
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# Don't Ignore the Dangers of a Dirty Dryer Vent

The Village's Emergency Alert System, also known as Regroup, is designed to quickly deliver critical alerts via phone call, text, email or mobile app to residents, businesses and visitors when it matters most. These alerts include:



- Emergency Alerts: Active shooter, crime in progress or terror threat
- Severe Weather Alerts: NOAA issued alerts for the safety and well-being of the public
- Public Safety Notifications: safety tips, scam and fraud alerts



# **Pumpkin Bread**

Servings: 2 loaves
Prep Time: 20 Minutes
Cook Time: 65 Minutes
Total Time: 1 Hour 30 Minutes

# **Ingredients**

- 2 cups all-purpose flour, spooned into a measuring cup and leveled-off
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp ground cloves
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground nutmeg
- 1 ½ sticks (3/4 cups) unsalted butter, softened
- · 2 cups sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 (15 oz) can 100% pure pumpkin

# **Directions**

- Preheat the oven to 325°F and set an oven rack in the middle position. Generously grease two 8 x 4-inch loaf pans with butter and dust with flour (alternatively, use a baking spray with flour in it, such as Pam with Flour or Baker's Joy).
- In a medium bowl, combine the flour, salt, baking soda, baking powder, cloves, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Whisk until well combined; set aside.
- In a large bowl of an electric mixer, beat the butter and sugar on medium speed until just blended. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Continue beating until very light and fluffy, a few minutes. Beat in the pumpkin. The mixture might look grainy and curdled at this point -- that's okay.
- Add the flour mixture and mix on low speed until combined.
- Turn the batter into the prepared pans, dividing evenly, and bake for 65 – 75 minutes, or until a cake tester inserted into the center comes out clean. Let the loaves cool in the pans for about 10 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Fresh out of the oven, the loaves have a deliciously crisp crust. If they last beyond a day, you can toast individual slices to get the same fresh-baked effect.

**Freezer-Friendly Instructions:** The bread can be frozen for up to 3 months. After it is completely cooled, wrap it securely in aluminum foil, freezer wrap or place in a freezer bag. Thaw overnight in the refrigerator before serving.

These minutes have not yet been approved by the HUA Board. Any corrections, additions, or deletions will be made at the next regular HUA Board meeting prior to official approval.

President Todd Campbell called the regular meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Present: Todd Campbell, Randy Brooks, Walt Paulson, Janet Schwartz, Janet Peck, Debi Kiddle, Margaret Tai, Laura Kelly, Al Villasenor. Absent: Krystine Miluski.7 residents were present.

<u>August 26, 2025 MINUTES:</u> Janet Schwartz made a motion to accept and approve the August 26, 2025 HUA Board Meeting Minutes. Seconded by Debi Kiddle and at vote, all aye, motion carried.

<u>PRESIDENT'S REMARKS:</u> It is getting darker sooner, so please wear reflective clothing when out walking or carry a flashlight. Kids will be out by bus stops, so use caution. Ann Richter passed away last month.... RIP Ann! Thank everyone for the successful HR50! CRF staff kicked "butt" and the whole team stepped up. Kudos to everyone involved! Everyone had a blast.

<u>VICE PRESIDENT'S REMARKS:</u> People who attended the HR50 event said they had a blast and appreciated the shuttle that was provided for easier access and parking issues.

**TREASURER'S REMARKS:** Walt Paulson gave the highlights of the Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer's Report is attached to the minutes. Checks and financials are in order. Security Department is \$16,000 over budget due to staffing. No neighborhoods are in arrears. Randy Brooks made a motion to receive and accept the Treasurer's Report seconded by Debi Kiddle. At vote, all aye, motion carried.

MANAGEMENT REPORT: The initial HUA budgeting process first phase has been completed. While we had previously planned a September Delegate presentation, that will occur in October. The standing garage sale approved dates for this year are 9/18 - 9/20/25. The pool issues were further delayed by continuing ground water seepage. The bad news is that we did not make our goal of reopening this season. The good news is that for now, all ground water has been removed, and we can proceed with the repair. The goal is currently to perform the repair in time to refill the pool and test its effectiveness with the idea that we can open next spring with the knowledge that we have done all that we can to open on time with no issues related to this. HR50!!!!! OMG, I really have all the feels and no words. Thank you, thank you, thank you. Walt Paulson made a motion to receive and accept the Management Report, seconded by Debi Kiddle. <u>Audit Committee:</u> Continues to be great and will pick up in October or November. No formal report or motion required. In good order.

<u>Finance Committee:</u> Reviewed & discussed the August 2025 HUA financials and checks. Reviewed & discussed the August 2025 CRF financials and checks. Landscape Department turf vehicle was ordered. Discussed Budgets and Capital Expenditures.

Committee recommended not creating a separate job description if shared by Security. CM gave legal updates. Work order issued to hard wire Neighborhood Rec Centers cameras. Non-functioning Neighborhood pool card readers will be addressed asap. HR Employee Handbook is deferred as a 2026 project.

<u>FINANCE/TLLCISI Committee:</u> Randy Brooks made a motion to accept the TLLCISI and Finance Committee Reports, seconded by Janet Peck. At vote, all aye, motion carried.

General Election and Oversight: No formal report or motion required.

Nominating Committee: No formal report or motion required.

<u>Golf and Tennis Committee:</u> The Golf Committee meeting was held September 15, 2025 at 11am. Attendees were Al Villasenor, AFV CEO; Nic, Janet Carey-Peck, Sharlene Hink, Margaret Tai, David Grom, Rose Sternberg and Jacob. The golf course had record sales in August. The next meeting will be held on 10/13/25 @ 11am. Debi Kiddle made a motion to receive and accept the Golf and Tennis Committee Report. Walt Paulson seconded the motion. At vote, all aye, motion carried.

<u>Landscape and Ponds Committee:</u> The Landscape/Ponds Committee met on Friday, September 12, 2025. The attendees were Brad Banwart, Krystine Miluski, Vikki Herzog, and Walt Paulson. Landscape Department projects – starting leaf clean up. Ponds – still working on pond shorelines. Turf vehicle – ordered for November delivery. Butterfly Garden – no report. Lost tree at 920 building. Suggestion: replace it with a flowering tree or two. Work order was put in. Discussed Earth Day. Discussed possible sculptures, artwork, etc. on the HR path across from the HUA Office Building. Next meeting date is October 10, 2025 at 11am. Janet Schwartz made a motion to receive and accept the Landscape and Ponds Committee Report. Randy Brooks seconded. At vote, all aye, motion carried.

<u>Publications Committee:</u> No formal report or motion required.

Recreational Activities Committee (RAC): A big thanks to all of the employees, volunteers, and helpers but most of all to our HR50 committee for putting this event into action with only 4 months prep time. We'd like to look into having a tent or pergola or retractable awning for additional shade. We hope to work with Finance on a timeline for when we can hope to schedule our improvements. We are planning another event for this Fall, a HeatherRidge Fall Fest that will take place on Halloween evening starting at 6pm. We are just in the very preliminary stages of planning this so you will have to watch your social media as well as our website. Laura Kelly managed to get us another grant for this occasion! Thank you, Laura. Some of the events will be a scary movie projected on our new screen facing the outside Waterfall patio, a fire pit on the patio, good food, beverages and lots of sweets and of course Waterfall Lounge will be open for adult beverages. Bring your lawn chairs again and enjoy the Halloween events. On Saturday, November 1st, Golf is planning a fall fling event. More to come about this. There was a golf meeting held on Thursday, September 17<sup>th</sup> that included Al, Jacob, Dirk and myself. Some of the things that were discussed were staffing, pricing, fees and annual passes. We also discussed digital menu boards for the Cabana Bar, two TVs outside where sports can be enjoyed, review of the course condition, and a pull behind tractor. Discussion of the condition of the pond between 6 & 7. TGIF Burger night will end the last Friday in September. We are planning on having TGIF's in the Waterfall Lounge every Friday between 5-8pm.
