Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,


Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the Church invites us to fix our gaze on a King unlike any other—a King whose throne is a cross, whose crown is made of thorns, and whose victory is love poured out to the end. In a world that often measures kingship by power, status, or dominion, today's readings reorient our vision and call us to live under the gentle, transforming reign of Christ the King.

- 1. A King Who Shepherds, Not Dominates: In 2 Samuel 5, all the tribes of Israel come to David and say, "It is you who shall shepherd my people Israel." Before David is a ruler, he is a shepherd—one who guides, protects, and leads with compassion. This points forward to Jesus, the true Son of David, who reigns not by force but by faithful love. At St. Jerome's Parish, you are invited to trust this Shepherd-King—to allow Him to lead your families, your decisions, your hopes, and your anxieties. Christ's kingship is not distant. It is personal, intimate, and invested in your good.
- 2. A King Who Reconciles All Things: In Colossians 1, St. Paul gives us one of the most beautiful hymns of Christ: "He is the image of the invisible God... through Him all things were created... and in Him all things hold together." But Paul goes further: "Through Him God was pleased to reconcile all things... making peace by the blood of His cross." This is the heart of Christ's kingship—reconciliation. Not domination. Not coercion. Reconciliation. Christ the King reigns by restoring what is broken, forgiving what is wounded, and gathering what is scattered. For our parish community, this means allowing Christ to hold our lives together—our relationships, our commitments, our struggles. When things feel like they are falling apart, Christ the King is the One in whom all things hold together.
- 3. A King Who Reigns From the Cross: Then we come to the Gospel: Luke 23, where we meet Jesus not on a throne but hanging between two criminals. The rulers mock Him, soldiers jeer, passers-by deride Him. Yet in this humiliation, His kingship shines most clearly. Only one person sees it—the good thief, the one we call the "penitent thief." He says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And Jesus gives him what only a King can promise: "Today you will be with me in paradise." Christ rules from the cross because love rules from the cross. He saves not by crushing His enemies but by forgiving them. He conquers not by violence but by mercy. He reveals His kingdom not in displays of glory but in acts of self-giving love.
- 4. What Does It Mean for Us at St. Jerome's? If Christ is our King, then our lives must look like His kingdom.
- 1. Live with compassion and mercy. Our King forgave even from the cross. As parishioners, spouses, parents, workers, students, and friends—are we people of forgiveness? Do we choose mercy over judgment?
- 2. Bring others toward reconciliation. If Christ reconciles all things, we must be agents of peace in our homes, parish ministries, and wider community. Let us heal divisions, support one another, and reach out to the lonely and forgotten.
- 3. Allow Christ to lead your daily life. Kingship means authority. Does Jesus truly reign in our choices, priorities, finances, relationships, and dreams? Allow Him to shepherd you.
- 4. Serve with humility.Our King washed feet and carried a cross. Real greatness in the Kingdom is measured by service. At St. Jerome's, may we become a parish marked by joyful, humble service to God and neighbor.
- 5. Anchor your identity in the King who loves you. The world may define us by achievements or failures, but Christ the King defines us by His love. You belong to Him. You are citizens of His Kingdom

Conclusion: A Kingdom That Begins Now. As we close the liturgical year and celebrate Christ the King, we remember that His kingdom has already begun—in hearts that love like Him, forgive like Him, and serve like Him. May this parish—St. Jerome's—become a living sign of that kingdom: a place where Christ truly reigns, where reconciliation heals, where mercy transforms, and where every person can say, "Jesus, remember me—make me part of Your Kingdom." May Christ the King reign in your hearts, in your homes, and in our parish—today and always.




