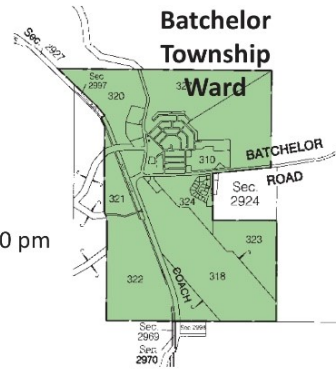

COUNCIL UPDATES

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Council held its Ordinary General Meeting on Tuesday 19th October 2021 at the new time of 3.00pm. There was a considerable amount of business to attend to as some matters had been held over during the caretaker period and the inauguration meeting of Council.

As the Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements are required to be presented to the Minister and Grants Commissioner by 15th November in any given year, it is customary for Council's Audit Committee and Auditor to meet during October 2021.

Council's appointed Auditor, Nexia Edwards Marshall, provided Council with a presentation on the Audited Financial Statements for the Year Ending 30th June 2021. Council also endorsed the Annual Report 2020 – 2021 and a copy of the report and statements can be accessed here:

Copies will also be available at the Council Office and through the Adelaide River and Batchelor Community Libraries.

A new President and a new format to the agenda was also introduced. President Sharon Beswick presented her inaugural Presidents Report and this will become a regular addition each month. The report generated a good deal of discussion and Council agreed to a number of initiatives. In the spirit of ongoing professional development, Elected Members agreed to accept an invitation from the Lord Mayor of Darwin and attend a City of Darwin Council Meeting to observe their procedures and protocols. In addition, in order to engage more effectively with the community, Council requested the Chief Executive Officer prepare a report for the next meeting with suggestions regarding community engagement activities and events.

Council also needed to consider the nature and timing of the Batchelor Ward By-Election. As reported in last month's edition, former Clr. Deb Moyle resigned from Council triggering a By-Election. The By-Election will be conducted by the NT Electoral Commissioner on Saturday 20th November 2021. There will be on the day voting at the Batchelor Outdoor Education Centre and early and postal voting options available also. Key items of business were:

- By-Laws – the Drafting Instructions to broaden and strengthen Council's By-Laws were approved. The creation of new By-Laws is a lengthy legal process and the community will be consulted in the coming months when the first Draft of the new By-Laws has been prepared by Parliamentary Counsel;
- Road Hierarchy Classification System – Council approved the new strategy that will inform future maintenance and funding applications;
- Accessibility, Connectivity and Mobility Strategy – Council welcomed the approach to connect up pedestrian and cycle pathways in the townships but also asked Officers to consider walkways and laneways in the townships. As a result, the strategy will be brought back to Council's November meeting for further consideration;
- Funding Opportunities – Council agreed to submit applications for sealing three kilometres of Haynes Road, Adelaide River and for the construction of footpaths in Adelaide River and Batchelor and develop a proposal to prepare a Business case for the Darwin to Adelaide River Rail Trail. In addition, it accepted an additional \$104,000 in funding through the WaRM Program for continued improvements to the two waste facilities;
- Representation – Council also nominated previous and current Elected Members to the Batchelor Division of the Development Consent Authority in addition to community member Mr Richard Luxton, nominated President Sharon Beswick to represent LGANT on the NT Heritage Council and resolved for Clr Colin Freeman to attend the LGANT GM and AGM in Alice Springs (at his own expense). It should be noted Clr. Freeman has been nominated to the LGANT Executive Board;
- Waste Management – there continued a good deal of discussion regarding improvements to recycling options at the waste facilities. Council also expressed concern that some members of the public are not complying with CHO Directions to sign in or use the QR Code and requested improved signage be installed.

The next Council meeting will be on Tuesday 16th November 2021 at 3.00pm. Council has also agreed to record all its meetings for minute taking purposes only.

Members of the community are welcome to attend Council meetings! COVID Safety provisions still apply, so physical distancing must be observed which may result in limiting numbers in the Chamber.

And thank you to many members of the community who joined Council at its meeting to observe from the public gallery.

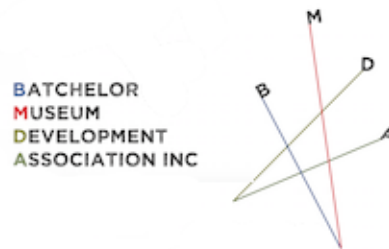

BASIC SAFETY TIPS: FLOODS

- Turn Around, Don't Drown
- Avoid walking or driving through flood waters.
- Just 60cms of moving water can knock you down, and 30cms of water can sweep your vehicle away
- If there is a chance of flash flooding, move immediately to higher ground. Flash floods are the #1 cause of weather-related deaths
- If floodwaters rise around your car but the water is not moving, abandon the car and move to higher ground. Do not leave the car and enter moving water.
- Avoid camping or parking along streams, rivers, and creeks during heavy rainfall. These areas can flood quickly and with little warning.

Despite the quietening down regarding visitation there is plenty of jobs to be done. Lucinda is continuing with again duplicating the records under a new system. Jan is developing more material.

Lucinda is trialling a new catalogue system for our collection –called Mosaic Collections. If there is someone out there who is knowledgeable about this system, or other systems, could you please get in touch.

Lucinda is here Tuesday from 10am to around 2pm or leave a message at the Museum any time.

Think about joining our group of volunteers; please talk with one of us. It does not require any special Museum skills. We would welcome some new people. Maybe talk with James Wright, at the Men’s shed or market, Sue Bulmer, or Lucinda.

It is not all work. We have social occasions; and often meet interesting visitors and make good contacts. Think on it please!

PARVO KILLS



All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered.

You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or via email.

Vaccinate your dog

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any Public Area otherwise they will be impounded.

Fees apply if your dog has been put in the Pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$95.00 for registered dogs and \$175.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$65.00 per day kept in the Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days. Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the Pound.

Dog registered between Sep - Aug FULL fee \$35.00

Dog registered between Mar - Aug PART fee \$25.00

Concession card holders ½ price.
