

**Sermon Discussion Questions**  
**Destin Garner | RPC Parker Square | Sunday, August 30**  
**Scripture Passages: Revelation 3:14-21, Colossians 1:15-18**

**Have members of your small group read the passages aloud before beginning the discussion.**

**Icebreaker:** Share something you have learned from reading Revelation &/or this sermon series so far?

1. In Revelation 3:14–17, Jesus says He knows the church’s “works.” What does this reveal about the importance of our actions, not simply our feelings or intentions, in following Christ? Where might there be a gap between what we say we believe and how we actually live?
2. Jesus describes the Laodicean church as “lukewarm.” What does this mean? Based on Destin’s explanation of the water supply, what made their lukewarmness so offensive to Jesus?
3. The Laodiceans said, “I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing,” while Jesus said they were actually “wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked.” How does self-sufficiency make us spiritually blind? What are some ways comfort, success, busyness, or independence can cause us to lose sight of our need for Jesus?
4. Revelation 3:19 shows that Jesus confronts the Laodiceans because He loves them: “Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline.” How does this change the way we should respond when Jesus exposes areas of spiritual complacency or ineffectiveness in our lives? What does genuine repentance look like?
5. In Revelation 3:20–21, Jesus stands at the door and knocks, inviting the church back into fellowship with Him. What does this passage teach us about Jesus’ character and His desire for relationship with us? What do you think Jesus may be asking of you in light of these scriptures?

**For next steps & application:**

1. **Prayerfully ask the Lord** to reveal where you have become spiritually complacent or self-sufficient. Identify and confess what you need to repent and prayerfully surrender those areas to Him this week.
