# **COUNCIL UPDATES**

#### FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Council entered the caretaker period on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2021 which runs until 13<sup>th</sup> September 2021. During the caretaker period, Council is still required to meet the requirements of the *Local Government Act 2019*, such as holding regular meetings and monitoring expenditure, but can not make major decisions or make long term commitments. As a result, Council's meeting in August

was brief with limited business on the agenda.

As it was Council's last meeting before the election, it was also the occasion to say thankyou to all Elected Members and to acknowledge the long service of some.

President Andrew Turner was presented the 15 Years Long Service Award.

Clr. Sue Bulmer was also presented with the 15 years Long Service Award and

Clr. Max Corliss was presented with a special letter of acknowledgement from the President of

LGANT for almost ten years of dedicated service.

The meeting also farewelled a number of retiring members who will not be contesting the next election. These are:

Please note, that weather conditions and activity, may effect planned activities during the month.



The hoist was then test run by Prue King who gave it the thumbs up, especially when it didn't dunk her!





#### TERRITORY DAY PERSONAL FIREWORKS

Council has reached an agreement with NTG Major Events Corporation contractor to enable the release of personal fireworks on Batchelor Oval.



#### **COMMUNITY NOTICEBOARD**



Whilst the Museum continues to receive good visitation the numbers have reduced somewhatinfluenced by the numbers of visitors who left following the sudden Darwin lockdown. People staying in Batchelor appreciate the offer for them to revisit next day at no extra entry charge if they want to continue. The rolling photograph collections continue to absorb interest, while most people who have been in Darwin have seen the Bombing of Darwin DVD at the Aviation Museum. The Aviation Museum enjoys huge visitor numbers. I am told there will be a new program initiative there soon.

The information re Egerton Batchelor in the museum is being reprinted onto a metal panel, black on white as most other panels. The first panels for the Museum, relating to the Batchelor Farm of 1911, were printed on Simona and are less distinctive. I changed from that recommendation with the next printing. The new panel will be relocated to a position under the photograph of Mr Batchelor so it is easier for people to view.

To my knowledge Egerton Batchelor is the only politician ever to have been invited to serve with the opposition ministry. Egerton joined the South Australia Labour party and became the leader. However, with the approval of his party, he accepted the invitation to serve as a Minister within the liberal Government of South Australia. He resigned in 1901 to stand for the Federal Parliament and was subsequently elected. He took responsibility for the Northern Territory in 1911. Northern Territory development may well have been different had he not died prematurely from a heart attack later that year.....

We are careful with water usage so when I noted the huge increase in the latest account we looked for a leak. Not any green patches obvious but the source was subsequently identified close to a building. It required removal of some concrete and therefore a jackhammer so Gary was called in and a temporary repair was made.

The seventy-plus- years pipes need to be replaced to prevent recurrence of this problem so will need to get some idea of the cost of this project. I will then seek a Grant to undertake the installation- a new task that cannot be ignored.

# **NEW NORTHERN TERRITORY SENIORS POLICY**

Acknowledging the NT has Australia's fastest-growing rate of seniors aged over 65-years, the Territory Labor Government has launched its Northern Territory Seniors Policy 2021-2026.

The Policy will guide a whole-of-government approach to revitalising pathways to services and programs for senior Territorians.

Four priority areas and a range of actions will provide future direction to address the matters of

greatest importance for our ageing population as the demand for services continues to expand.

#### Priority areas are:

- · economic participation and financial security;
- safety and security;
- · health and wellbeing; and
- social inclusion and diversity.

#### Features of the policy include:

- helping older people to remain in the work force while providing a range of services to support the increased cost of living;
- developing and stimulating private, public and affordable housing for seniors across urban,
   regional and remote locations;
- a recreation plan to help people stay healthy and active for as long as possible and initiatives around financial and social resources to maintain connections to family, friends and the community;
- improving and simplifying access to the NT Concession Scheme and NT Seniors Recognition Scheme.
- provision of easy-to-understand financial information on superannuation and retirement savings, with Aboriginal people receiving the information in their own language or having access to Aboriginal interpreter services; and
- ensuring senior Territorians can access high-quality, culturally-secure preventative healthcare and promoting, and protecting the health and wellbeing of seniors.


