From The Chambers

Council held its Ordinary General Meeting on 18th July 2023. At this meeting, Council

considered the following business:

- Council received the Certified Plan of the Registration of a Road name, CHIN ROAD.
- Auditors will be at the Council Office week of 24th July 2023 to conduct the final stage of auditing Council's financials to prepare for completion of the Annual Audited Financial Statements.
- The Elected Member's Professional Development Plan 2023/24 was introduced. Elected Members will be attending the most appropriate training and conference opportunities to enable each council member to develop capabilities in the member's role.
- Review of Quarterly reports from each of Councils functions highlighting the works achieved, which were above and beyond. Thank you to Councils efficient, professional, and reliable staff.
- Council has been advocating for an increased water supply for Adelaide River and Batchelor amongst all the talk of improving the water supply to Darwin. For many years Council has been told that the region cannot release land or grow as the current water supply cannot handle any further growth. Power and Water Corporation has been listening and our small region is being supported amidst the major projects in the region such as returning Manton Dam to Service and AROWS. The following statements from Power Water Corporation are an exciting turning point for the Coomalie Region and Council will continue to speak up on behalf of community about this essential service:

<u>STATEMENT</u>

Power and Water is working to provide increased water supply security across the Northern Territory, including in towns in the Coomalie Shire Council area. <u>Adelaide River</u>

Equipping of a new production bore is underway which will provide increased water source capacity for the town and allow greater flexibility in the operation of the Eastern and Western bore fields during the dry and wet seasons; these works are scheduled for completion in December of this year. On completion, the water supply system in Adelaide River will have the capacity and flexibility to support growth in the town. <u>Batchelor</u>

Planning and investigations for upgrade to Batchelor's water supply system have been underway for some time. Works to upgrade the chlorine disinfection infrastructure have reached detailed design stage with some long lead items having already been ordered. Planning for the development of a new Western bore field is ongoing with further investigations required to validate initial work. Whilst there is more work to do to provide Batchelor with the capacity and flexibility to enable growth in the town over the long term, Power and Water is happy to assess any proposals in the short term with a view to supporting development in the town.

CONGRATULATIONS!

Mrs Sharon Hillen, has successfully completed the 6 – month probation period for the Chief Executive Officer Role.

Sharon will be in Office for the next 18 months leading the way to a successful and booming Community.

From The Council Services Team

Works/Waste

Council's works team are in full swing, with significant works and projects achieved. With this month's focus on "getting back to basics" in Council's service delivery, drainage, waste, roads & parks/reserves being the focus. Works undertaken have included:

- Old Coach Road, maintenance, with gravel placed and reshaping, to assist in road usage for local community.
- Adelaide River Waste Facility rebuild now complete, with transition to transfer station completed.
- Cadogan Road Lake Bennett, floodway completed.

- Mulching program of public spaces, underway Adelaide River
- Swimming Pool maintenance, including safety upgrade and repaint.
- Completion of phase 1 of the Adelaide River & Batchelor footpath project completed (Adelaide River).
- Mulching of public spaces in batchelor underway.
- Significant public spaces & reserves maintenance.
- Edge patching & line marking Haynes Road Adelaide River.
- Firebreaks strengthen Rum Jungle Lake

Projected July/August

- Complete phase 2 of footpath project (Batchelor).
- Implement recycling bins at both waste facilities.
- Further drainage works both towns.









Lake Rum Jungle Water Quality

Surface water quality monitoring was undertaken by the DPIR Environmental Monitoring Unit (EMU) to assess the water quality in the pit lake and the nearby Meneling Creek.

Monitoring rounds were undertaken prior to commencement of the works on the 27 February 2019 and 4 October 2019 and during the works on the 18 October, 1 November, 15 November and 11 December 2019. Surface water samples were collected from four surface water monitoring locations RJCSPit, MCus, MCds and MC@LB (Figure 2).

Samples were analysed for field parameters pH, EC, temperature, DO, REDUX, turbidity. Collected samples were dispatched to the Northern Territory Environmental Laboratories (Intertek) in Darwin, an NATA accredited laboratory and analysed for major ions, TDS, TSS, Metal (Total and filtered) and hardness.

Freshwater Species Protection ANZECC 2000


Dissolved metal concentrations were all below the ANZECC (2000) fresh water 95% species protection trigger value for all sampling events in 2019 with the exception of Aluminium (Al) concentrations the 4 October 2019. Al concentrations at MCus (61 ug/L), MCds (64ug/L) and RJCSPit (67 ug/L), were above the recommended ANZECC 2000 freshwater 95% species protection trigger value (55 ug/L) on the 4 October 2019

but still remained below the 90% species protection trigger value.

Australian Drinking Water Guidelines ADWG 2015

Concentrations of all analytes were below the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines ADWG 2015 for Human Health both before and during the site works.

Levels of turbidity detected above the ADWG Aesthetics level (5 NTU) in the RJCSPit (27 to 97 NTU) both prior to after the commencement of earthworks. The water in the pit was slightly alkaline with pH ranging from 7.54 to 9.95 pH, which exceeds the ADWG Aesthetics Guideline (6.5 to 8.5 pH).

This week we have welcomed Malcolm and Allison to stay as resident caretakers for some months. They contacted us when they were at Uluru and then travelled here, so have seen quite a bit of the Territory along the way. From here they will be able to enjoy a lot of Top End places and attractions.

This morning we talked about the signage and personally I have always noted how many people stop to see The Castle, but do not visit the Museum. It was good to have a new perspective and get some interest in upgrading our exposure.

Later Gaye and I had a walk around our existing signage, and whilst we wait for official signs along Rum Jungle Road we will make some changes to the ones at the Museum site.

Also, visiting this morning, for the third time, was the daughter of Janet Dickinson (nee Litchfield),-Stella, who wanted to see the house where her Grandfather, Boyne Litchfield, lived. The advice she had did not take into account houses that have been built since.

However with help from locals that has since been sorted.

Amazingly whilst she had noted the picture of her Aunt Judy at work in the Rum Jungle laboratory she had previously missed that of her Mother, just placed above. So, a

worthwhile visit to Batchelor all round.

It is always good that people find the connection they are seeking when they come, as so many do visit for just that reason. The mining history and the wartime history have significance for so many people.
