Approximately 1800 people attended the Dawn Service this year, which is in line with the past few year's services. Our MC, Bob Shewring, lead us through the formal proceedings, with commemorations including Essington School singer, Hallie McDowall, and young Bugler, Caedyn Taylor, from the Arafura Wind Ensemble.

As Council had applied for a Community Benefit grant at the end of 2019 to host the subsequently cancelled 2020 service, these funds were transferred over to the 2021 service. The funding allowed us to have a professional traffic management service, the sound & lighting team as well as a professional photographer for the event, some images are included at the end of this report.

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Ordinary General Meeting Tuesday 20th April 2021

Council received an address from the Chair of the Audit Committee, Mr Russell Anderson, who set a valuable framework for Council as it finalises its Shire Plan and Budget deliberations for 2021-22. Mr Anderson highlighted areas that will require particular focus and attention in the coming period. These are the prescriptive and onerous impacts of the new *Local Government Act 2019* and its attendant regulations that come into force from 1st July 2021; future boundary reform and Council's preparedness to review service provision; the increasing competitive grants environment; and as grant and subsidy funding reduces the need to ensure Council has a sound Business Plan, Risk Framework and prudent financial management to ensure its future sustainability.

Key items of business that were dealt with by Council were;

- Policy Updates the Corporate Credit Card and Council Professional Development and Extra Meeting Allowances policies were discussed and approved. Council agreed not to proceed with allocating an extra meeting allowance;
- Local Government Elections Council resolved to offer electors the opportunity for "on the day" polling. At the 2017 election, only early voting was available with no election day polling. This year, Council will work with NTEC to provide a voting facility on Saturday 28th August 2021 in Batchelor Township. Arrangements will be made to provide Community Bus

 Myrtle Fawcett Park – Council decided to amend the location of the shade structure and swing set and it will be located adjacent to Becker Street;

- Batchelor Swimming Pool a new program of swimming lessons, provided in partnership with Royal Life Saving NT will be developed and offered to patrons in the coming months;
- Waste Management Facilities the contract to supply and install tanks, pumps and septic
 systems at the two waste facilities was awarded to Stockwell Water and Gas Pty Ltd. This is
 one of the final tasks to support the operations of the new Gatehouses at the facilities.
 Council will advertise the tender soon for the supervisions of the gatehouses and it is hoped
 this will become fully operational from 1st July 2021.

The next meeting of Council is Tuesday 18^h May 2021.

The bar and kitchen will be open and free, unpowered camping available. So we look forward to seeing you all for a great opening night!!


Adelaide River Race Cup 5 JUNE 2021



COUNCIL INFORMATION

DOGS IN THE COOMALIE SHIRE

All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered.


You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or Adelaide River or via

email.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any public area otherwise they will be impounded.

Fees apply if your dog has been put in the pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$90.00 for registered dogs and \$165.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$60.00 per day kept in Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days. Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the pound.
