Dear parishioners and guests,

We continue this week with our work of making preparations for the upcoming season of Lent. So far, we have tried to identify areas of our relationship with God that need special attention, and we

have spent some time reflecting on what kinds of prayer practices might be helpful in mending and strengthening that relationship.

It probably comes as no surprise to you – especially if you read last week's column! – that our topic for this week is fasting. Our task for this week is not necessarily to settle on our Lenten resolution in the "fasting department," but to ask the question: how could my friendship with Jesus benefit from some form of self-denial? We'll look at this question from two angles.

First, there can be no doubt that Lent is a good time to fast from the things that do us harm. In a season of penance and deepening conversion, God's grace is abundantly available to help us part ways with sin, both serious and venial. In that light, this is a good week to pray about what concrete steps could be taken to help us advance on the path toward true freedom.

If it's a sinful habit you're trying to overcome, I don't think your Lenten resolution should necessarily be, "I'm just going to stop." The "cold turkey" approach works for some people, but it's not usually recommended as the most promising route. I encourage you to make a Lenten resolution, in the area of fasting, that will help you move in the right direction. Be concrete and practical.

Second, it's a good idea not only to fast from sin (and not take it up again after Easter!) but also to fast from certain legitimate goods. The idea here is not to treat good things as if they are harmful, but to strengthen our selfcontrol and to lessen our attachments to created things. When we grow in self-control, we more readily choose as we ought. Think about it this way: if we can deny our appetites even for good things, how much better will we get at denying our appetites for what is bad?

People give up chocolate or ice cream for Lent, but I don't think those are particularly effective sacrifices unless a person is really deeply attached to those foods. I encourage you to take a look this week at the things you really enjoy from day to day. Ask yourself if you might be leaning on those things a little too much for pleasure, comfort, or self-soothing. Is there a way that God could enter your life more impactfully if you made a little more space for Him?

and can't be thrown out – only burned or buried.












Mystery of Faith Series: Tuesday, February 6
