Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we gather on the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, the Gospel invites us to readiness as we await the Parousia—the Lord's glorious return. Luke 21:5–19 presents not a doom-filled forecast, but a call to faithful watchfulness, rooted in love and hope. And as we approach Advent, that season of preparation, the Gospel's message becomes even more timely: readiness is not mainly about fear, but about living with the eyes of faith open to God's coming kingdom.

1) Do not anchor your hope in things that pass

In Luke 21:5–6, people marvel at the temple stones and grand buildings. Jesus redirects our gaze: what is passing—structures, securities, schedules—will crumble. Our true hope lies in God's faithfulness and in the coming of His kingdom. Advent then invites us to examine the "temples" of our hearts. What sits on the throne of our decisions? Are we inviting God to dwell there more fully?

2) Watchfulness as hopeful discernment

Jesus tells us to be watchful, not to foster anxiety, but to discern what truly matters. When "these things begin to happen," stand upright and raise your heads, for your redemption is near (cf. Luke 21:28). Practically, this means daily prayer, regular Scripture, honest self-examination, and reconciliation where needed. It means choosing what endures—charity, truth, mercy—over what fades.

3) Courage under trials, witness through endurance

Luke 21:12–17 speaks plainly of trials: persecution, betrayal, and family divisions. The good news is the Holy Spirit's accompaniment: we will be given words and wisdom in moments of need. Endurance in hardship becomes a powerful witness to the coming Kingdom. In our own lives, that translates to patient forgiveness, steadfast prayer, and generous acts of mercy even when results aren't immediate.

4) Endurance as the path to salvation

Verse 19: "By your endurance you will gain your souls." Endurance is active fidelity—continuing to love, to pray, to give, and to hope. Small daily acts—prayer before dawn, forgiveness offered, honest work, healthy habits—are the soil in which faith grows strong.

5) Advent as the Catholic rhythm of preparedness

As we near Advent, this Gospel reframes our longing: we prepare not by sensationalism but by holiness in ordinary life. Advent invites us to:

Deepen prayer: contemplative reading of Scripture, a simple Advent devotion.

Cleanse and repair: frequent reconciliation, re-centering on God's mercy.

Act with mercy: feed the hungry, comfort the sorrowing, serve the vulnerable.

Share the hope: invite someone to participate in Mass or an Advent preparation program.

6) A simple plan for our parish


Personal: a daily moment of prayerful reflection on Luke 21, 5–19; a weekly act of mercy. Community: parish Advent "Prepare the Way" focus—short reflections after Sunday Mass, and a parish reconciliation evening.

Evangelical: a gentle invitation to friends and family to participate in Advent services and parish events.

7) A brief prayer for preparedness

Lord, you who are coming in glory, help us to stay awake in faith. Diminish our fears, sharpen our discernment, and strengthen our endurance. As Advent begins, may we prepare the way for you in our hearts and in our world, so that when you return, we may greet you with joy. Through Christ our Lord.

November 2, 2025 Feast of All Souls

Dear Friends in Christ,

In every age of the Church, the Lord has provided faithful shepherds—men who have offered their lives so that others might encounter Christ in the sacraments. Over the decades, our priests have baptized our children, witnessed our marriages, comforted us in times of grief, and nourished us with the Eucharist.

Our parish priests have been true spiritual fathers, and as they age, it is our duty to care for them with the same generosity they have shown us. To meet this responsibility, our diocese has established the St. John Vianney Trust, an independent non-profit with the sole mission of caring for our senior and infirm priests in the Diocese of Bridgeport.

It is important to recognize that retirement does not end a priest's ministry. Senior priests continue to celebrate Mass, hear confessions, and offer pastoral guidance wherever they are needed. Our diocese has more than 70 priests past retirement age, a number that is projected surpass 100 priests within 15 years.

Despite dramatically rising healthcare costs, our diocese is committed to providing care for our older priests, but we need more financial resources to do so. Your generosity will ensure that these faithful men, many of whom serve well into their eighties, can continue to minister and live their remaining years with dignity

Scripture reminds us to "honor your father and mother" (Ex 20:12), and that "kindness to a father will not be forgotten" (Sir 3:14). This principle certainly applies to our earthly fathers, but it is equally true of our spiritual fathers—our parish priests. And so I invite you to give generously to the Faith of Our Fathers campaign.

Finally, please join me in praying for our beloved priests who have passed away, as well as those who are in the autumn of life. As their strength wanes, our support must grow stronger.




