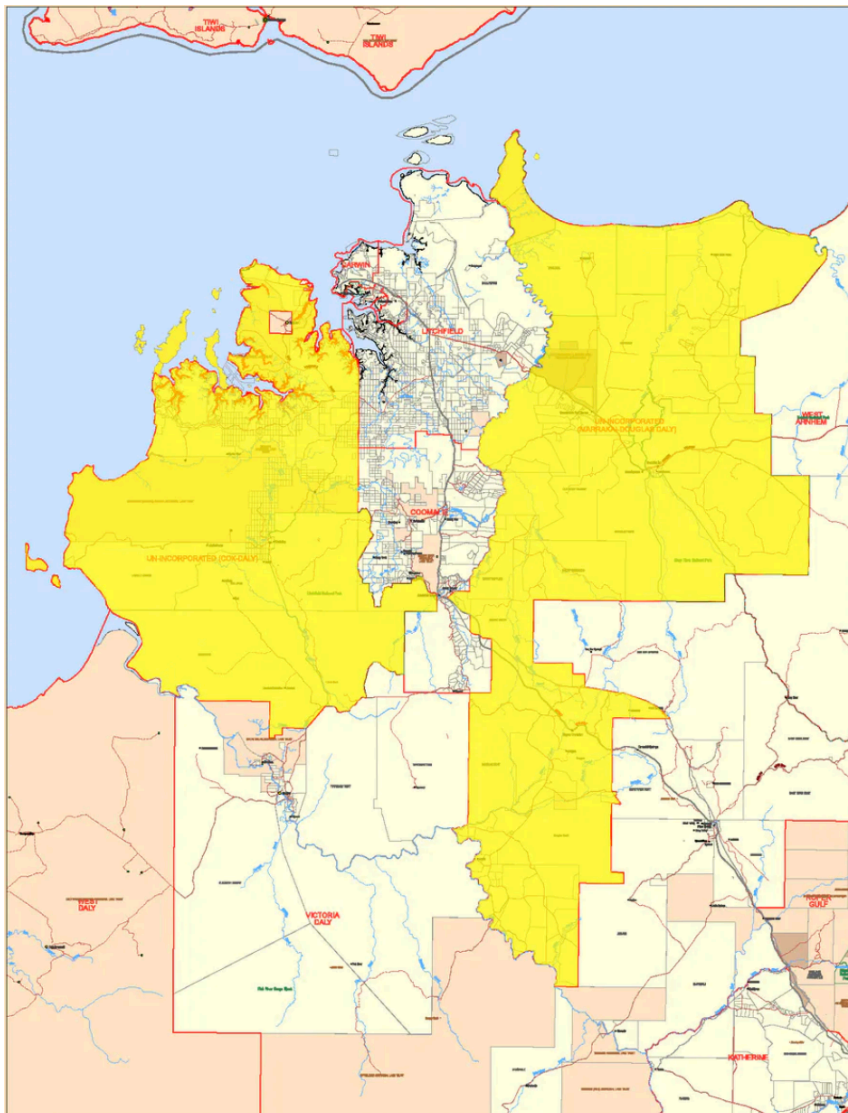

COUNCIL UPDATES

FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

It has and will be an incredibly busy time for Council. Looking ahead, Council will focus over the next two months in developing the 2022-23 Annual Budget and deliberate the Rates Declaration. Council will consult widely on the proposed 2022-23 Draft Budget and the Draft Shire Plan.

The Department of the Chief Minister and Cabinet also launched the consultation on the Incorporation of Unincorporated Areas on 23rd March 2022. This will affect Coomalie Shire. Council is meeting with the Department and consulting with adjacent councils and communities in the unincorporated areas to discuss Council's views and position. Council is also working with Belyuen Community Government Council to revisit the previous amalgamation proposal. Have your say - <https://haveyoursay.nt.gov.au/cox-daly-and-marrakia-douglas-daly>



The Waste Advisory Committee will hold its third meeting in early April to discuss with consultants EcOz and True North Strategic Communication the outcomes of the community consultation. This is an important step in the development of the Waste Management Strategy for the Shire. Council thanks everyone who participated in the consultation process, attended the consultation sessions at the waste facilities and Adelaide River and Batchelor Stores and completed the survey.

Council places notices on consultation opportunities on its website, Facebook and noticeboards in Adelaide River and Batchelor as well as within these pages. If you are not certain of an upcoming opportunity, please contact the friendly staff at the Council office or your local Elected Member.

Details are available on Council's website.

And it has also been a very busy time in the Chamber. Key matters that were discussed and decisions made include:

- Free Entry to the Batchelor Swimming Pool has been extended until 30th June 2022;
- Council is working with the Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade (DITT) on a number of initiatives including stocking Rum Jungle lake with fishstock for recreation, the Rehabilitation of the Rum Jungle former mine site and discussions regarding the proposed AROWS development;
- Grant Funding opportunities including improvements to Haynes Road, Adelaide River and Strickland Road, Stapleton and improvements to the footpath networks in Adelaide River and Batchelor; and
- Additional road improvement projects for inclusions in the NT Infrastructure Strategic Framework paper.

Council also held a Cemetery Board Meeting in March and resolved to consider further upgrades for shade and all weather cover as part of the new Budget and requested a Landscaping plan be developed for the Coomalie Bush Cemetery.

Members of the community are welcome to attend Council meetings! COVID Safety provisions still apply, so physical distancing must be observed which may result in limiting numbers in the Chamber. The wearing of masks is a personal decision.

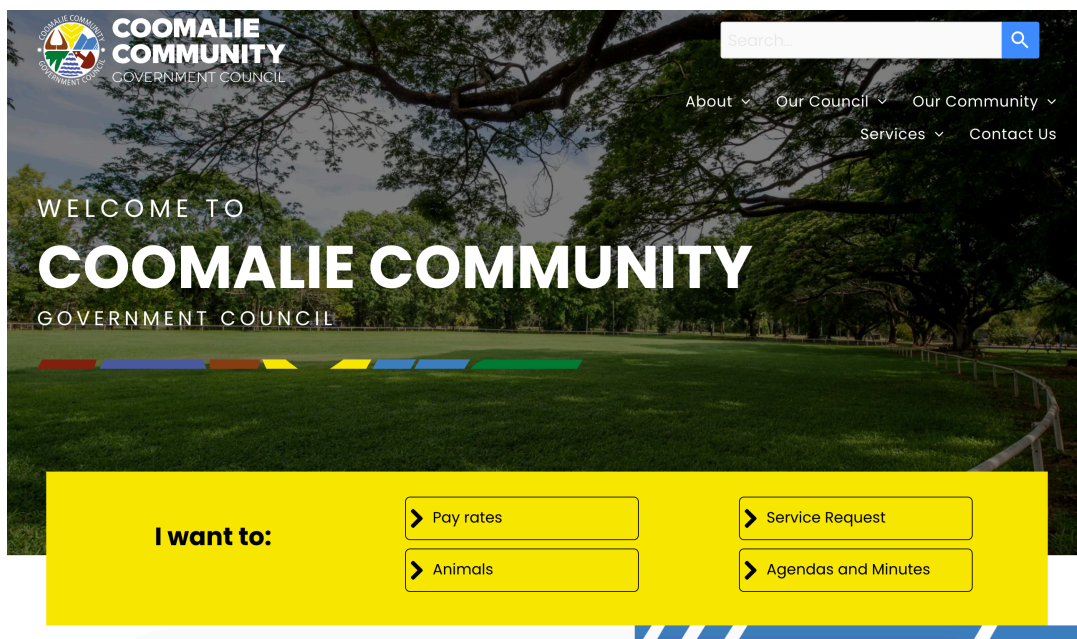
The bus is free, however guests are expected to pay entry costs as well as meals and drinks themselves.

WEEDS IN COOMALIE

Weeds in Coomalie

Star Burr Weed (*Acanthospermum hispidum*)
has been detected in Adelaide River.



This weed can be easily treated with Glyphosate poison whilst actively growing. Mowing of the plant prior to burr growth can assist also.

GAMBA PROTECTION ZONE

There are new requirements for the management and control of gamba grass under the

Weed Management Plan for GAMBA GRASS

2020 – 2030

The requirements are that, for all properties, you must have a 15m gamba grass free buffer around land parcel boundaries, around infrastructure and on both sides of the track into your property.

For properties less than 3 hectares (7.4 acres), land owners/occupiers must destroy all gamba by July 2023.

For the larger blocks, you must be actively reducing your gamba infestations year on year.

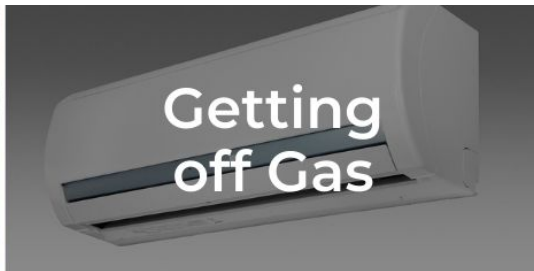

Reduce your organisation's carbon footprint with an electric vehicle without ever being out of pocket!

You can greatly reduce the climate impact of your essential travel by switching to electric next time you need to buy a new vehicle. Electric vehicles cost more to buy but have lower running costs than petrol/diesel alternatives, saving funds and the climate in the long run. In 2022 several new models of electric vehicle are scheduled for release, including delivery vans, making them a viable option for many organisations.

Where the higher purchase cost can still be a barrier, CORENA can help. CORENA offers non-profit (or similar) organisations:

- Interest-free loans and technical advice to assist with electric vehicle and charging infrastructure purchases;
- With the quarterly loan repayment amount set to fall within expected savings on running costs. In the short term most of your savings will go on loan repayments, but once the loan is repaid you will be spending less on essential travel.

How it works

If you decide you want a CORENA loan to help pay for an electric vehicle, the first step is to submit an expression of interest through our website. This is considered by the CORENA committee and if successful CORENA will work with you to find a suitable vehicle and appropriate charging infrastructure. We will promote the project on our website and if recurring donations and loan repayments from earlier projects are not sufficient to cover the cost we will start fundraising for your loan amount.

What is CORENA?

CORENA is a non-profit organisation run mainly by volunteers. As of February 2022, we have supported 45 climate projects which have cumulatively avoided 2,804.57 MWh of grid electricity (equivalent to power 223.7 average homes). We are now expanding into providing loans for electric vehicles and for replacing gas appliances with efficient electric options. We use those new donations and recent loan repayments from earlier projects to give you a loan to cover your project costs, or to make up the shortfall if you have partial funding from other sources. We also provide independent technical advice so that you can be sure your project is right for you.

To date, CORENA has supported 45 climate projects which have cumulatively avoided 2,804.57 MWh of grid electricity (equivalent to powering 223.7 average homes).

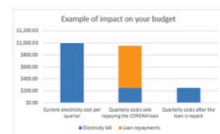

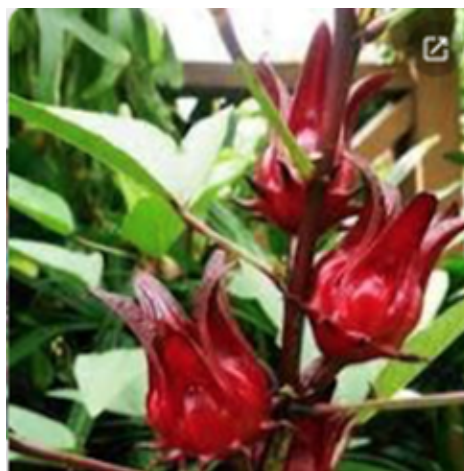

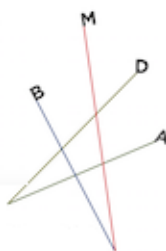
Adeladie River Community Craft Markets

The heavy rainfalls have livened up the Tamarind trees in the grounds, which is really good as they had been affected by the lower rainfall over the past few years. We will provide more nutritive supplement for them and water them in the Dry so hopefully the new growth will flourish.

On Tuesday 8th February several of us tackled the overgrowth in the garden area adjoining the big drain along Tarkarri Road. James sawed the mahogany trees which were already three or four foot high, and the stumps were then poisoned. Gamba grass and many other weeds were removed and we will try to stay ahead of regrowth in the remaining rainy season.

I have been trying to locate an artist from Warrai or Kungarakan people who could paint a mural on the front of the building fronting Mardango Crescent. There are available experienced Aboriginal artists who could assist with this type of presentation if such help was needed.

We do have an opportunity to fund this long-awaited mural so If interested please be in touch as soon as possible to talk about this important presentation. Also it is an opportunity to become involved in the street-art scene.

Lucinda and I are at the Museum Tuesdays until 2pm or so; or leave your contact details with Gaye at the Museum.

We will have a house-keeping exercise before the start of the Tourism season to counter the cobwebs and dust build-up to be ready late March for some pre-booked visitors. We expect tourism will increase from Easter onwards.

As we have new displays I know previous visitors who regularly return, will be pleased.. There are several Rum Jungle people who have indicated they will return in this year-such is their great memories of living in Batchelor and working in that mining era.



All dogs within the Coomalie



Region over 3 months of age must be registered.

You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or via email.

Vaccinate your dog

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any Public Area otherwise they will be impounded.

Fees apply if your dog has been put in the Pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$95.00 for registered dogs and \$175.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$65.00 per day kept in the Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days. Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the Pound.

Dog Registration Charges

Town and Rural - Registration period Sep - Aug

Dog registered between Sep - Aug FULL fee \$35.00

Dog registered between Mar - Aug PART fee \$25.00

Concession card holders ½ price.
