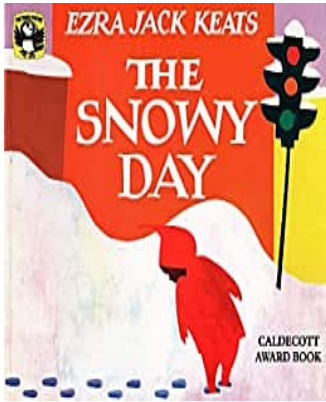

### Macon County spotlights a remarkable woman of strength, dedication and compassion, Ms. Shameki Arnold.

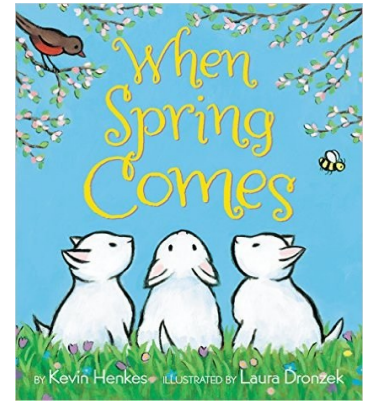

## The Kids and Kin Program Spotlights Relative Care Specialist Kelly Taylor-Wilson

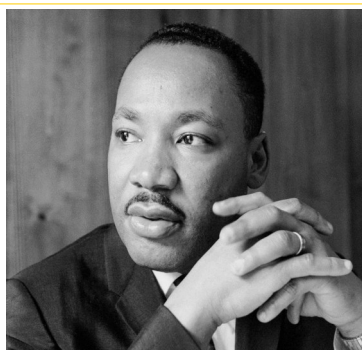

**Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.**

Dr. King was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia. When he was growing up, life was hard for African Americans. He had his first experience of segregation at just six years old, when he was told he could not play with his white friend anymore because his friend's father would not allow it. Dr. King was a great believer in peaceful protests. In 1963, he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech on the importance of civil rights. It focuses on his dream of a society where black people and white people live together in harmony. In 1964, the Civil Rights Act was passed, outlawing racial segregation and discrimination in the U.S. He won the Nobel Peace Prize that year. It had been a long, hard fight for civil rights. Tragically, Martin Luther King, Jr., was assassinated in 1968 as he stood on the balcony of his hotel in Tennessee, where he had given a speech the day before. Dr. King is remembered for his tireless work during the Civil Rights Movement and his dream that one day everyone would be treated as equals. A statue built in his memory stands in Washington, D.C. and each year, on the third Monday in January, we celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, an American federal holiday.

## Easy Valentine Sugar Cookies



### Cookies:

- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

### Royal Icing:

- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 2 tablespoons of meringue powder
- 5-6 tablespoons water (adjust for consistency)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Food coloring (pink and red)
- Sprinkles for decoration

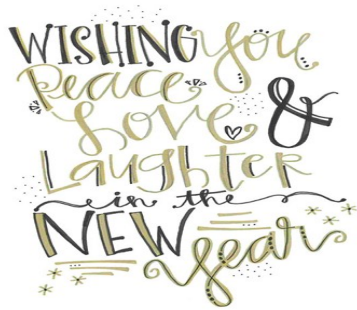
### Instructions:

1. Prepare the dough in medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, and salt. In a separate bowl, beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add egg and vanilla, mix well.
2. Chill the dough. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes.
3. Roll and cut. Preheat oven to 350°. Roll dough on lightly floured surface to 1/4-inch thickness. Use heart shaped cookie cutters to cut out cookies and place on lined baking sheet.
4. Bake for 10-12 minutes until edges are slightly golden. Let cool completely on wire rack.
5. Prepare Royal Icing. Beat powdered sugar, meringue powder, vanilla, and water until smooth and glossy. Divide into two bowls and add food coloring as desired.
