Once you have finished listening to the book, please respond to the following questions in your journals:


- What images or parts of Keith's story do you think you'll remember?

## Engagement 2 | RESEARCH and REVIEW: Finding a Cause

Spend some time looking at the various websites yielded from your search. Choose the organization you are most interested in and jot down their website in your journal.


## Engagement 3 | CREATE: Design a Logo

For the final engagement this week, you will be using a method called Marker Monoprint to help you design a logo for your chosen organization. A logo is a symbol or other design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc.

Certainly your chosen organization has a logo already, but you get to use this activity in preparation for your own campaign. It's a great exercise to think about messaging and design wrapped into some fun!
