## COUNCIL UPDATES

### **FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS**

Council held its ordinary general meeting on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2022. This was a key meeting for the year as Council formally declared the Rates and Annual Budget 2022-23 and adopted its Shire Plan 2022-23. The Rates Declaration was published in the *NT News* and is also available on Council's website at <https://www.coomalie.nt.gov.au/council-publications>

The Annual Budget and Shire plan 2022-23 is also available on the website. Or, if you want a hard copy, pop in to one of Council's Community Libraries or visit our Administration Office in Batchelor, and the friendly team will provide you with a copy on request.

Key items of business that were also considered by Council at its meeting were:

- Incorporation of Unincorporated Areas – the Northern territory Government conducted a consultation process between March and April seeking stakeholder and community views regarding “Bringing Local Government to Unincorporated areas”. Council approved a joint submission with Belyuen Community Government Council, with whom Council has been working for many years in a proposal to join together in a stronger local government. The joint submission suggested combining all three Shire councils and bringing together surrounding unincorporated areas into a new regional Council. The Northern Territory Government is seeking to implement reforms to local government by 30th June 2023;
- Greater Darwin Region Destination Management Plan – Council worked with many

stakeholders in the development of the Plan and the Northern Territory Government released it during the month. This is an important document that will provide a framework for future planning and funding submissions. A copy can be accessed [here](#).

- Tourism Town Asset Program – Council has received a grant of \$72,000 to develop a Discovery Kiosk and Wayfinding System at the Batchelor Information Centre. Updates will be provided regarding this exciting project;

Members of the community are welcome to attend Council meetings! COVID Safety provisions still apply, so physical distancing must be observed which may result in limiting numbers in the Chamber. The wearing of masks is a personal decision. Need to know more? # Heathers Lagoon Drainage Works



**Council are undertaking improvements to the road by constructing culverts at the Lake Bennett Overflow crossing and constructing a concrete causeway further along the road.**

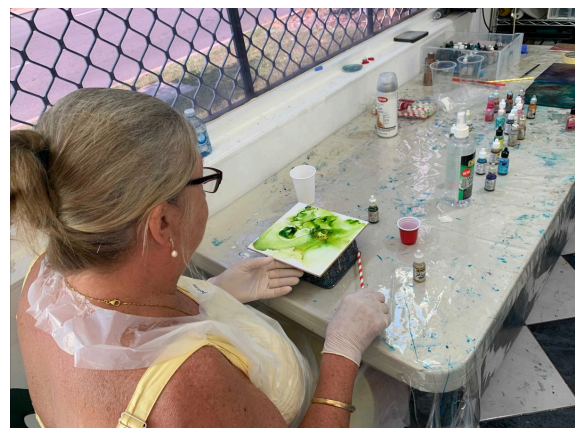
### Fortnightly Sports

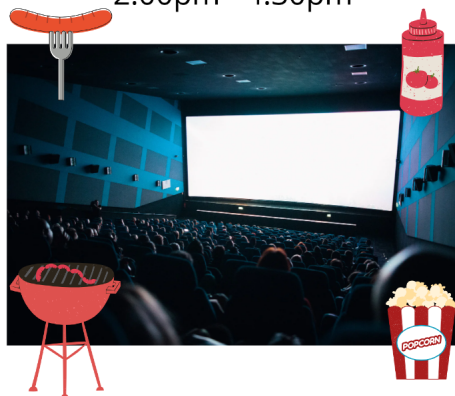

- providing financial information about aged care services

### Four steps to access services

1. **Call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422\*** or apply for an assessment online at [myagedcare.gov.au](http://myagedcare.gov.au). You can also book an appointment with an Aged Care Specialist Officer at a Services Australia service centre.
  - You will be asked questions to help work out your care needs.
  - You will need your Medicare card.
  - If you're applying for someone else, they will need to give their consent.
2. **Have an assessment**
  - My Aged Care may arrange for a trained assessor to conduct the assessment.
  - With your consent they will assess your care needs and confirm your eligibility for services. They will then work with you to develop a support plan which addresses your needs, goals and preferences.
  - Someone else can be with you during the visit.
3. **Find out about costs**
  - My Aged Care and service providers can give you information about how much you might have to pay. You may need to complete a financial assessment through Services Australia.
4. **Find a provider**
  - The online find a provider tool can help you find and compare aged care service providers in your area.

\* Your assessor and My Aged Care can also help you find a provider(s) in your local area that meets your needs.

My Aged Care is the starting point to access Australian Government aged care services and information about:

- the different types of aged care services available
- your eligibility for services
- assessment for services
- referrals to service providers that can help you meet your needs
- your contribution to the cost of your aged care.



### What services are available?

- Care at home**
- My Aged Care can help you access services that can support you to remain living at home and in your own community.
- You may be eligible to access support to help you continue doing what you can for yourself, safely and with a focus on your strengths and goals, such as:
- personal care like help getting dressed or showering
  - transport
  - modifications to your home like hand rails or ramps
  - nursing, physiotherapy and other care
  - help with preparing your meals
  - help with cleaning your home or gardening
  - equipment like walking frames
  - social activities to help keep your mind and body active and healthy.

### Short-term help

- My Aged Care can also help you access short-term care services for situations such as:
- recovery from an illness, including after a hospital stay
  - when you have had a setback and want to get your independence back
  - when you, or your care, needs a break (respite care)

### Care in an aged care home

If you find you need ongoing help with day-to-day tasks or health care, an aged care home lets you live in a supported environment where help is available 24 hours a day.

### Who pays for services?

The Australian Government contributes to the cost of aged care services. You are expected to contribute to the cost if you can afford to. How much you pay may depend on:

- your financial situation
- the number and types of services you receive

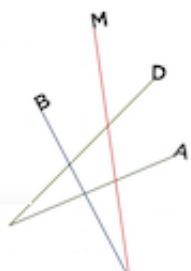

Peter and Pauline arrived at the Museum two weeks ago and we are grateful for their assistance to now open every day from 10am. We were compromising with five days earlier which has led to some problems for people visiting Batchelor for a day or so only. Peter and Pauline would welcome more visitors so please spread the word.

For locals there are some new panels and there will soon be a third photographic display mostly with recreational pictures from those people who lived here in the mining era. They are great illustrations of the natural bushland which existed then with many fishing and camping activities, plus various other pursuits.

The existing photographic displays are well regarded, especially when someone recognises a friend or relative from the time. Last week visitors came as they live near previous CEO Paul in South Australia.

Many people from Adelaide River and Batchelor, but also all points further north, attended the funeral for Vic Fox on Friday 24 May. Vic's contributions to community over many years are well known and there was much evidence from his fellow fire fighters and emergency services people, which would be a source of pride and solace to his grieving family.

There are two steel pieces displayed in the Museum which Vic contributed after finding them on his property. Both are hand made tools from WW2 and fine examples of the ingenuity in making what could not otherwise be obtained at the time. Vic enjoyed making things too and used his wood working skills as another outlet for his energy and enjoyment with meeting people.

From June 1 our tour group (Ethical Adventures) will resume visits. Their planned schedule was changed as Berry Springs has not been open so that the swim time there was not possible.



# Dogs in Coomalie Shire

## PARVO KILLS



All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered.

You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or via email.

## Vaccinate your dog

**Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any Public Area otherwise they will be impounded.**

**Fees apply if your dog has been put in the Pound.**

Impoundment fees are initially \$95.00 for registered dogs and \$175.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$65.00 per day kept in the Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days. Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the Pound.

## Dog Registration Charges

Town and Rural - Registration period Sep - Aug

Dog registered between Sep - Aug FULL fee \$35.00

Dog registered between Mar - Aug PART fee \$25.00

Concession card holders ½ price.
