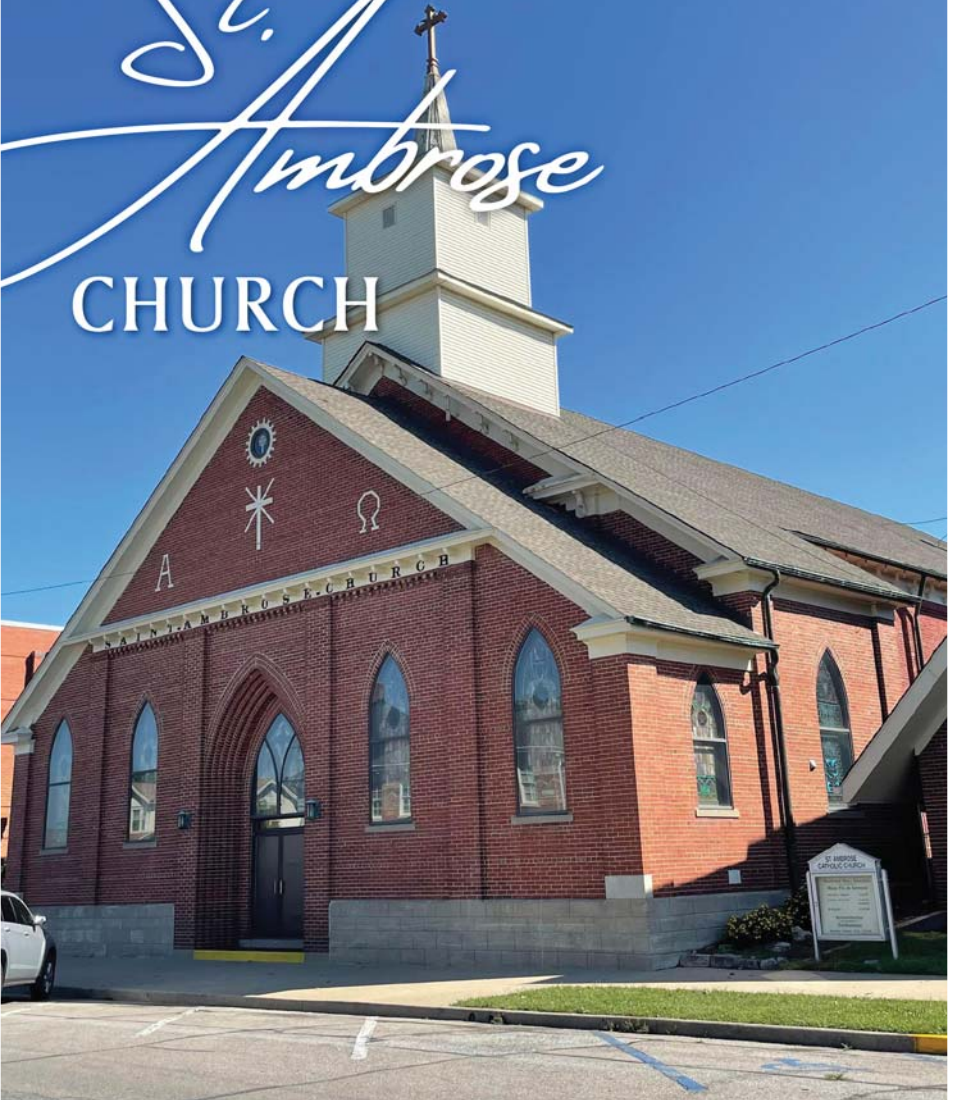

## Parish History

Indiana became a state in 1816 and was part of the mission fields supported by the Propagation of the Faith in Lyons, France, and other missionaries from France. Our parish was part of these mission fields. Accounts of Catholic settlers of German descent in Jackson County are dated 1834. During this time, Mass was said in homes when a priest, usually on horseback, passed through. The home of John Culver on the northeast corner of Third and Broadway Street, used by Catholic railroad workers and their families, is on record as one of these sites.

The area grew in population and aspired to be a town. Meedy Shields, a Seymour founding father, offered land and \$100 to any congregation that would build a church in the future town. Jackson County Catholics accepted the offer and built a wooden church on S. Chestnut Street. Oral tradition has it that the church, a wooden structure, was dedicated to St. Ambrose in 1860. In accordance with the Archdiocese directives of the day, a cemetery was purchased and a Catholic School was started. Rev. Philip Doyle was the first resident Pastor of St. Ambrose. Rev. Doyle's sister, Catherine Doyle, left the Sisters of Providence Community and became the first Catholic school teacher for the children of St. Ambrose Parish. Catherine was the first American Postulant received by Saint Mother Theodore Guerin and the Sisters of Providence at St. Mary-of-the-Woods.

With the backdrop of the Civil War, and lawlessness in the area around the notorious Reno Gang, the church membership grew, necessitating a larger church. The cornerstone for the brick church you see today was laid on August 21, 1870.

The second resident Pastor, Rev. Anthony A. Schenk, oversaw the building of the St. Ambrose Academy and Day School for three sisters from the Sisters of Providence who were in charge of 120 pupils at its start in 1874. In these early school's subjects were usually reading, spelling, arithmetic, geography and history. Religion was taught as a special topic outside of the regular class hours. School was held six to seven hours daily, six days a week, ten months a year.

Fr. Schenk also enlarged the church with the addition of a sanctuary in 1884.

Then Fr. Clement Conrad was Pastor at St. Ambrose for forty-six years from 1887 to 1933. The influence of his long and conscientious service was felt outside his church as well as throughout the years. Under his guidance, a new rectory was built (1891), new pipe organ installed (1907), three new altars were purchased from a New Albany church (1907), and the Knights of Columbus was established.

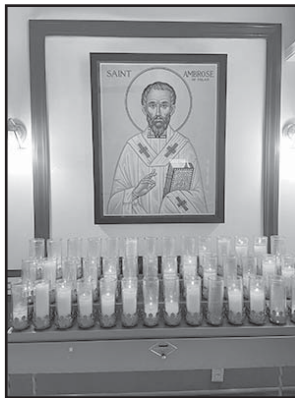
St. Ambrose has been fortunate to have long serving, dedicated and talented Pastors over the years as the parish has continued to grow. New buildings along the way have been erected and paid for with successful capital campaigns. For example, the present school was dedicated January 29th, 1959, the present rectory was built in 1967, and the Parish Center was completed in 1997 under the leadership of Fr. Joseph Sheets.

Over the years the school children were taught by the Sisters of Providence (1873-1917), Ursuline Sisters (1917-1929) and Sisters of the Order of St. Benedict (1930-1983). Today St. Ambrose School is staffed by lay teachers in classes Preschool through 8th grade.

St. Ambrose celebrated its 150th anniversary in 2010. Fr. Daniel J. Staublin began his ministry here and celebrated the opening of our 150th year with a Mass with Archbishop Daniel Mark Buechlein, OSB, in June of 2010. Father Dan uses the Parish Commissions Model and Parish Council to assist in the operation of the Parish. With a wide variety of activities and groups operating within the Parish community, it is a challenge to schedule spaces for the assorted ministries but it works.

On December 7, 2022, an icon of our Patron Saint was dedicated and placed in our church.

If you or a family member would like to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please call the Parish Office at 812-522-5304. If you are scheduled for surgery, you are asked to call in advance of the surgery date.

## **Holy Eucharist:**

First Communion: At St. Ambrose School, children receive their First Holy Communion in second grade. For those attending a school other than St. Ambrose School, please contact Beth Pifer, Religious Education Coordinator, Preschool – 12th Grade at 812-522-5304 ext. 322, to learn about our sacramental preparation program. Please keep in mind that a child must have received at least one year of preparation for Religious Education prior to preparation for receiving Sacraments.

## **Sagrada Eucaristía:**

*Primera Comunión: En la escuela San Ambrosio, los niños reciben su Primera Comunión en segundo grado. Para aquellos que asisten a una escuela que no sea la escuela San Ambrosio, comuníquese con Beth Pifer, Coordinadora de Educación Religiosa - Preescolar - 12º grado al 812-522-5304 ext. 322 para conocer nuestro programa de preparación sacramental. Tenga en cuenta que un niño debe haber recibido al menos un año de preparación para Educación Religiosa antes de prepararse para recibir los Sacramentos.*

**Homebound Communion:** If you would like to receive the Eucharist but are unable to attend Mass due to ill health, infirmity, or advancing age, you may arrange to have Communion brought to you. Please call the Parish Office at 812-522-5304.

**Confirmation:**

Confirmation is typically received by students in their sophomore year of High School or older. You must have been involved and active in our Youth Ministry Program at least one year prior to participating in Sacramental Preparation. If you do not meet these criteria we ask that you join us for Youth Ministry and service projects before enrolling in Confirmation.

## **St. Ambrose School Mission Statement**

Led by Christ through prayer and study, the St. Ambrose Catholic School Community encourages a lifelong commitment to faith, learning, leadership, and service.

Our students and staff live our mission in the following ways:

**FAITH:** Attending Mass together (weekly, Holy Days of Obligation, other special days), receiving Sacraments (Eucharist, Reconciliation), praying (beginning/end of day, before/after lunch, Rosaries, Stations of the Cross, when we hear emergency vehicles, May Crowning of Mary), celebrating Liturgical Seasons (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter), honoring special feast days (St. Ambrose, Our Lady of Guadalupe, St. Nicholas, All Saints Day), Attending Retreats (CYO Camp), etc.

**LEARNING:** Providing a rigorous curriculum (reading, language arts, math, science, social studies) and special area classes (art, music, foreign language, P.E.), participating in Indiana state assessments (ILEARN, IREAD-3, WIDA), utilizing current student and classroom technology (Chromebooks, Promethean smart boards), participating in extra-curricular activities (volleyball, basketball, VEX Robotics, state music competitions, essay contests, DARE), attending educational field trips, etc.

**LEADERSHIP:** Planning and participating in school Liturgies, providing ministry at weekend Masses (altar servers, musicians, lectors, greeters), participating in Jackson County Youth Program (YoJACK), sharing classroom, school, and parish responsibilities, providing assistance at Knights of Columbus Lenten fish dinners, etc.

**SERVICE:** Delivering Meals on Wheels, assisting at local charities (Anchor House, Provisions, and Seymour Clothing Center), Collecting for others facing hardships (Haiti, Catholic Charities, Ronald McDonald House, Salvation Army, natural disasters, etc.)

Any Middle School and High School students and their friends are welcome at any time! Young adult and parent volunteers are always needed as mentors and chaperones for special service projects and events.

## Confirmation

Our goal is to provide you with information and experiences that enable you to answer questions about Catholicism, get a better understanding of the Sacrament of Confirmation and our call as Catholic Christians to social justice, and allow you time to reflect on your personal faith. Another goal of our program is to expose you to what it means to be an active, participating adult in the Catholic Church through participation in liturgies, education, service and retreats. By the end of the program, we hope we have achieved these goals so that you can more consciously make your decision about becoming a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church.

Our program is based on the guidelines set forth by the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, which states that each candidate complete the following:

- 20-30 hours of Catechesis
- 20 hours of service
- Retreat experience

Classes typically occur during the sophomore year of High School or older. Please note that **YOU MUST HAVE BEEN INVOLVED AND ACTIVE IN OUR YOUTH MINISTRY PROGRAM FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR PRIOR TO PARTICIPATE IN PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION.** If you do not meet these criteria, we ask that you join us for Youth Ministry and service projects before enrolling in Confirmation.

# Religious Education

Preschool - 8th Grade

Religious Education for Preschool - 8th grade meets every Wednesday from 6:00 p.m. - 7:15 p.m. We go by a calendar similar to our school. The material used for their formation is according to their school grade level. All of our materials are available in bilingual form. Religious Education is a vital part for our children, especially for those preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion.

**Children/Youth who are looking forward to receiving First Reconciliation, First Communion or Confirmation must have received at least one year of preparation for Religious Education prior to enrolling in Sacrament preparation.** Usually students receive First Reconciliation/First Communion their 2nd grade year, so that means as 1st graders it is important that they are enrolled and attending Religious Education Classes.

SPREAD (Special Religious Development) utilizes a variety of programs and adaptive materials to provide an environment in which persons with developmental and cognitive disabilities can experience ongoing faith formation, as well as positive integration into the liturgical and community life of the Church. The annual SPREAD Mass offers special opportunities to experience Christ through participation in the Mass. SPREAD meets twice a month so they may connect faithfully with their friends. This class time will take place from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

## Spiritual Life

The Spiritual Life Committee is a standing committee of the parish Pastoral Council, dedicated to the promotion of active participation in worship and programs in spiritual development.

The overall purpose of the Spiritual Life Committee is to assist the Pastor in planning and providing for the spiritual development of the members of St. Ambrose through liturgical celebrations.

The Spiritual Life Committee is active and helpful in preparing parish liturgies and prayers, setting parish policy regarding liturgy, and educating the parish in issues of liturgy. The Spiritual Life Committee is also involved in recruiting and training liturgical ministers including lectors, greeters, music ministers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, sacristans, servers, and those focused on making our Church environment beautiful and sacred.

The Spiritual Life Committee assists the Pastor and the Pastoral staff in forming and maintaining a vision of liturgy which is truly the source and summit of life at St. Ambrose.

### **Opportunities to serve are as follows:**

**Committee member:** The committee meets on the third Tuesday of the month as needed. The committee meets around nine times per year to plan upcoming liturgies and evaluate past liturgies.

**Congregation:** All people at the liturgy are responsible to participate fully in the liturgy.

**Lector:** The lector is instituted to proclaim the readings from sacred scripture.

**Hispanic Ministry:** The Hispanic Ministry serves to help coordinate Hispanic liturgical offerings which include:

- La Celebración Misa bilingue (Bilingual Mass celebrations.)
- Música Litúrgica (Musical liturgy)
- Celebraciones especiales (Special celebrations)
- Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe (Our Lady of Guadalupe)

**Music Ministry:** The goal and purpose of the Music Ministry is to enhance the experience of worship by heightening the Word of God with music and to provide beauty to the liturgy through music. Those involved are cantors who lead the congregation in singing and musicians who provide the instrumental music.

**Greeters:** The Greeting Ministry is a vital part of welcoming visitors to our church. It helps shape the first impression a church presents to potential parishioners. The greeters also serve as ushers who help seat people for Mass and collect the offering.

**Servers:** A person (usually boys and girls from the parish) who helps the celebrant during a liturgical service.

**Arts and Environment:** A group of parishioners who design and prepare the worship space in accordance with the liturgical calendar.

**Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion:** Help the Pastor distribute communion to the congregation. These ministers are invited to serve by the Pastor.

**Sacristans:** Prepare the Altar area before and after Mass.

## Finance Committee

**Purpose:**

The Finance Committee of St. Ambrose Parish coordinates all financial activities of the Parish and acts as an advisory body for planning, providing counsel and direction to the Pastor and Pastoral Council on financial matters, in accordance with Canon Law and the norms of the Diocesan Bishop.

**Function:**

- a. Assists and advises the Pastor and Business Manager concerning the administration of the parish goods according to Canon Law and Archdiocesan directives, policies, and norms.
- b. Directs the preparation of the St. Ambrose annual budget and assists in monitoring operations to assure budget conformance.
- c. Reviews financial reports at each meeting and presents a report to the Pastoral Council.
- d. Advises the Pastor, Business Manager and Pastoral Council on matters of financial planning.
- e. Provides support to other committees and organizations regarding financial matters.

## Welcoming Committee

**Purpose:**

We will serve as an outreach committee to promote a culture of openness and fellowship in which new church members, those who are returning to our Catholic faith, and current parishioners feel welcome and connected to our church. Our main goal is to make everyone feel welcome and promote fellowship.

**Responsibilities:**

Contact newly registered individuals and families and provide them with a welcome packet with information about our parish.

Committee members will follow-up with newly registered parishioners with a phone call to see how they are becoming acquainted with us, answer questions they might have, and inform them of upcoming activities at St. Ambrose.

## Hispanic Ministry

The first Hispanic families began to regularly worship at St. Ambrose in the mid to late 1990's.

Today there are Hispanic representatives in almost all commissions. They are involved in the Anglo parish commissions and take the information back to the general meeting in Spanish open to all involved in the different commissions and ministries. Ideas and information are exchanged and passed back and forth this way.

Our bilingual Masses are very well attended. We have 5 enthusiastic music groups who participate in the bilingual liturgy. In 2015, we started to see the presence of our Guatemalan brothers and sisters who have joined our parish and some have started participating in Liturgy Ministries. We have seen a huge growth in our Hispanic population in the last few years.

Fr. Dan decided to add a second bilingual Mass to the weekend schedule. This Mass was initiated on Sunday, April 17, 2022.

Major feasts are generally bilingual, faith formation events are held in Spanish/English and some Spanish feasts are observed with Hispanic traditions. Our Lady of Guadalupe Celebrations remind us that we are Catholic people and one America. Other events include the celebration of Hispanic Heritage month, Posadas, and Dia de Reyes.

Fr. Dan prays that the bilingual "spirit" continues to grow in our liturgies and that the Hispanic parishioners continue to take an active role in the life of the parish.

## Haiti Committee

The Haiti Mission was started as part of a Twinning Program that links parishes in poor countries with parishes in America. We have twinned with St. Therese Parish in Gaspard, Haiti, since 1998. Our initial commitment was to help with a medical clinic. To support the clinic, St. Ambrose needed to commit to sending \$900 per month to our sister parish. In order to accomplish this, the committee requested that 180 parish families each commit to contributing \$5 each month to support this medical mission. The commitment was reached and St. Ambrose parishioners have supported the clinic and have increased funding to support many additional needs of the community for the past 28 years. In 2025, we were able to set up a medical lab, fully fund the medical clinic (which also does trips to the neighboring village of Jean Clair), fully fund the primary school staff salary (307 students), repair roofs and power (solar/generator), repair and maintain the only vehicle that serves the community, as well provide food, fuel, and other needs as we are able to. We continue to have dialog with other charities (Food for the Poor and Solidarity Haiti) that support the area and have found additional ways to partner with these groups to further help the people of Gaspard.

Haiti is the poorest country in the western hemisphere. Here are some fast facts:

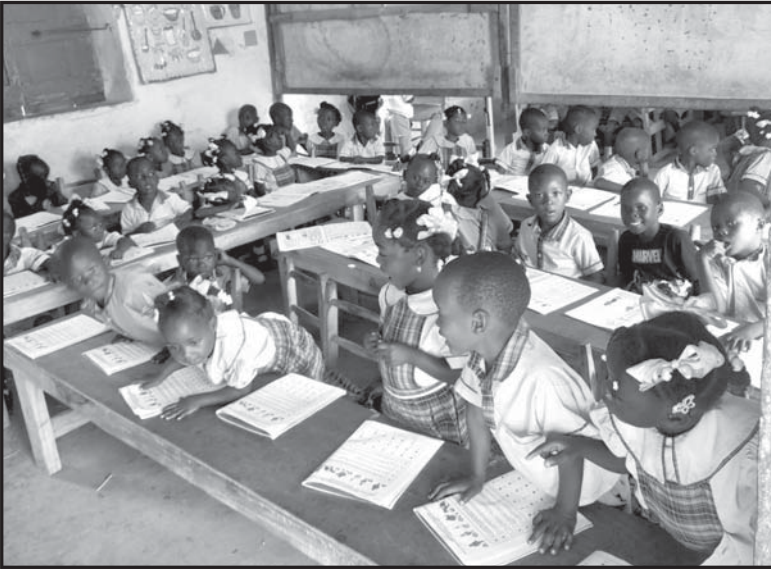
- One of the top 10 water-poor countries of the world
- One in five children die before reaching the age of five
- Life expectancy is about 25-30 years less than the US
- Most people lack access to medical care
- Most people live on one or less meals a day
- Most homes lack electric, running water, and other modern standards
- Lack of job opportunities

We currently meet quarterly and invite all parishioners to join us. Funds are sent down to Gaspard from St. Ambrose quarterly after the committee prayerfully assesses the needs presented by the priest at St. Therese on behalf of the church, community, school, and medical clinics. Because of the extreme poverty and rising costs in the country, their needs exceed the amount of money that is currently being donated. Despite this, we are making a lifesaving difference for the people of Gaspard. They very much appreciate the help and prayers that the parishioners of St Ambrose are giving.

## Prayer Shawl Ministry

The Prayer Shawl Ministry of St. Ambrose Church began in 2009. The Ministry met its goal of 40 shawls the first year and continues to give shawls to the homebound and other souls in crisis. In 2010, the Ministry began knitting white shawls for the Sacrament of Baptism.

All are welcome. The ministry will gladly teach beginning knitters to help someone regain their skills or learn anew. Shawls are a gift from the knitters. Yarn for the baptismal shawls is provided by the Parish. Patterns for various levels are available through the coordinators. Ministry coordinators, Kitty Lewis (812-521-0014) and Kay Melton work with the Parish Office to receive names, bless the shawls, and deliver them through Eucharistic Ministers. Names can also come to the Ministry through word of mouth.

The Hispanic group coordinator, Teresa Morales (812-530-6984), meets with her group on Tuesdays from 10:00 a.m. to noon in the downstairs meeting room in the Parish Center. Enter and sign in at the School Office. Other knitters in the Ministry knit at home.

The knitters who are inspired to knit for this Ministry know the power of prayer and the need of each person to be remembered and comforted when they face difficult times not of their choosing. Christ has no hands on earth but ours, so we reach out and knitting needles and hands in this Ministry become instruments of prayers. We ask for the blessing of comfort on the shawl recipients and if possible that their health be restored. We hope they know others care.

## Homeless Ministry

The St. Ambrose Homeless Ministry began when I approached Deacon John after doing street outreach on my own for a year and feeling that this was something St. Ambrose could become a part of. Our ministry provides monthly snack totes for children living in hotels, serves at the Alley, and conducts street outreach by visiting camps and other locations where people experiencing homelessness may be living. We also provide backpacks, blankets, sleeping bags, food, and essential items to those who are currently homeless as well as to many individuals and families who were previously homeless.
