Holidays in term time

Reminder - If you have requested an absence of five or more school days in a ten week rolling period, then school will be referring this absence to the Local Authority and recommending that an Education Penalty Notice is issued. This penalty notice is £80 per parent, per child, and increases to £160 if not paid within 21 days.



If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.

If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider other enforcement options available to them.

Children need to attend school regularly to maximise their academic achievement, and social and emotional development.
