Our sessions and ministry teams have ensured continuity of operations, pulpit supply, care of members and active mission and outreach during the 2+ years we have been without pastors. Each church also has paid staff to include a bookkeeper/accountant and a part time secretary. Our vision is a strong partnership between our pastor, Sessions, ministry teams and paid staff where each will support the other to ensure we accomplish our goals. Short term goal - a consistent and inspiring leader at our pulpits to share God's word. Long term goals - increase worship attendance of current members, attract new members, partner with other local churches and have an active presence in our community. Lead weekly worship at each church, with flexibility to meet the needs of the pastor and the congregations. Administer the sacraments and officiate at weddings/funerals. Provide care, visitation, and counseling to members in need. Serve as head of staff, provide administrative leadership, work with each Session and communicate with ministry team chair persons. Offer Holy Communion to home bound members quarterly (a Ruling Elder or Deacon will usually accompany the pastor.) Collaborate with colleagues in meetings and activities of Winnebago Presbytery. Participate in continuing education. Divide time approximately 50/50 between the two congregations for day to day responsibilities. The churches will accommodate the pastor's preferences while ensuring the needs of each congregation are met.
