Dear parishioners and guests,

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! Our joyful celebration of Jesus' birth comes to its end just as quickly as it began. Sometimes I think it's a pity that such a

cheerful and grace-filled season is so short. However, we must not think that the celebration or the joy or the grace have to stop here. After all, in the season of Advent – and also in the season of Christmas – we have not only acknowledged the coming of Jesus in time; we have also reflected on the fact that He will come again at the end of the world, and that He continues to come to us and to be present to us in the here and now.

When I was in college, I remember the Catholic campus ministry organization hosting a guest speaker. If I recall correctly, he came to speak to us students about ways to observe the Jubilee year (2000). One of his suggestions was that we leave the nativity scene up all year. Something about that suggestion resonated with me.

As a child growing up, I always looked forward to helping my mother decorate the house for Christmas. She had a lot of decorations especially for our living room, which would be completely transformed from its normal state. But then, sometime in January, the day would inevitably arrive in which we had to "put away Christmas," and everything went back into the boxes to be stored in the closet until the following Christmas.

There was always something about "putting away Christmas" that made my heart heavy. So, the idea of leaving the nativity scene up all year was most welcome! Visitors to my small chapel in the rectory will notice that all the figurines are on prominent display year round. For me, this practice not only extends the joy of Christmas; it also reminds me to ponder the gift and mystery of the Incarnation on a regular basis.

In our hectic world, it seems like we're always moving on to the next thing. I realize that's the nature of time, and that we don't want to get stuck in the past, but might it also be true that we often miss out on savoring the present because our eyes are already looking toward the future?

I pray that the graces of Christmas 2023 will not be lost on us – packed up in boxes to be stored or thrown out with the tree – but that we might carry the wonder of the season with us into the new year and allow those graces to unfold and bear abundant fruit.








Mystery of Faith Series: Tuesday, January 9th






