Dear parishioners and guests,

We've tried this year to avoid waiting until the last minute (after the Mardi Gras party?) to make plans for our observance of Lent. I suggested that we take a prayerful look at our relationship with

God and begin to consider what Lenten practices would have a potentially medicinal (healing and strengthening) effect. Two weeks ago, we considered prayer practices. Last week, we considered fasting. This week, let's spend some time looking at almsgiving.

The practice of almsgiving helps us to recognize the direct connection between love of God and love of neighbor. St. John says, "whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20). We cannot love God without also having concern for our neighbor.

The question is: how could some form of almsgiving help to improve my relationship with God? Perhaps the first step is becoming aware of my neighbor's needs. That in itself might be an excellent Lenten resolution for many of us: I will go out of my way to find out what other people's needs are. I will focus less on what I need/want and more on how I can help others. I will take notice of people who are asking for assistance, and I will consider listening to their story.

Lenten almsgiving is not necessarily about giving more money. There are a lot of people who could give a lot more money, but that wouldn't at all guarantee them any change of heart. The poor widow in the gospel comes to mind: she put two small coins in the treasury, but Jesus praised her because she gave out of what she needed, not out of any excess she had left over (see Mark 12:41-44).

I challenge you to identify some area of your life (not necessarily involving finances, but possibly) in which you give out of your excess, and not out of your need. Pray and see if there's some practical way you can expand your heart this Lent to give of yourself like the poor widow in the gospel gave of herself. That's the kind of almsgiving that changes hearts.

After we have spent some time reflecting on what practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving might help our relationship with God, all that is left is to make the decision. With a prayer to the Holy Spirit, let's make a firm resolution to embrace the work of deepening conversion through our Lenten observance. With God's help, may we remain faithful to our commitments and arrive at Easter with hearts and minds made pure.


