





Finding Your Passions

Engagement 1 | MIND MAP


Consider what you've learned about issues related to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and The Sustainable Development Goals. Based on this, your own experience, and prior knowledge, consider what issue you are most passionate about in your world. Once you have selected an issue to take on as a creative activist, you need to take stock in what you know about that issue and what questions you have. It's also a good idea to capture your feelings around the issue and how you feel personally connected and inspired too. Watch this video, ["7 Steps to Mind Maps"](#) and then use your notebook to create a Mind Map of your own capturing your thinking as it relates to this issue.



Engagement 2 | DIVING IN

Now that you have collected your knowledge thus far about your selected issue it's time to dive in to learn more about your issue. Use the questions you generated in your mind map to kick off your research. Collect new questions that arise for you as you learn more and use them to keep your research going.

Use your notebook to keep track of your new learning and thinking. If you are a linear notetaker, consider making columns for Questions / New learning / Thoughts and New Questions. If you are less linear, consider making webs. And if you enjoyed Mind Mapping, maybe try sketchnoting, [introduced in this video](#).



Engagement 3 | Pitch to a Prospective Team
