COUNCIL UPDATES













FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Council held its Ordinary General Meeting on 16th August 2022. The meeting was preceded by the inaugural meeting of the Risk Management & Audit Committee (RMAC), so a very busy day for Clr. Bulmer and Clr. McClymont. RMAC has replaced the previous Internal Audit Committee. Chaired by seasoned local government and accountancy expert, Mr Ian Swan, the RMAC also has Ms Gillian Thornton as the community member. The RMAC has a broad remit to monitor and review the integrity of Council's financial management and internal controls and will meet at least four times per annum. Agenda and minutes will be available on Council's website.

The Ordinary General Meeting commenced with two important presentations. The first focused on the Tropical Biosolids Project at Sundance Farm, Batchelor. Mr Ross Finocchiaro provided Council with an inspiring and insightful presentation of innovative approaches to the management, recovery and re-use of waste water.

The second presentation included a workshop with the Elected Member group from Senior Officers from Infrastructure NT and Price WaterhouseCooper. The Northern Territory Government recently released the NT Infrastructure Strategy and this session was the next step in ensuring social and capital infrastructure projects in the region meet the community's needs and aspirations. Council contributed to the long term strategy with a number of important initiatives that will see significant developments in the areas of improved connectivity infrastructure, roads, water security, public housing, social and recreational infrastructure and initiatives that support community safety, security and wellbeing.

Matters that were resolved at the meeting included;

- LGANT Call for Motions Council requested the Chief Executive Officer prepare a submission that calls for improved emergency management and response for the region;
- Authorised Person Ms Sara Fitzgerald, Manager Works & Services was appointed an Authorised Person enabling her to enforce Council By-Laws and relevant legislation;
- Lake Bennett Community Association Inc Council received a letter from the newly formed association and agreed to invite the management committee to a future meeting;
- Overriding Statutory Charges Council also resolved to register charges against a number of
 properties that are in significant arrears. If ratepayers are experiencing financial pressures and
 are unable to meet their rates obligation, Council is always open to entering into Payment
 plans to assist. This is a reminder to contact the Council Administration office to discuss
 options available to ratepayers.

Members of the community are welcome to attend Council meetings! Public health safety measures still apply, particularly as there are virulent strains of influenza present in the community, in addition to the ever present concern of COVID-19. Responsible physical distancing will continue to be observed which may result in limiting numbers in the Chamber. The wearing of masks is a personal decision.

During the month, President Beswick and the Chief Executive Officer also attended a meeting with the Chief Minister and the local government sector to discuss community safety and options

available to address instances of anti-social behaviour and crime in communities. The meeting was well attended and included the Hon Kate Worden, MLA, Minister for Territory Families and Urban Housing, Commissioner Jamie Chalker and the Chief Executive Officers of the Department of the Chief Minister and Cabinet and the Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities.

ABNORMAL CANNOT BE THE NEW NORMAL

Local Government Association of the Northern Territory 24 August 2022

Representatives from local government councils collectively met with the Chief Minister today to discuss anti-social behaviour (ASB) across the Northern Territory.

As the sphere of government closest to the community, local government councils have a key role to play in improving the quality of life of its people and the meeting today went a long way in letting the Chief know that councils want to be part of the solution to ASB.

The meeting also talked to the need for genuine, meaningful and targeted place-based solutions to ASB that includes local government. Councils are already doing amazing things in regard to the prevention of ASB but can do more, with more.

One of the ideas mentioned today was that of co-investment, that is councils and the other two spheres of government and relevant stakeholders co-investing in important preventive initiatives such as sport, art and recreation services and infrastructure.

An important message conveyed today was that local government council staff and elected members are also dealing first-hand with the increase in ASB including personal attacks and senseless destruction of council assets which results in the cessation of services.

Local government council staff are feeling unsafe in their towns and communities, and they are finding it increasingly difficult to deliver services and employ and retain staff. Councils are also seeing the flow on effects of ASB on business and economic development.

This sentiment was summarised by the Mayor of Tiwi Islands Regional Council, Pirrawayingi, that "abnormal has become the new normal." This is not acceptable. Nor is the fix simple - but locals know the issues and often the answers.

The Local Government Association of the Northern Territory (LGANT) President, the Hon Kon Vatskalis, closed the meeting by reminding the Chief Minister that local government councils want to work with her government and the public service to reduce ASB - now councils need to see that intent returned. "Let's empower our local government councils and elected members to be part of the answer."

LGANT, the peak body representing the local government sector in the Territory, welcomes the constructive conversation and looks forward to working with the Chief Minister's office on the next steps.

SCAM ALERT

NT Consumer Affairs (NTCA) is an independent office within the Department of the Attorney-General and Justice and aims to protect consumer interests by proactively providing awareness of a range of common issues affecting consumers. This is undertaken through a number of mediums such as social media posts and videos, attending community events and supplying promotional

material through appropriate networks.

Sadly, scam activity in Australia is on the rise. The recent Australian Competition & Consumer Commission's Targeting Scams 2021 report, highlighted losses of more than \$2 billion by Australians. This staggering figure is the combined losses reported to Scamwatch, ReportCyber and 12 other financial and Government agencies. The report also shows that \$110 million was lost to phone and text scams.

NTCA has recently received an increasing number of reports from vulnerable people and other organisations about community members being targeted by scammers, particularly through phone and text scams.

In response to this ever increasing scam activity, NTCA has developed a number of posters warning vulnerable Territorians about romance and other scams. As we are limited in our ability to physically visit the many regional and remote communities in the NT, we are asking for your assistance to spread the warning of scams to our vulnerable population. We encourage your organisation to help protect Territorians by actively displaying these posters and if possible, warning people about scams.

GREY PANTHERS WITH AUSTRALIAN BALLET




What a thrill to have artists of this calibre doing a workshop just for us as Grey Panthers. I had a ball at the



Council Meetings
