us here at the Museum and we can present the project to Council and apply for a Community Grant to get the situation going.

Meantime Lucinda and I will continue our respective projects to keep developing the community Museum .
