Dear parishioners and guests,

Before Christmas, I wrote a long series of columns looking at reasons people might part ways with the Catholic Church. My intention was to respond with convincing

reasons to stay in the Church. I wanted ultimately to present life in the Catholic Church as a very reasonable choice and - even if difficult - the option most in harmony with God's will.

While many want to argue that the Catholic Church is just another organization created by man, there is much evidence pointing to the fact of her divine origin. I suppose we could agree that the Church was created by man, but that Man (the Lord Jesus) also happened to be God! We know from the Scriptures and the annals of history that Jesus only created one Church.

There is good that comes from having a plurality of Christian denominations, but unfortunately those benefits don't undo the scandal of division among the members of Christ's body. If we are to embrace the true spirit of ecumenism, we can't be content with disunity among Christians. We have to be willing to make truth claims and to journey together toward unity in matters of faith and morals.

A person's choice of religion is a sacred matter, and when we approach that topic, we tread on holy ground. We always respect and honor people's freedom to pursue their relationship with God according to the dictates of their own conscience. The work of evangelization is not about forced conversions.

At the same time, religion should not be a forbidden topic of conversation. If our faith ultimately concerns our eternal wellbeing, and (as we know from Scripture) God desires for all people to know, love, and serve Him in this life and be happy with Him forever in Heaven, then why shouldn't we talk about it? God calls us to speak the truth in love and to share the good news with the whole world.

Like any institution that involves human beings, the Catholic Church has seen her share of brokenness and misconduct in her 2,000-year history. However, these are not representative of what the Church stands for and teaches. Thankfully, the Church is not an ivory tower for the perfect; it is a refuge and infirmary for sinners. All are welcome.

There are many good reasons to be Catholic. May we all grow to where we can articulate those reasons and journey lovingly with our brothers and sisters in their pursuit of God.


