Dear parishioners and guests,

The interim between the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (the end of the Christmas season) and Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent) is easily overlooked. Maybe we even go into this

period thinking of it as nothing more than "down time" between two special seasons.

Although it is the beginning of Ordinary Time – the season when the Church simply marks the passing of time rather than preparing for and celebrating feasts – we needn't become idle in our spiritual life. I suggest that we even use this time to begin preparing for Lent.

I don't mean that we should begin observing Lent a month early; I only mean that it's not too soon to start making plans for our observance of the "Great Fast," as the Eastern Christians call it. If Lent has such potential as a season of grace, does it not deserve more than a last-minute thought as to how we will engage it? Allowing time for preparation ensures us a better prospect of entering Lent well when it arrives next month.

The first step in this preparation is not asking ourselves what we are going to do for Lent. Instead, our first aim is to discern and discover where the Lord wants to lead us. Consider this: if you were ill, and you knew you needed medicine, you would certainly want to get a diagnosis of the illness before you started taking medicines!

Similarly, if Lent is a time for healing, strengthening, self-denial, purification, and all kinds of growth in our relationship with God, we would do well to identify the particular areas where that transformation is needed before we start applying the medicine of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

I invite you, then, to spend some time in your daily prayers this week taking a look in your heart and asking the Holy Spirit to show you the specific places where divine "medicine" is needed. Is there some area of anxiety where the Lord is inviting you to trust Him more deeply? Is there an addictive behavior that gets in the way of your having a closer relationship with God? Is unforgiveness or resentment robbing you of peace? Are there old wounds that need to be dealt with?

Don't rush into trying to determine what your Lenten practices will be. You don't need to figure that out yet. We have almost four full weeks to prepare for Lent. Let your prayer this week be: "Jesus, show me how I need You." And see how the Good Lord responds.

Our parish is supporting the Year of Parish Revival by offering a six-session series called "Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist" each Tuesday evening during Lent, beginning on February 20. Workbooks will be available for the series. Please prayerfully consider joining us during Lent for this series.
