








Adelaide River Roadworks

A lovely service was provided by all, and it was special to see so many Defence Force


personnel lined up to the left of the cross to honoour the fallen, or injured personnel from all previous wars that Australia has served in.

Hi folks,

We know how crucial broadband is to homes and businesses in the bush, and the last few months we've been delivering on upgrade programs across the county. As we continue to evolve and upgrade the network, it is important that we listen to our customers so that we get it right.



That's why we've kicked off a <u>trial of a new nbn® Sky Muster Plus® satellite plan</u>, intended to deliver 100% ummetered data usage and faster burst speeds of up to 100Mbps. I'm excited to see what feedback we get so that the end product delivers on our customers' needs. After one month, early indications suggest the satellite network appears to remain robust despite an norease in data usage of about 33% during the peak hours of Apm-mininght. I'm excited to say we have extended the trial to include up to around 15,000 eligible participants (previously 10,000).

The trial follows the release of four new higher speed tiers and uncapped data allowance plans on the nbn business satellite service in January, and the announcement in February of a further 1 million more homes and businesses becoming eligible for a full fibre upgrade, with up to <u>58%</u> of <u>these being in regional areas</u>.

I was proud to represent **nbn** at the 2023 Mobile World Congress in Barcelona in February, where we announced that hah will be the first <u>natwork operator</u> in the world to deploy <u>Erosaroly</u> actinediz-range solutions in the field. This software is one of the puzzle pieces that will help us "SG-enable" our existing Flowd Wireless network, improving capacity, reducing congestion and supporting the introduction of higher wholesails epoded. Staying on the fixed wireless upgrades, we've also recently released the first 24.000 homes and businesses across Australia who can now access hoh fixed wireless services for the first ime. These are just the first of around 120.000 premises who may be able to experience enhancements that will enable faster and more consistent speeds overall across the fixed wireless network, including in the evening. This will allow more people to more people to be online at the same to work, study, and stream with less buffering.

Regular readers will know how much I look forward to our annual *innevate with nbn.grants* program and the opportunity to celebrate great ideas bursting out of regional and remote Australia. Now in its third year, we are seeing businesses doing incredible things with the nbn* network, and developing products and solutions to increase digital participation, productivity or deliver great social outcomes for regional and remote Australians.

I'd like to take this opportunity to send a virtual thank-you to the businesses who entered this year and congratulate the winners who were crowned at our first face to face innovate with **nbn**^{*} Awards Ceremony in February this year. I can't wait to see and hear more from these winners over the coming months.

Before I sign off, I wanted to share some more news for students and their families in regional areas. We are partnering with the Australian Government to provide free broadband for 12 months to up to 30,000 families with no internet at home – a great step forward for families in need. And, as you read this we will have seen the first year that the annual NAPLAN tests were held completely online and we were proud to again support Australian students by placing an outage embrgo across much of the network to ensure limited disruption to students during the testing period.

We recognise that affordability of communications services is front of mind for many, and to this end nbn has recently held the first *Low-Income and Digital Inclusion Forum* with peak industry bodies, advocacy and industry groups. Too of mind in this discussion is identifying possible targeted initiatives to improve access, affordability, and digital ability for low-income, vulnerable, and unconnected end users of the nbn * network. These forums will help inform our actions and will occur at least once each financial year. I'll keep you updated as these discussions progress.






