CONCERNING THE SERVICE

Once you enter the church, please maintain the silence before the liturgy begins. In the Episcopal tradition, we use this time to pray, reflect, and prepare for worship.

“BCP” refers to the Book of Common Prayer.

The + symbol indicates an appropriate time to make the sign of the Cross. Many people bow while saying the italicized words in the Nicene Creed and when the Name of Jesus is said if they are standing instead of kneeling. These practices are not required, and they are noted as a convenience for those who choose to do so.

CHILDREN’S CHAPEL & NURSERY

We offer Children’s Chapel (worship for children) and Nursery (infants and toddlers) during the 9 am and 11:15 am services. Both are located in the Annex which can be accessed through the glass doors in the Parish Hall, or ask an usher for assistance.

THE FIRST LESSON

Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: “I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. To honor the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, please continue standing or kneeling, as able, during the distribution of Communion.

Gluten-free wafers are available for those who need them. The appropriate response when receiving the bread and the wine is “Amen.” When receiving the wine, hold the base of the chalice and guide it to your lips, tipping it until you can sip from it. Intinction is not permitted in this parish. If you receive the bread, but not the wine, cross your arms in front of your chest when the chalice comes to you. If you do not wish to receive the bread or the wine, you may cross your arms in front of your chest to receive a blessing, or you may remain in your pew.
