

COUNCIL UPDATES

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Council held its last meeting before entering caretaker mode on Tuesday 20th July 2021. At this meeting, officers from the Department of the Chief Minister and Cabinet attended to present to Council on the newly implemented *Local Government Act 2019* and the *Local Government Regulations (General) 2021*. The presentation explored some of the new provisions in the Act and Regulations, in particular roles and responsibilities of Elected Members, management of conflict of interest, the relationship of Elected Members with the Chief Executive Officer and Staff and disclosure requirements. It was a very valuable and informative presentation.

As this was the last meeting before caretaker mode a number of important decisions regarding future funding priorities were made with regard to projects funded by Commonwealth Grants and requests from external parties that would commit Council in the future. Key items were:

Administration of Proposed Signage Clusters – Litchfield Reginal Tourism Inc wrote to
Council seeking its in principle agreement to provide administrative oversight of future
signage clusters, to be installed by the Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics.
These signage clusters are proposed to be located at either entry to the Batchelor township
and should be in place over the coming twelve to eighteen months.

current location on Batchelor Road, to Havlik Park. Council agreed that relocating the Memorial was a good suggestion, but did not agree to Havlik Park as the preferred location and requested a further report exploring other options be presented to the new Council for consideration.

- Naming of New Road, Finniss Valley Council recently gazetted a new road to provide
 access to residents to the "Chin Estate". The road along the southern boundary of the
 "Estate" is unnamed and Council agreed to consult the community regarding proposed
 names prior to making a recommendation to the Place Names Committee. The consultation
 process will take place once the caretaker period has concluded.
- Roads to Recovery Projects Each year, council receives financial assistance from the Commonwealth Government toward the maintenance of the road network. Council will receive \$216,000 during the 2022 calendar year and agreed that priority projects included resealing T-Intersections of major rural roads, and resealing of township internal roads.
- Acceptance of Quotation Coach Road Pavement repair Council also awarded a contract to Oolloo Investments to undertake repairs to a section of Coach Road, Stapleton that was damaged due to flooding during the wet season. These works will take place over the coming months.

The next meeting of Council is Tuesday 17th August 2021. At this meeting, Council will be in caretaker mode, so whilst it will be business as usual, though no major financial or long-term decisions will be made, there will also be a very special agenda item, where retiring members will make their valedictory speeches.






It has taken a lot of to and froing, but the Batchelor Community finally has an accessible Pool Hoist at the Swimming Pool.










COMMUNITY NOTICEBOARD

COUNCIL INFORMATION

Dogs in Coomalie Shire



All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered.

You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or via email.

Vaccinate your dog

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any Public Area otherwise they will be impounded.

Fees apply if your dog has been put in the Pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$95.00 for registered dogs and \$175.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$65.00 per day kept in the Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days. Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the Pound.

Dog Registration Charges

Town and Rural - Registration period Sep - Aug Dog registered between Sep - Aug FULL fee \$35.00 Dog registered between Mar - Aug PART fee \$25.00 Concession card holders ½rice.
