



Middle School Mondays Saints and Services Project

- In 6th grade, students will research a saint, and present a paper which includes a picture of the saint and at least two paragraphs about that saint or dress up like your saint as you would see in a wax museum with a two minute limit speech on the most important aspects of the saint.
- In 7th and 8th Grade, students will select service projects to participate in.

An important aspect of preparing for Confirmation is choosing a saint name.

You may choose to write a paper - which needs to include a picture of the saint, what they are the patron of, and how you can follow their example today.

or

You may choose to dress up as your saint and be prepared to give a 2 minute speech about the saint, any sacramentals that are pictured with the saint can be used as props.

7th and 8th Grade

An important aspect of Faith Formation and Confirmation Preparation is Service. As part of the service component of their studies, students will reflect on their service experiences by creating a presentation board. The items on the board should include a photo of you participating in the project, how the project connects with the Works of Mercy, some reflection questions, and you should be prepared to explain one or more of those projects in our classes.

Reflection Questions to Consider

- Where/with, whom/with, what/organization did I serve?
- Provide handouts/Information regarding the Organization you chose and it's Mission.
- Why did I choose this project?
- What was the most meaningful aspect of this service?
- What did I receive from those I helped in doing this service?
- Your presentation board should include pictures, photos, brochures, written descriptions and journal entries.
