Why should you attend this meeting?

On January 2025 Rhonda Bradley stood up at a Russell Township meeting to deliver a presentation on behalf of StandOurGround and the Russell Community.

One of the concerns we raised was the expansion of the settlement areas onto prime farmland. Our reasons were:

- a) the Province of Ontario has only 5% of arable land a lot of that land is here and is irreplaceable;
- b) the agricultural industry remains our biggest economic sector and is crucial to maintain a stable and healthy economy; and
- c) recent economic forecasts indicate that the ag sector could add another \$11 billion to Canada's GDP. A share of this future rightly belongs to the Township of Russell.

We asked that Council pause the expansion of commercial and settlement areas onto prime farmland. The Local Planning Authority should evaluate alternative locations which avoid prime agricultural areas, and where avoidance is not possible, consider reasonable alternatives on lower priority agricultural lands in prime agricultural areas.

Since that meeting more land has been sold to developers. We believe thoughtful, controlled growth in Russell Township is achievable, one that respects agriculture, the environment, and the preservation of our quality of life.

We need a Council that is prepared to stand up for and protect what makes our Township such a great place to live, work, play, raise families and age well.

We also would like the Township to include the agricultural industry in their future economic development plans, as well as to develop an Agricultural Advisory Committee to give the interests of local farmers a voice on the future of our Township.
