Council hosted an Australian Citizenship Ceremony on Tuesday 19th May 2026, and I would like to again welcome our newest citizen in the Coomalie Shire.

As we enter the dry season, many of the regular events across the Shire have resumed. It has been a welcome change of season and is fantastic to see the community out and about at various events.

At Council's May Ordinary General Meeting, Councillors endorsed a Community Engagement Plan for 2026/27 and this will guide how the Elected Members actively participate in meaningful engagement opportunities with constituents throughout the Shire. Of course, all residents are welcome to reach out to Elected Members with queries at any time throughout the year and we welcome the opportunity to chat and address matters as items arise.

Council continues to deliberate on the drafting of the 2026/27 Shire Plan and Budget with the intention of reviewing a draft to release for public consultation within the next two weeks. FROM THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Council held the Ordinary General Meeting (OGM) on 19th May 2026. The business considered is detailed below:

- Council endorsed a Community Engagement Plan for 2026/27. Your Elected Members are there for you to contact and discuss your questions or concerns.
- Council voted to give artists more time to get creative and are trialling having the Art Show every second year. The theme for the 2027 Art Show will be “Coomalie Bush and Beyond” and will be open to all in the Top End.
- Council determined to trial coordinating an entire community Christmas Celebration, with the intention of incorporating several existing events into a combined community activity. Watch this space for more updates.
- Road upgrades were discussed, including Munz Road, Chinner Road and various other roads throughout the Shire.
- The meeting day and time for Council’s OGM was changed. The new day will be the third Saturday of each month, commencing at 10:00am. OGM’s are open to the public and all are welcome to attend to watch.

Prior to the May OGM, an Australian Citizenship Ceremony was held. It was lovely to see our new Australian celebrating with her family, children and friends.

2025/2026 Property Rates

Free to Residents

Domestic quantities of mulch can be collected from the Batchelor Waste Management Facility. Commercial quantities are available at \$33 a cubic metre.

Please note that if you require machinery assistance to load the mulch, there is an additional cost to hire. You must also pre-book a collection time to hire equipment. Please contact the Council Office to book.

Weeds in Coomalie

Cabomba

Scientific name: *Cabomba caroliniana*

Declaration status: [Class A](#)

Cabomba is a Weed of National Significance. For more information, go to the [Weeds Australia website](#).

Cabomba is native to the Americas, but has been used extensively in the aquarium industry.

Discarded aquarium contents were probably the cause of the only 2 infestations in the Northern Territory (NT), found in:

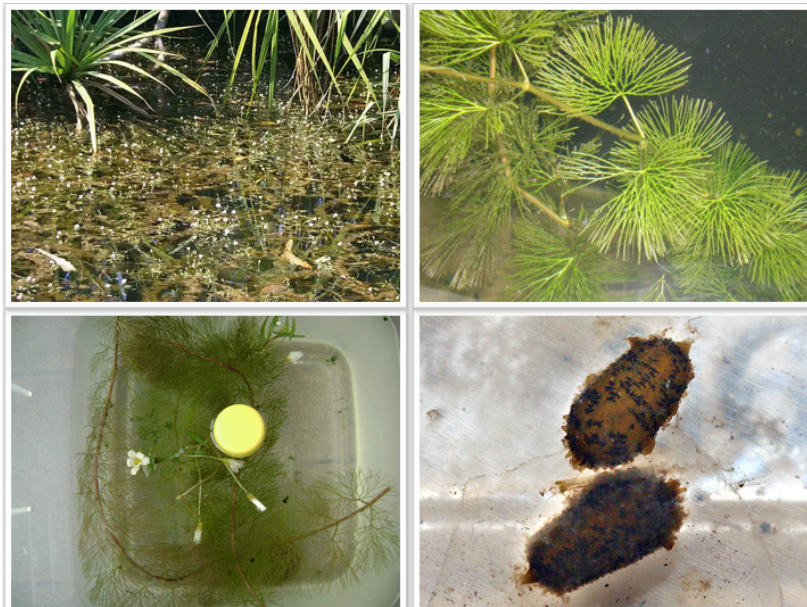
1996 at Marlow Lagoon (eradicated)

2004 at Darwin River (under monitoring towards eradication).

Cabomba likes to grow in slow moving or stagnant water bodies with silty soil.

This means that billabongs and floodplain areas would be highly susceptible to cabomba if it were to establish more widely in the NT.

Annual renewal of Dog Registrations

Dog registrations are due for renewal from 1 September 2026.

Please ensure your animal details are up to date and that registrations are renewed annually.

Registration period: **1 September – 31 August.**

ANIMAL SAFETY IS A MUST!

Council has identified a rise in cases of ehrlichiosis, heartworm, intestinal worms, and parvovirus within Batchelor township.

These diseases can be serious and, in some cases, fatal. If your pet shows any signs of illness, please contact your local veterinarian immediately.

As Territory Day is fast approaching, Council Rangers would like to remind the community of the following:

- Create a safe space for your animal
- Avoid taking your animals outside on cracker night
- Ensure all fencing is secure
- Update your dog's details with Council
- Speak to your vet about medication if your animal struggles with stress and anxiety
- Know the signs of stress, including panting, pacing, hiding, and trembling.

GAMBA ACTION PROGRAM

The program has now concluded for the 2025–2026 round. Council would like to thank the community for the strong uptake of chemical supplies to help control and prevent the spread of Gamba Grass.

Create a safe indoor space with familiar bedding and toys.



Never take your dog to fireworks displays.



Ensure all gates, doors and fences are secure.



Update details with Council to ensure a speedy reunion if your dog does escape



Exercise early in the day.



Stay calm and provide comfort if your dog is anxious. Speak with your vet about medication.



Close curtains and play calming music to mask loud noises.



Know the signs of stress: panting, pacing, hiding or trembling.

The 2026 Census is happening this August and every answer matters

The next Census is on Tuesday 11 August 2026.

The Census is a snapshot of Australia's people and housing, and tells the story of how we are changing. Census data helps governments, community groups and businesses plan services for individuals, families and communities, where and when they are needed.

Every household and person in Australia on Census night must be included on a Census form, including visitors to Australia, international students and babies.

Instructions on how to complete the Census will be delivered to households from late July. If you know where you'll be on Census night, you can complete your Census as soon as you receive your instructions. You can complete online, by paper, or with help from the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

The information you provide in the Census is confidential and protected by law. Your information is not shared with anyone, including other government agencies.

In the Census, every answer matters to help us understand what Australia needs now and into the future.

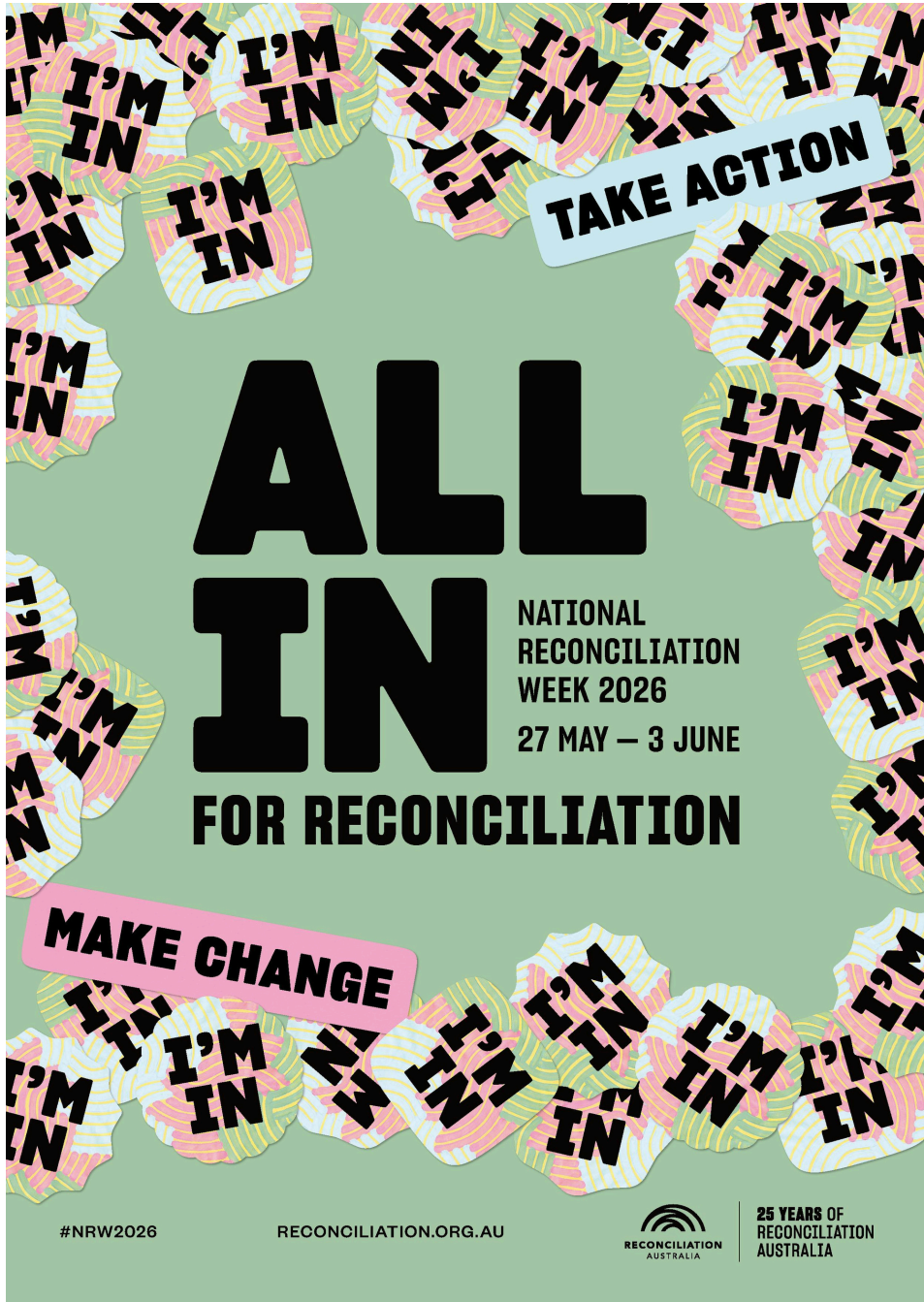

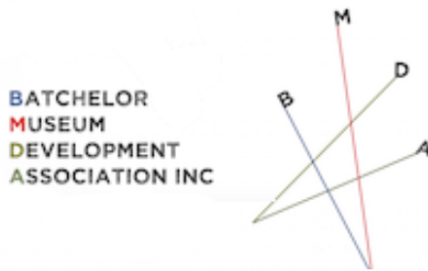

Whilst there are certainly travellers around, the Highway is not carrying the number of caravans that we saw around in past years. So though we are getting visitors through the Museum the numbers are well down.

In any case we are open daily and happy to greet those who do come by. Simon has stayed on and has made a great difference to the garden areas whilst here. Now Ritchie is doing the mowing which has been a big task to do with only a hand mower. Simon has cleared the drain of weeds along the Museum boundary, so it is tidy for now. Caretaker Linda has persevered to start up the coffee machine which was acquired when Denise ran the area some years ago. So when Linda is here brewed coffee is available. There will be a group from Darwin coming to view the Museum next week and that has the benefit of people talking about their visit to people in Darwin who may not know about it. The Nightcliff Evergreens group will come by bus.

I have written some descriptions to go with a few small displays--the Mac Arthur jigsaw; the cut-off spade for a specific digging purpose at 4RSU camp; and about Brian Winspear.

Brian was a service- man who experienced the bombing of Darwin in February 1942 and returned to be present at the commemoration ceremony at Darwin in 2022. He also came down to a service at Adelaide River the next day as some people may recall.

We are intending at this time to accumulate a number of signage pieces so that we will then apply for a Grant to have them printed. So amongst many interruptions and doing the various tasks that arise from managing a registered organisation there is still development.

Thank you to our various Museum volunteers; to Prue for managing the bookstall at the Markets and which raises funds for the Museum. To Darryl for managing the Facebook page.

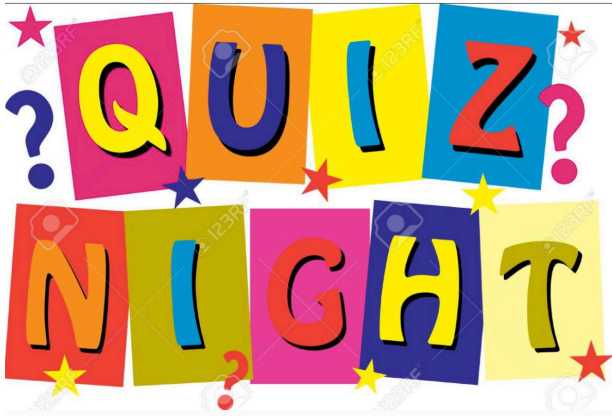
