It's a joy to be able to connect with students this way and the Rock Your World team looks forward to creating interactive space for our Rock Your World youth as the semester moves forward.


For Parents/Educators:

While students can certainly complete the Kit 1 activities in one session, we recommend spreading the activities out over the course of the week--for example, Engagement 1 on Monday, Engagement 2 on Wednesday, and Engagement 3 on Friday. For your student's convenience we have included a [how-to video](#) that explains each engagement.

If your student is not yet at middle or high school grade level, we recommend that rather than having them watch the TedXYouth Talk for Engagement 2, you share [this video](#) instead -- Engagements 1 and 3 are designed for all ages.

For Students:

This week's kit contains explorations having to do with activism. Students will need a journal for reflection for Engagements 1 and 2, the internet to watch a TedXYouth talk for Engagement 2, and some poster making materials for engagement 3. No need to purchase anything new. Use what you have--poster board, collage, digital--just have fun and be sure to send a picture of your poster to the [Rock Your Rights Gallery](#).



Kit 1 | What is activism?

Engagement 1 | **JOURNAL**

Consider and reflect: What does activism mean to you?

In your notebook capture your thinking about activism? What is it? What does it mean to be an activist? What does it look like? Sound like? Journal, sketch, brainstorm in your notebook for 20 minutes or more.

Engagement 2 | **WATCH and REFLECT**

Watch Anjali Appadurai's TedxYouth Talk on "[What is Activism?](#)" After viewing, reflect in your journal: What do you think about Anjali's message? How has your thinking been about activism been confirmed? Challenged? Changed?

Engagement 3 | **CREATE**

Choose your medium (poster board, collage, digital etc.) to create a poster that features symbols of the tools used to draw attention to an issue. If you are unsure about what tools to represent, we encourage you to go a Google search for "tools for activists" to get ideas! Once you are finished, take a picture of your poster and submit your image to the gallery at rockyourrights.org.
