Pastor's Desk

Brothers and sisters of St. Jerome Parish, Norwalk,

Today's Gospel, Luke 13:22–30, invites us to look honestly at our journey of faith and to fix our eyes on the fidelity of God who will not deny us if we walk in trust and truth. Jesus travels toward Jerusalem, teaching about the Kingdom, and He says to us: "Strive to enter through the narrow door." The door is narrow not because God is petty, but because salvation requires focus, conversion, and a life transformed by grace.

The reality of the narrow door

The image of the narrow door is not about legalism, but about choosing rightly, prioritizing God above all else. It is a call to persistence in faith, to generous love, and to conversion that bears fruit. Jesus presses this point with a sobering line: there will be those who say, "We ate and drank in your presence," and He will reply, "I do not know where you come from." Mere outward association with the Church or with religious routines is not enough; what matters is a heart surrendered to God's mercy and a life aligned with His will.

A universal invite, yet a demanding response

As Jesus teaches, people will come from the east and west, north and south, and will recline at the table in the Kingdom of God. The invitation to salvation is universal, not limited to a favored few. Yet this invitation comes with a demand: fidelity, repentance, and a perseverance in faith. The feast is prepared for those who endure, not for those who try the door half-heartedly and walk away when it becomes inconvenient.

The last and the first

Jesus ends with a startling paradox: "Behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." This is not a trick of categorization, but a sobering reminder that appearances deceive. The world's measure of success—status, power, certainty of comfort—cannot determine God's verdict. What matters is alignment with God's will, humility before Him, and faith that clings to His mercy even when life is uncertain.

God's faithfulness: He will not deny you on the last day

This is the heart of our reflection: God will not deny those who trust Him, who seek Him with a sincere heart, and who cooperate with His grace. He does not keep a ledger to deny the penitent sinner but lavishes mercy on those who come to Him in truth. The last day is not a fearsome final exam if we daily live in the truth of Christ's redeeming work: we are forgiven, renewed, and called to persevere.

What this means for us, here and now

Cultivate a persevering faith: Set time for prayer, Scripture, and the sacraments. Seek to live each day in pact with God's will, not merely in conformity to appearances. Embrace conversion as a daily discipline: Acknowledge where you have fallen short, confess, receive mercy, and begin again with renewed zeal.

Pastor's Desk

Practice hospitality to God's invitation: Be attentive to the ways God calls you—through the Word, through a moment of grace, through the needs of a neighbor. Extend the mercy you have received to others.

Trust in God's mercy: If you fear you are far from the door, remember that God's mercy is greater than your weakness. He longs to draw you close, to bring you to the feast, to assure you that you belong to Him if you cling to Him in faith.

Practical steps for St. Jerome Parish

Daily worship and silence: Begin and end each day with a simple prayer, opening your heart to God's invitation and asking for the grace to respond with faithfulness.

Eucharistic life: Let participation in the Eucharist strengthen your resolve to live in charity, truth, and integrity. Allow the Body and Blood of Christ to form you into a living temple for the Holy Spirit.

Confession as renewal: Do not fear the mercy of God made present in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession is not a barrier but a doorway to renewed communion with the Lord.

Love in action: Serve the poor, feed the hungry, comfort the grieving, welcome the stranger. The Kingdom is made visible where love is concrete and neighbor is treated with dignity.

A word of encouragement to you, the people of St. Jerome

You are a parish marked by history and faithfulness; you are a people who have witnessed mercy in little and large ways. The Gospel message today is a call to deepen that witness: to trust in the God who will not deny you on the last day if you keep your hands firmly in His, your heart open to His grace, and your life shaped by the law of love. Do not fear the narrow door, beloved; walk toward it with courage, supported by the community of faith that surrounds you, by the sacraments that feed you, and by the Holy Spirit who strengthens you.

Closing exhortation

Beloved brothers and sisters, the invitation is clear: enter through the narrow door by faith, repentance, and perseverance. The last day will reveal not what we imagined, but what we chose to become—disciples who trusted in the fidelity of God, who would not deny us if we remained faithful to Him. Let us, as a parish, renew our commitment: to seek first the Kingdom, to love as Christ loves, and to trust that He who began a good work in us will bring it to completion on the day of Christ Jesus.
