From The President



Council held its Risk and Audit Committee Meeting this month, chaired for the first time by our newly appointed Chairperson, Robert Annis-Brown. Robert brings extensive experience in local government and strong financial management expertise, and Council is pleased to welcome him to the team.

Sincere thanks are extended to outgoing Chair, Ian Swan, for his leadership and commitment to Coomalie over the past three years; his time, guidance and wise advice have been greatly appreciated. We also farewell our independent committee member, Maxie Smith, who has moved to the Tiwi Islands. Council will consider the appointment of a new independent member at the December Council Meeting.

The Risk Management and Audit Committee was followed by a Special Meeting of Council to receive the 2024–2025 Annual Report and independently audited Financial Statements. The Auditor advised both the Committee and Council that Council is in a sound financial position and issued an unqualified audit opinion.

The scheduling of Council's Ordinary General Meeting was disrupted due to the emergency management arrangements in place as Cyclone Fina approached the Top End. Fortunately, Coomalie residents remained safe and largely unaffected, with only some localised flooding and a small number of downed trees. The Ordinary General Meeting has been rescheduled to 27 November 2005, and community members are warmly invited to attend in the gallery.

I look forward to seeing you at Council or out and about in the community. Please stay safe and drive to the conditions.

- Wet season maintenance




Wet Season Weight Restrictions

With the official start of the wet season now upon us, weight restrictions are now in force on all Council roads.

Restrictions are:

- 20 tonne on sealed roads
- 10 tonne unsealed roads.

To move a vehicle that is outside these restrictions, you must first seek approval from Council. The application form for this can be downloaded from Council's website here



Weeds in Coomalie

Gamba Grass

Scientific name: Andropogon gayanus

Declaration status: class A except in areas where it's classified as class B

Gamba grass is a Weed of National Significance. For more information on weeds in Australia, go to the Weeds Australia website.

Impact

Gamba is a highly invasive weed that creates high fuel loads. It can cause uncontrollable, hot and intense fires that affect people, properties and communities. Read about gamba's <u>origin</u>, <u>habitat and distribution</u>.

Legal Requirements

If you're a landholder with gamba grass on your land, find out your legal <u>responsibilities</u>. For annual reporting against the plan, go to the <u>Department of Lands, Planning and Environment website</u>.

Identification

Use the below characteristics as a guide to help you identify gamba grass. There may be other plants or weeds that look similar. Tussocks can grow to 4m high and up to 70cm in diameter. Stem and branches are robust and covered in dense, soft white hairs.

Leaves are broad and can grow up to 1m, have a distinctive white midrib and fine soft hairs, stay green after native annual grasses have died off.

Seed heads are v-shaped and fluffy, develop above the leaves on thick stems.



From the Ranger

ANIMAL SAFETY IS A MUST!

Keeping all animals safe, from cats to dogs, cattle to goats and everything in between is Council Rangers number one priority.

We work closely with Animal Welfare and the Police to ensure all animals within the Coomalie region are cared for, safe and loved.

As the weather changes, from heat waves to storms, Rangers would like to remind the community of some key responsibilities:

- Animals need to be protected from all-weather types by having plenty of shade and secure shelters,
- Have access to plenty of clean fresh water,
- Animals need to be fed daily and as we approach wet season, please ensure you have plenty of animal feed available at home in case of a power outage or flooding,
- Identification- all animals need to have identification tags on them, this will ensure that if they get lost, they can be returned to the owner in a timely manner once found,
- Appropriate fencing to reduce your animals fleeing in the wet season storms, please ensure your yards are secure or your animals are caged.

During the wet season, this is when parasites and viruses are most active and your animals are most prone to them, Council sees a high volume of Parvovirus, Itchy Skin and Ehrlichiosis within our community, to reduce these numbers; owners need to ensure the following:

- Animals are up to date on their vaccinations
- Flea and Tick collars to be worn and replaced once expired
- Medicated washes on itchy skin
- Worming dogs to be done monthly during the wet and every 3 months during the dry.

If you have any worries or concern regarding your animal's health, please contact your local vet practice.



ANIMAL BY-LAW BREACHES

Council is receiving a high number of dog complaints; we work within our Coomalie (Dog Management) Bylaws 2002.

Animal owners may receive a breach of by-law notice, and dogs may be impounded if found to be guilty of breaching the by-laws.

WET SEASON REMINDERS

As the wet season approaches, Council would like to remind the community of the following:

- Yards need to be frequently mowed,
- Overgrown vegetation needs to be removed,
- Gamba Grass needs to be dealt with accordingly,
- Projectile objects need to be secure,
- Do NOT Park vehicles on Councils grassed road verges.

Council will be doing weekly inspections of both Townships and overgrown property and waste on road reserve notices will be issued accordingly.

DOG REGISTRATIONS

If you have not renewed your dog/s registrations since 1st September 2025, your dog will currently be unregistered with Council, please ensure all registrations are up to date.

50% discount applies to concession card holders.

50% discount applies to desexed animals.

Only one discount can be used at one time.

Desexing certificates or concession cards need to be provided to enable a discount.

If your dog is caught roaming in the public realm including being unleashed while walking, Council Rangers have the right to impound your animal.


