We are now entering that cherished period of the year where our focus turns to the first advent of Christ – marking the start to His life of obedience that culminated at the cross and tomb, so that we might have Good News.

However, if we aren't careful, it can

turn into just another story, one repeated

annually during the Christmas season. For the longest time, one of the things I overlooked in the Christmas story was the shepherds. They received an extraordinary personal invitation to witness the birth of Christ; but what struck me later was their reaction after encountering Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus. Luke records it in 2:17-18, 20: After seeing them, they reported the message they were told about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them...

The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had seen and heard, which were just as they had been told. They couldn't contain the joy of the Good News they had experienced; they felt compelled to share it with everyone they met. Their response was instinctual – they understood that Good News is meant to be shared. They weren't worried or troubled by the perceptions of others, but driven solely by the magnitude of what they had witnessed and the urgency for others to partake in it too. My prayer for this Christmas season is that we haven't inadvertently grown numb to the wonder and greatness of the Good News of Christ. It began the evening when Christ was born, but concluded with the realization that salvation awaited us through that same child. Let us emulate the example set by the shepherds. Let's echo the Gospel message we've been entrusted with,

rejoicing and glorifying God. May we, too, be unreserved in sharing the transformative power of this message, for in doing so, we reflect the essence of Christmas – a time of sharing love, hope, and the unparalleded joy found in Christ's birth.
