# Collin's Reflection

In the leadup to Father's Day, I have been thinking a lot about what it means to be both a father and God's child. Let me explain:

My first consideration is human fatherhood. Having only been a father for about two years, I have not even scratched the surface of the blessings and travails of parenting, but I have noticed some patterns.

I can see the influence my own father has had on me as a father. Marriage and parenting have a way of forcing your deepest self out into the open; they make you more of who you really are. Indeed, I have seen that as the pressures of this vocation press in on me, for better and worse, I end up acting exactly like my father!

When my toddler spills the water pitcher because he believes that it's exactly what I need while my baby daughter wails because her ball rolled away, I react exactly like my father.

When I find a quiet moment and use the last fading flickers of my energy to pray lovingly to God, I recall watching my dad do the same.

It is only with great effort that I break my father's mold. This isn't just the case for me: Studies show that when a father attends church regularly, many of his children will continue practicing the faith as adults. The spiritual well-being of our children cannot fall on the mother alone.






In this light, I want to consider God's fatherhood. It is no small gift that Jesus gave us the right to call God our Father.

I can confidently say that no one has pushed my patience to its absolute limit quite like my son does. Yet I know he couldn't do anything to make me love him less. Even when he headbutts me so hard that I expect to need dentures by the time I am thirty, I still can't help but love the little guy.

I felt a ridiculous amount of pride when I watched him dip a chicken tender into sauce for the first time. I can't help but see God, our Father, looking at us like that. Does he look on us with love even after we make the same, mindless mistake for the fiftieth time this year? I believe so. Does his heart glow with love for us when we simply live well inside the bounds of his Divine Providence? I know it does!

So, fathers, remember: your children will mimic how you pray and how you live. When that burden feels too heavy, don't forget that your Father in heaven is watching over you, his child, with those same eyes of love.

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA

## Reflexión del Collin

En vísperas del Día del Padre, he estado reflexionando mucho sobre lo que significa ser, al mismo tiempo, padre e hijo de Dios. Permítanme explicarlo:

Lo primero que considero es la paternidad humana. Como llevo apenas dos años siendo padre, apenas he comenzado a descubrir las bendiciones y los desafíos de la crianza, pero ya he notado ciertos patrones.

Percibo la influencia que mi propio padre ha ejercido sobre mí en mi faceta de padre. El matrimonio y la crianza tienen la particularidad de sacar a la luz lo más profundo de nuestro ser; nos hacen más auténticos. De hecho, he comprobado que, a medida que siento la presión de esta vocación —para bien o para mal—, termino actuando exactamente igual que mi padre!

Cuando mi hijo pequeño derrama la jarra de agua —convencido de que eso es justo lo que yo necesitaba— y, al mismo tiempo, mi hija bebé llora desconsolada porque se le ha escapado la pelota, reacciono exactamente como lo hacía mi padre.

Cuando encuentro un momento de calma y dedico las últimas reservas de energía que me quedan a orar con amor a Dios, recuerdo haber visto a mi padre hacer lo mismo.

Solo con gran esfuerzo logro romper el molde de mi padre. Y esto no me sucede solo a mí: los estudios demuestran que, cuando un padre asiste regularmente a la iglesia, muchos de sus hijos continúan practicando la fe en la edad adulta. El bienestar espiritual de nuestros hijos no puede recaer únicamente sobre la madre.

Desde esta perspectiva, quiero reflexionar sobre la paternidad de Dios. No es un regalo menor que Jesús nos haya concedido el derecho de llamar a Dios "Padre".

Puedo afirmar con seguridad que nadie ha llevado mi paciencia al límite absoluto como lo hace mi hijo. Sin embargo, sé que no hay nada que él pueda hacer para que yo lo quiera menos. Incluso cuando me da un cabezazo tan fuerte que pienso que necesitaré dentadura postiza antes de cumplir los treinta, no puedo evitar querer a ese pequeño.

Sentí un orgullo inmenso al verlo mojar una tira de pollo en la salsa por primera vez. Es inevitable imaginar a Dios, nuestro Padre, mirándonos de esa misma manera. ¿Nos mira con amor incluso después de que cometemos el mismo error insensato por quincuagésima vez en el año? Yo creo que sí. ¿Acaso no se llena su corazón de amor por nosotros cuando simplemente vivimos bien, dentro de los límites de su Divina Providencia? ¡Sé que sí!

Así que, padres, recuerden: sus hijos imitarán su forma de orar y de vivir. Cuando esa carga parezca demasiado pesada, no olviden que su Padre celestial vela por ustedes —sus hijos— con esa misma mirada de amor.
