Vision

The Community of Saint Gabriel strives to be a welcoming and dynamic Roman Catholic community with the Eucharist at the center of parish life. By sharing our spirituality, we are united through prayer and action in the service of God, reaching out to those in need in our community and beyond.

Mission

St. Gabriel Parish proclaims Christ, makes disciples and glorifies God through the Eucharist and Sacraments. All are welcomed to promote God's glory. Our faith is anchored in prayer and Sacraments of the Church; nurturing the faith of all, supporting the sick, supporting those in need, and looking outward with a concern for justice and peace.

A Brief History of the Parish...

In 1997, with the expansion of western Chesterfield County and with the large number of families attending neighboring parishes, a plan was developed to open a new parish. The late Bishop Walter Sullivan chose Rev. John DeGiorgio; the pastor of the Church of the Redeemer in Mechanicsville; to start this new parish. He met with a small group of the Churches of the Epiphany and St. Edward the Confessor families who were eager to build a Catholic Church right in their own backyard.

Masses started at Clover Hill Elementary School on Aug. 2, 1997 with about 400 families. Bishop Sullivan wanted to honor the three Archangels by naming parishes after them. Our parish selected St. Gabriel and was able to move to its present location in June of 2001.

Rev. Pasquale (Pat) Apuzzo came to the parish as administrator during Advent of 2002. He became the pastor in March of 2003. In June of 2006, the parish dedicated its Prayer Memorial Garden in front of the church. In September of 2006, the offices were moved from their previous location on Route 360 near Chesterfield Berry Farm to the present onsite location behind the church. Fr. Pat retired in July 2013.

Rev. Eric Ayers served as pastor of St. Gabriel and Good Samaritan Parishes from July 2013-July 2017. Under his direction the parish retired its debt from the first phase of building and enhanced the current multipurpose space that serves as our sanctuary.

Rev. Dr. Felix Amofa became pastor in July 2017. Under his direction, the parish of over 1,100 families celebrated both our 20th and 25th anniversaries and began a feasibility study for facilities growth at the parish.

In July 2024, Rev. James Boachie was appointed as administrator and seeks to guide the parish forward in spiritual growth and service to the community. July 2025 he was appointed as pastor.

Staying true to the mission on which St. Gabriel was founded, parishioners announce the Good News alive today through the commitment to be a parish of welcome and hospitality through the stewardship of their gifts. Through worship, outreach, formation, compassion and forgiveness, the community is called to pause and reflect on their relationship with God and one another as they live the Gospel each day of their lives. The call for full and active participation in the life of the parish is at the foundation of our life as a community of faith.

To set up your recurring donation:

3. input your dollar amount
4. click on the recurrence time (weekly, bi-weekly, monthly)
5. you can do more than one fund by clicking on "+ Add Donation"
6. input how you would like to donate, credit/debit card or bank account
7. input your payment information
8. submit

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

OCIA/OCIC (RCIA) – The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) and children (OCIC) is the process for those ages 7 and older, who have not been baptized, of becoming full and active members of the Catholic Church. The process begins with inquiry no later than September and culminates in the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

Rite of Full Communion – Offered year-round, this Rite is for adults already baptized in another Christian tradition who are seeking reception into the Catholic Church. This rite is also for Catholics who need to complete their sacraments of initiation (Confirmation, First Eucharist). Children and youth between 3rd and 12th grade will prepare through the sacramental prep listed below.

Infant/Child Baptism – Preparation includes regular, active participation in the life of the parish; attendance at the Baptism preparation class focused on the history and theology of Baptism and what it means to raise a child to follow Christ as a Roman Catholic. Sponsors/godparents must attend baptismal preparation prior to the baptismal celebration here or online.

First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation:

All children and youth preparing for sacraments need a foundation in faith formation.

Preparation for the sacraments is done in addition to ongoing faith formation appropriate to the grade level of the candidate for the sacrament.

- **1st Reconciliation** - For ages seven and older and in second grad or higher, there are two Sunday afternoon sessions in the preparation program. The sacrament will be celebrated on a Saturday morning in February.
- **1st Eucharist** - For ages seven and older and in second grad or higher, there are two Sunday afternoon sessions in the preparation program. The sacrament will be celebrated at a special Mass in May. The child needs to have received First Reconciliation beforehand.
- **Confirmation** – For tenth grade and higher, 15 years old or older. There are eight sessions in the preparation program. In addition, the youth need to attend a retreat and need to have received First Reconciliation and First Eucharist prior to Confirmation.

Marriage – Weddings cannot be scheduled before a couple meets with the pastor or deacon. Couples should contact the parish office for an appointment at least one year in advance of their wedding.

Religious Vocation– Young women or men who are interested in dedicating their life to religious life should contact the pastor through the parish office.

Anointing of the Sick - This sacrament is best celebrated outside a hospital setting. You can receive the sacrament at Friday morning mass or request an anointing. Contact the parish

office for arrangements or, in an emergency, call the office number (639-6712) after hours for the emergency number.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

Children's Formation (Pre-K through 5th Grade)

We foster life-long faith formation at St. Gabriel's and seek to establish its importance at an early age. In partnership with the parents as our children's primary faith formation teachers, our monthly faith formation program begins in Pre-kindergarten and carries through the grade levels using a spiraling curriculum. We also offer a fun and faith-filled Vacation Bible School in early summer. With a dual focus on developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and understanding of the Catholic faith the goal is a formation program that culminates in full and active participation in the Church. The curriculum covers age-appropriate Catholic doctrine combined with fellowship and social justice outreach. We also provide support to parents through online resources and emails to help bring the lessons your children share in their faith formation sessions into the home where it can have the most impact in your children's lives. Classes are held monthly.

Youth Formation (Middle and High School)

Building upon the children's formation program, the youth faith formation focuses on four areas: building their relationship with Jesus Christ, catechesis, social justice and forming a Christian community in partnership with parents as their youth's primary faith teachers. Each monthly session for our middle and high school youth holds engaging and dynamic activities that reinforce Catholic doctrine and build relationship with Christ, along with fun, fellowship and worship opportunities for our youth. Both the middle and high school programs feature a retreat to create an environment that fosters Christian community and empowers the youth to be active participants in their faith life. Classes are held monthly.

Adult Formation Opportunities

- **Spirituality Groups** – Two groups are offered for men and women in the parish during the school year. Designed to help deepen faith through speakers, study, prayer and fellowship, consider taking the time to focus on your faith formation and strengthen the ties in your community. Registration begins in August, but you can join at any time. Meets Sept. – May.
 - Fishermen** – A men’s group that meets every Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m.
 - WINGS** – Women in God’s Spirit meet 1st and 3rd Wednesdays from 9:45 – 11:45 a.m.
- **ROCK- Raising Our Catholic Kids** –These gatherings are designed to help you meet the challenges parents face today to raise our children in the faith. Connect with other parents in the parish and to the greater community and be supported you in the best and most challenging vocation you have – being a parent.
 - **Parents of PRE-K– 5th Graders:** Sundays, 3-5 pm on Jan. 31, Feb. 7, March 21, & April 11
 - **Parents of Middle Schoolers and High Schoolers:** Tues., 6:30 p.m. on Oct. 13, Nov. 10, Jan. 12, Feb. 9 & March 9
- **Bible Study** - Exploring the Bible can be a rich experience but daunting to do on your own. This study meets Friday mornings except first Fridays and during Lent, 9:45 a.m.– 11:45 a.m. in the Commons. Various studies are examined throughout the year, September – May.
- **Lectionary Study** - Based on Sunday Readings, this study is both a prayerful and insightful exploration of the Word we hear at Mass. Meets weekly Tuesday evenings, 7 – 9:00 p.m. September – May.
- **Couples in Christ** – It doesn’t matter if you are newly married or a “seasoned” couple, with kids or without, both Catholic or not; all married couples are welcome. Four to seven Couples meet monthly in a host home to share potluck, fellowship, and spiritual enrichment to aid in your discipleship as a couple.
- **Reflection and Recreation (R&R) Wednesdays** – Open to all parishioners, this group meets on the 2nd Wednesday of each month, Sept. – June to receive spiritual guidance on a topic of choice and then participate in fellowship and fun with games like bingo, cards, trivia and so much more.
- **Resource Library** - Open when the building is, the Resource Library in the Commons offers books ranging from spirituality to biographies, from the Bible, to parenting and so much more, you are sure to find something that will help you in your spiritual growth. Books are on loan until you can return them. Donations are welcome. *NOTE: There are children’s books available outside the worship space entrance for use during Mass. These must be returned after Mass.*

- **Praying Hands Prayer Shawl Ministry** – Praying Hands ministry members knit and crochet for those in need. All items are blessed and prayerfully given in times of joy and sorrow. Projects include baby blankets, prayer shawls and squares, hats and lap blankets. Items are donated to hospitals, parishioners, the military and homeless, so they can feel the warm embrace of God's love. New ministry members are always welcome.
- **Homebound and Hospital Ministry** – This beautiful outreach to those who are homebound or hospitalized brings Christ in the form of the Holy Eucharist and in the minister to those in need of that healing presence. If you or someone you love would like communion brought to them, or if you would like to join the ministry, just let us know.

WORSHIP/LITURGY

Altar Server - Post-First Communion age through adults to assist the priest and assembly at Mass.

Arts and Environment - Help create a prayerful environment and assist with seasonal décor.

Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist – Distribute the Eucharistic body and blood at Liturgy.

Linen and Vestment Laundering - A team takes turns laundering purificators, altar cloths and washable vestments.

Minister of the Word (Lectors) - Proclaim the scriptures at Mass and other Liturgies.

Music Ministry –enhance the sung and instrumental prayer of the assembly at Mass and other Liturgies.

Usher – Adults and teens to assist parishioners with seating, basket distribution, greet parishioners before and after Mass, distribute materials and meeting needs of the parishioners during our Liturgy.

CHRISTIAN CARE

Homebound and Hospital Ministry- Bring Communion to homebound parishioners and/or to Catholics at Johnston-Willis Hospital

Praying Hands Ministry – Create Prayer Shawls and other gift items for those in need or bereaved.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Food Pantry and Food Weekend - Store and distribute food to the needy and assist with monthly food collection.

Migrant Ministry – Adults to reach out to the migrants in our area in the summer with pastoral support and outreach.

PB & J Bag Lunches for the Homeless – Prepare at parish monthly in the kitchen after the 11 am Mass on Sunday

Prison Ministry – Serve on retreat team, provide outreach, cookies or prayer for the incarcerated in state facilities, or help with spiritual formation and support for those in the HARP Program through the Chesterfield County Sheriff's Office.

Respect Life Ministry – Plan activities and outreach to protect life from conception to natural death.

Richmond Friends of the Homeless – Prepare a hot meal at parish monthly in the kitchen on the 4th Thursday of the month, 9:30 a.m. and deliver to Swansboro Baptist Church, and serve the meal between Noon and 12:30 p.m. and leave by 1 p.m.

The Parish Hosts Knights of Columbus Council 13170

Parish Policies

Ministry with the Sick or the Bereaved – We ask that parishioners inform the parish when they are aware of a family member who is sick or deceased. However, parishioners should not request assistance except for themselves or members of their own family. In the Commons area there is a “Book of the Sick” where you can record the names of the sick and, with the permission of the sick or their immediate family, indicate the desire for a prayer shawl or a card.

Inclement Weather Policy - We do not follow school closings, or those of any other institutions, for bad weather conditions. We make those decisions on a per-event basis and according to the most current weather conditions. You can check our website for cancellations of large events like Masses, Faith Formation sessions, or for office closings. We will announce cancellations or closings by parish-wide emails.

Parking Restrictions - Do not park in the circle in front of the church building or behind the church building near the dumpster. Parking is not allowed *at any time* on either side of Winterpock Road or on either side of Bethia Road. The Chesterfield County Police have notified us that cars parked in any of these locations can be ticketed and/or towed.

The overflow parking lot off Bethia Road is only open on Sundays & Holy Days with large attendance Masses. At all other times, a chain blocks the use of the lot, which is a safety precaution. Please do not leave your car there for an extended period after a Sunday Mass.

Photo Publication – From time to time, the parish will publish in printed materials, on our website or in/through other modes of parish communication photographs containing pictures of parishioners. If you do not wish your picture to be published, contact the parish office to inform us of your wishes. Photos of minors will not be published without written consent from parents.
