How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

We are looking for a pastor who is invested in being active in the community and takes part in local events and clubs. This is one way we hope to stimulate growth in our church. We are also in need of being discipled and encouraged in international ministry. At first, fifty percent of our pastor's time should be spent on church growth. As a congregation, we are used to quality preaching, music and fellowship on Sunday morning. We realize that for growth and continued relevance in the community, we need to reach out beyond the walls of our church and will follow the leadership of a pastor who has the courage to reach out to this community with the love of Christ. We need several ways to encourage Bible study. Parishioners who are grounded in the scriptures will be more likely to stay grounded in their faith.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

We have a vision for growth. With the right Pastor leading our church, we hope to be able to grow and keep the same pastor for years to come. We have a vision for a positive impact on the greater CUDA (Colby, Unity, Dorchester, Abbotsford) Community. We are praying and working to find new ways to bring the love of God to an increasingly diverse community that has also experienced some economic changes. We would like to have

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active, year-round Bible Study. Currently, we have a study during the Lenten Season only. We would like to have a ministry for youth and to get more youth in our church again. Currently, we supply many physical needs of the youth in our community through our local mission projects, but we need to learn how to supply spiritual and mental health needs as well. We are open to fresh ideas, and hope that these new ideas can bring new generations into the church without diminishing the dignity of older generations.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

As this is a part-time solo call, we are asking that the person who takes this position be prepared to do weekly preaching, moderate session, preside over Communion, preside over congregational meetings, and preform baptisms, weddings, and funerals. We also ask that our pastor is part of a worship planning team and commits to visiting and making phone contact with members of the church and community. The Pastor will also work with the deacons to be sure that our sick and home-bound members receive visits and home communion. We are aware that as our church's vision of growth and relevance sharpens, and our partnership with the pastor gains clarity, some of these priorities may change. We are open to different program priorities, if by rearranging priorities we will reach our envisioned goals of growth and positive impact to the community.

We support the Heifer Project and this year we donated approximately \$1,000.00. We collect school supplies, boots, coats, hats, and mittens for local students that are in need. We coordinate the Red Kettle Campaign for the Salvation Army. That money is distributed through our local Police Dept. to support people in need. We raised \$13,800.00 this year. We are proud to consistently break records and provide this ministry to bring the community together to help others. We send food and money to our local food pantry. We support the Angel Tree (gifts for needy children at Christmas time). We collect personal products to send to the Ronald McDonald house in Marshfield. We had a workday to put together floral arrangements in baskets, and distributed them to elderly people and shut ins. We took part in a project called Samaritan's Purse project called Operation Christmas Child, for which we assembled about 20 gift shoe boxes and sent them in to their headquarters.
