- trying to buy things from or do business with a service (e.g. when a shop owner, taxi or uber driver tries to crack onto you)
- trying to get into a place like a club (e.g. when a bouncer asks you to show your breasts (tits) to get in).

Some types of sexual harassment are also crimes and can be reported to the police.

#### What is vilification?

The law also says that no one can do anything in **public** which makes others hate you because you're Aboriginal, gay, lesbian, transgender or have HIV or AIDS. This includes writing and drawing pictures.

#### Making a complaint

Complaints about discrimination can be made to Anti-Discrimination NSW (ADNSW) or the Australian Human Rights Commission (AHRC). Some complaints can only be made to AHRC, so get legal advice.

#### **Time limits**

You need to make a complaint to the ADNSW within 12 months of the discrimination happening.

There is no specific time limit to complain to AHRC. **BUT** if you make a complaint **6 months** *after* the discrimination happens, the AHRC may refuse to deal with it.

# **DISCRIMINATION AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

#### What is discrimination?

Discrimination is when you're treated unfairly or differently because you belong to a particular group. e.g. race, age, sex, religion or due to your sexuality.

## When is discrimination against the law?

Discrimination is against the law if you can choose:

- **ONE** thing from Box 1; **AND**
- **ONE** thing from Box 2.

#### BOX 1

You were treated unfairly because you are:

- Aboriginal (or some other race)
- male or female
- married, single or living together as boyfriend/girlfriend (de-facto)
- gay or lesbian, or someone thinks you are
- considered too old or too young
- disabled whether your disability is physical, mental or related to a disease
- transgender or transsexual, or someone thinks you are
- pregnant
- related to or hang around someone who is one of the above

#### BOX 2

This unfair treatment happens when you are:

- lat work
- looking for work
- at school, TAFE or another educational place
- lat a registered club
- trying to get accommodation or dealing with a landlord
- trying to buy something from or do business with a place like Centrelink, a bank, hospital, a local council or shop
- trying to get into a place or use transport

#### It is also discrimination if you are treated unfairly in employment because:

- you need to care for a child or close family member
- of your religion, criminal record, trade union activity, political opinion (but your options to complain are limited for these types of discrimination).

#### **Sexual harassment**

#### What is sexual harassment?

Sexual harassment is a form of discrimination. It is any sexual action which makes you feel uncomfortable, 'shame', embarrassed, offended or intimidated. It can include:

- unwelcome sexual advances (when someone tries to crack onto you)
- asking you to do sexual acts
- ⋒ sexual jokes
- wolf-whistling
- staring/perving
- unwanted touching

If sexual harassment happens in **one** of the following situations it is against the law:

- at work or trying to get work (e.g. if your workmates make sexual jokes or have pornos/rude pictures lying around)
- at school, TAFE or other educational places (e.g. if a teacher or another student ask for sex or touches you in a sexual way)
- trying to get accommodation (e.g. being offered a discount on a room if you have sex)
