President Swanson stated, "Thank you. Our first order of business tonight, I'd like to introduce you all to Rocio Ayard Ochoa, who is here from the Quad Cities Community Foundation. We're very grateful for your time, and this is an important partner for the Commission, in raising philanthropy, and pulling private dollars on behalf of our Forest Preserve Commission. Ms. Ayard Ochoa, the floor is yours."

Ms. Ayard Ochoa stated, "Thank you for having me. Again, my name is Rocio. First of all, thank you all for being our partner. I represent the Quad Cities Community Foundation. I'm the Director of Engagement. My supervisor, Anne Calder couldn't be here tonight, so I will represent her as well, and talk to you a little bit about the Quad Cities Community Foundation, but most importantly, I would like to talk to you about a new tax incentive that effects some of our residents. So first, we've been in existence for 60 years. We started in 1964 with a group of volunteers and we created this charitable organization. Our main mission is to provide dollars into the community, to work with families, donors, non-profit organizations who want to make an impact in the community and guide their philanthropic goals. And so, by doing that, we provide scholarships, we provide grants to non-profit organizations, and really, our ultimate goal is to create change and to transform the region through charitable giving. I will talk about the Illinois Gifts Tax Credit Program. You all should have a hand-out in front of you, and there are three reasons why this program started. It's brand new to the State of Illinois. It was created just this year, with the specific goal to encourage charitable giving. The hope is that through this tax credit, folks in our state are able to be incentivized to give to endowments. It also provides a community benefit, so contributions help fund programs and projects in the community. And of course, the third, is that it has a personal tax savings incentive for folks. It offers a 25% state income tax credit, which is different than the deduction that folks receive through charitable giving. It is awarded at a first-come, first-serve basis, and folks do have to apply. It offers a maximum annual credit of \$100,000 per individual, or up to \$200,000 per couple. Anybody that pays Illinois taxes, can claim this tax credit. It is not transferable or refundable, but it can be carried-over up to five years. And so why is this important? It's very important because tax payers can give to an endowment and can receive this tax credit, for that gift. At the Quad Cities Community Foundation, we're a qualified community foundation that can help all of the taxpayers through the process and we help them through the application process. The funds are limited, so we do encourage folks to act quickly if they are interested in giving to an endowment, to give at the beginning of the year, versus later. I'm going to stop here because you may have questions, and I want to answer them. Again, I do want to thank you for partnering with us. You all do have an endowment with us. I do want to clarify though, the endowment that you all have with us, wouldn't qualify, specifically, for this tax benefit because it does have specific statements in our agreement that does not make it a true endowment, because the funds in the endowment you have with us, can be retracted. So, if this is something of interest to your organization, we can absolutely set a sister fund that would remove that clause, and would make it a true endowment. As long as the funds are not removed, then folks can give, and this is something that you can work with donors to be able to incentivize them."

President Swanson asked, "I know I have a question, and I'm looking around for others, but have you seen an impact already in giving to endowments?"

Ms. Ayard Ochoa stated, "Absolutely. As you call know, the Quad Cities Community Foundation serves lowa and Illinois. Iowa has had a similar tax credit for the past 20-25 years, and so this is something that we absolutely see our philanthropic values increase because of it. This is our first year in Illinois and we've already seen some traction."

President Swanson asked, "Any other questions? Something we could do with constituents, is if they express interest in supporting things like the Trust that we have for Loud Thunder, Illiniwek, something like that...or even for Niabi Zoo, is to tell them to talk to their financial advisor, who will probably be well-informed about this. It's a pretty robust incentive."

Ms. Ayard Ochoa stated, "It's very substantial."

President Swanson stated, "Yeah. Any other questions? Alright. Well, please accept our thanks for everything that the Community Foundation does. Please express our greetings to Ms. Calder, and friends, if you'll join me in thanking Ms. Ayard Ochoa. Thank you for being with us."

Ms. Ayard Ochoa stated, "Thank you."
