
Attendance: 29<sup>th</sup> Sept 2025 to 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct 2025

### Book Nook

Hollywood actor Michael Sheen has been talking about co-writing his first book for children, called *A Home for Spark the Dragon*. Spark has his nest destroyed in a storm and needs to find somewhere else to live.

"I thought this was a really great opportunity to be able to address issues around what the home is and homelessness," says Sheen from Port Talbot, Wales, who has campaigned on the issue.

"When Spark does eventually find a house, a new house, it doesn't work for him to begin with, he's scared, something's not right."

"And it's all his friends who come together in the community, who make that house into a home for him, give him the support he needs, so that he can be happy there."

### DfE Guidance and How it affects School



How our children have accessed their food during time in school has always been safely considered. With new directives from the Department for Education, we have made some changes that families need to be aware of and reassured by. In Nursery, staff sit at the table with the children during lunchtime and a set time for snack makes this a fun part of the day. In Reception, the snack table is accessible for all, in the middle of the classrooms so staff can oversee when children are there.

In Key Stages 1 and 2, children will now have a more 'sociable' time for snack and depending on the lessons that day, the classes will enjoy their snack before or after break-time, sat with their friends.

We are also stating ourselves as a 'cut-grapes' school and ask any child bringing grapes into school has them with them already cut length ways. This includes grapes that are part of a pre-packed tubs or bags. Will will ask children to take home any un-cut grapes.
