### Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today's Gospel invites us into a quiet, intimate moment with God, a moment that reveals the deepest attitudes of the heart. In Luke 18:9–14, Jesus tells the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. Two men go up to the temple to pray, but their prayers rise to heaven from two utterly different places: the Pharisee's self-assured posture and the tax collector's contrite heart. As we gather as a community, let us open our hearts to the Spirit's gentle invitation: to approach God not with a show of piety to impress others, but with honesty, humility, and a childlike trust that God alone is merciful. This parable challenges us to examine our own approach to prayer and to life before God.


Attitude of Approach: How we Come to God in Prayer:

- 1) Humility over Self-Attention: The Pharisee's prayer makes much of himself: "I thank you, God, that I am not like others." His righteousness is a performance designed to garner approval. The tax collector's prayer is simple and honest: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." He does not present a polished resume; he presents need. Our prayer is most authentic when we recognize our dependence on God's mercy. Humility is not humiliation but honest assessment before a loving Father.
- 2) Truth over Calculation: The Pharisee counts his good deeds and his abstinence; he measures his status by comparison. The tax collector does not compare himself to others; he compares himself to the holiness of God and recognizes a chasm he cannot cross on his own. In prayer, truth sets us free. Name your needs, your fears, your failures, and your gratitude. God already knows them but naming them opens our hearts to grace.
- 3) Interior Relational Focus: The Pharisee prays to display piety, but not in relation to God; it's a conversation with self and others' opinions. The tax collector prays to God, in relationship with a Father who longs to be merciful. His focus is communion, not conquest. Prayer is a dialogue of love. Approach God as a beloved child who trusts the Father's mercy more than the world's judgment.
- 4) Dependence on Mercy: The core of the parable is mercy: who receives mercy is grounded in the posture of the heart. The tax collector's appeal is entirely dependent on God's mercy; he does not claim justification on his own terms. We too come to God expecting mercy, knowing we do not merit salvation by our own efforts. We receive grace as a gift.
- 5) Practice in Everyday Life: Sunday liturgy is the summit of our worship, but the school of prayer is every moment: family conversations, work, service, and repentance. et our daily routines become opportunities to return to the Father, to acknowledge our need, to forgive others, and to be forgiven.

Practical Ways to Live the Message: Begin and end each day with a short act of humility: acknowledge one way you failed today and ask for God's mercy. In prayer, resist the urge to "perform." Close your eyes, open your heart, and simply say, "God, I am listening; I am yours." When praying with others, avoid self-promotion. Let your prayers be focused on God's will and the needs of others. Cultivate gratitude. Name two things you are grateful for each day, recognizing that all gifts come from our gracious Father. Practice reconciliation. If there is a broken relationship, take a small step toward healing, mirroring the mercy we receive. Loving Father, you welcome all who come to you with honesty and humility. Help us to lay aside the masks of perfection and to approach you as your beloved sons and daughters. May our prayers be sincere, our hearts contrite, and our lives transformed by your mercy. Teach us to imitate the tax collector's trust in your mercy and to grow in humility, charity, and faith. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.




